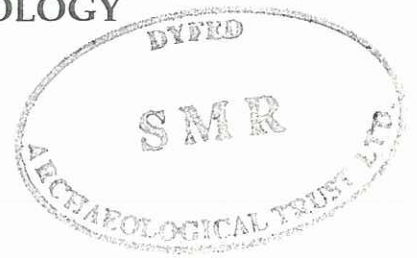


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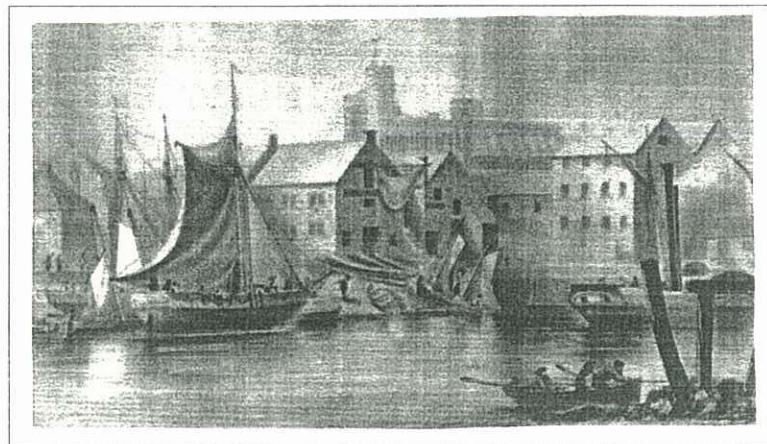

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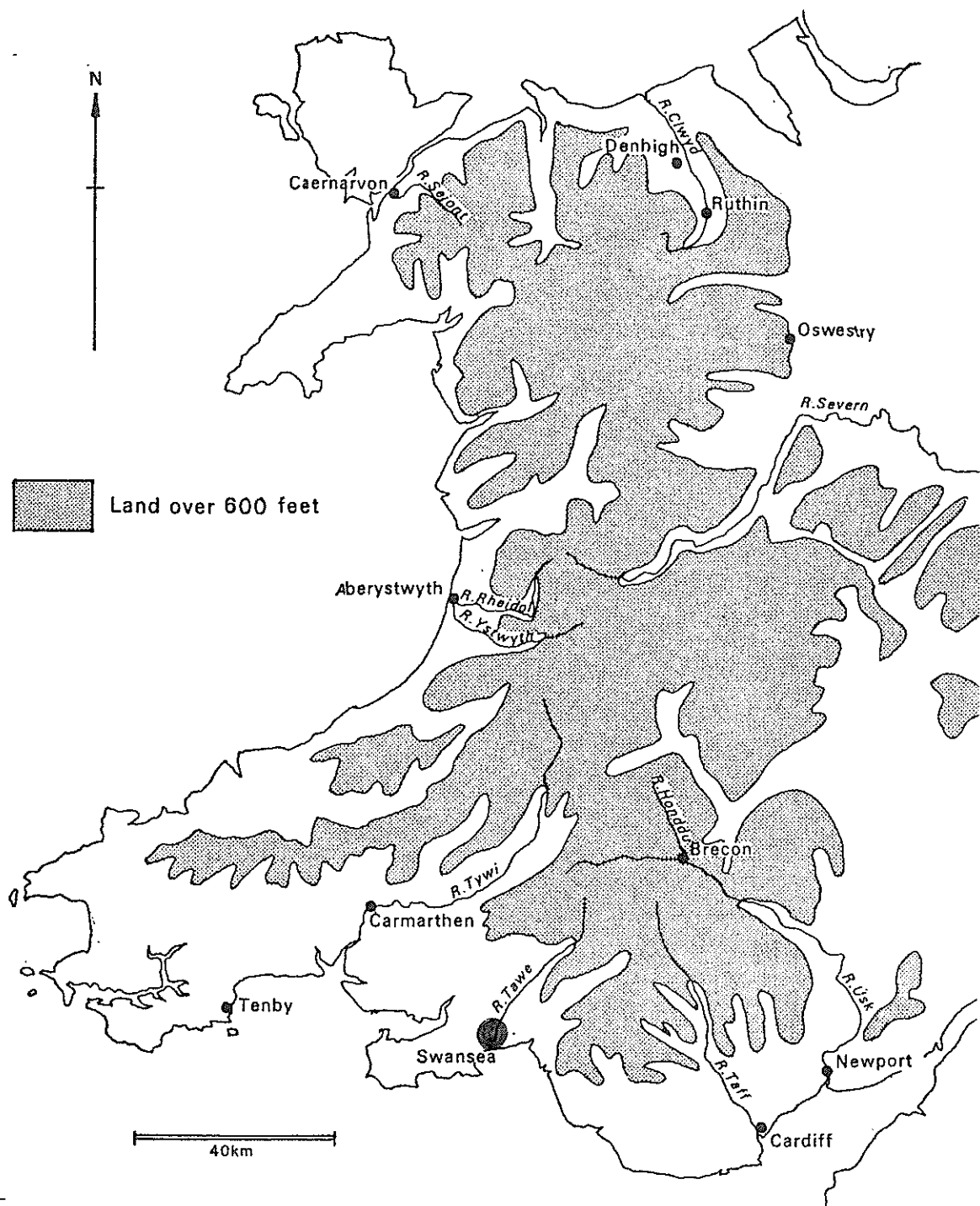
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- Fig. 13 Castle Lane from the east in c.1820, by G. Shepherd
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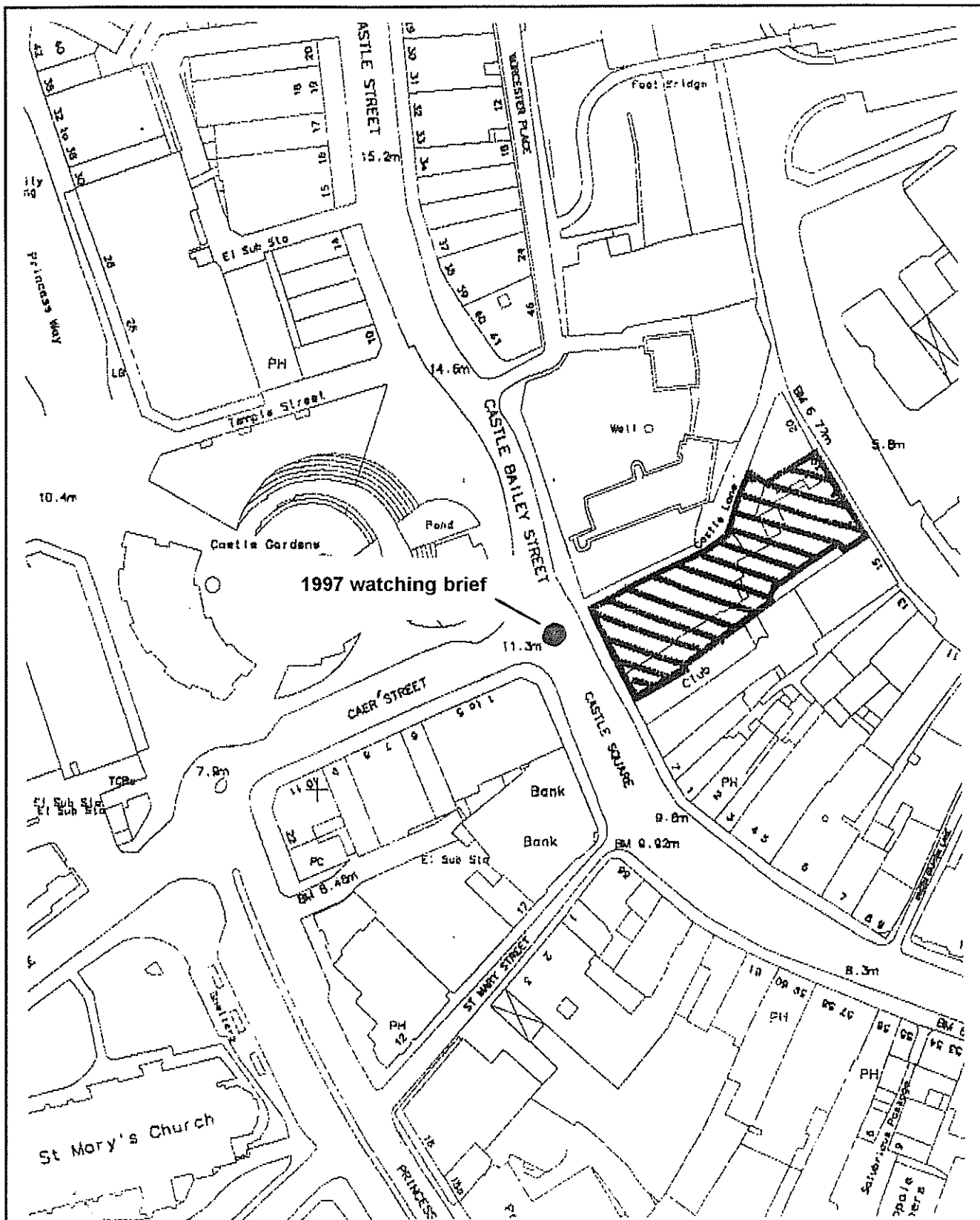
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Fig. 1 Swansea, Castle Square - location map

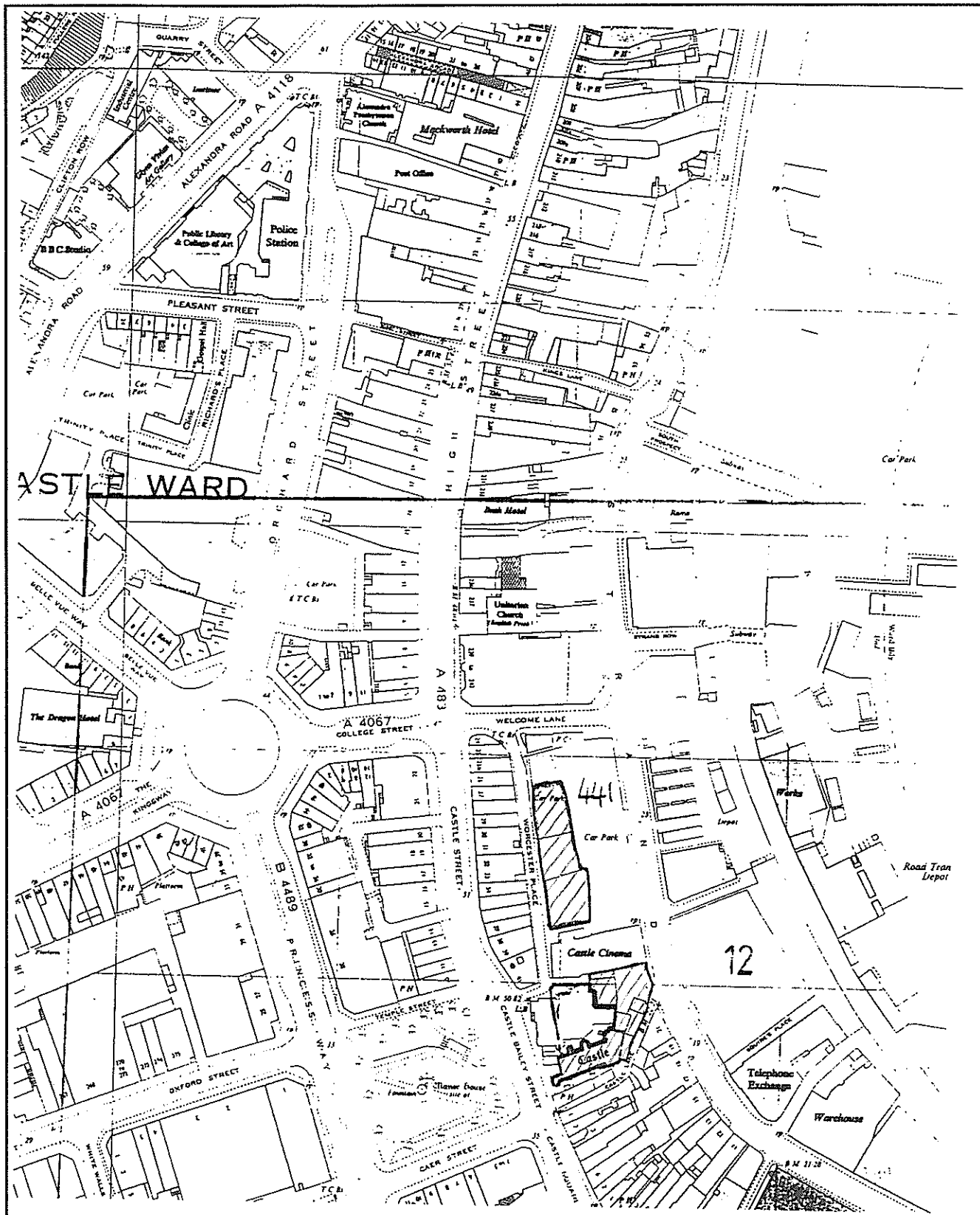
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Fig. 2 Site plan showing study area (and location of 1997 watching brief)

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Fig. 3 Swansea Castle - scheduled areas GM 012/SWA and GM 441/SWA

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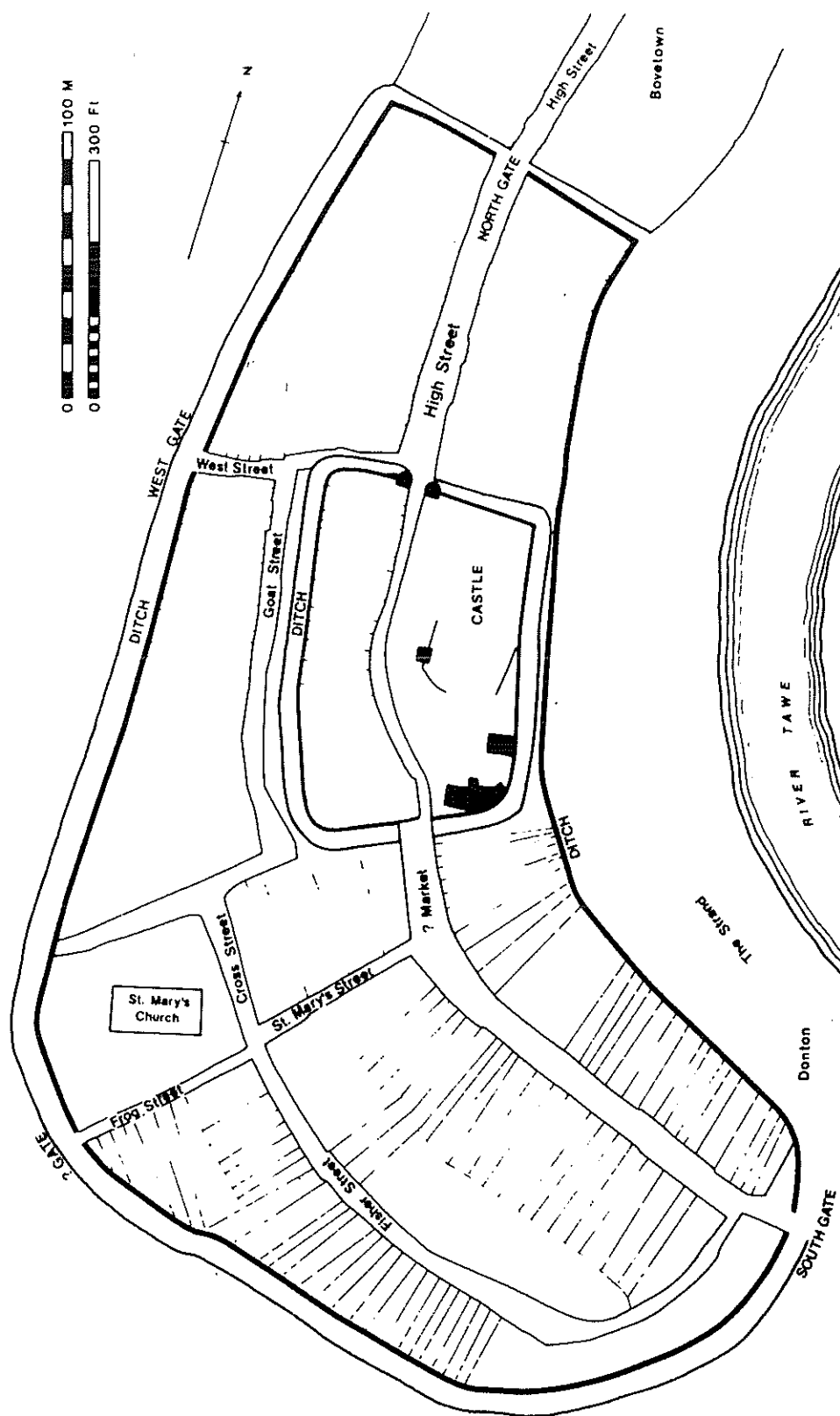


Fig. 5 Swansea - plan of the medieval town c.1400

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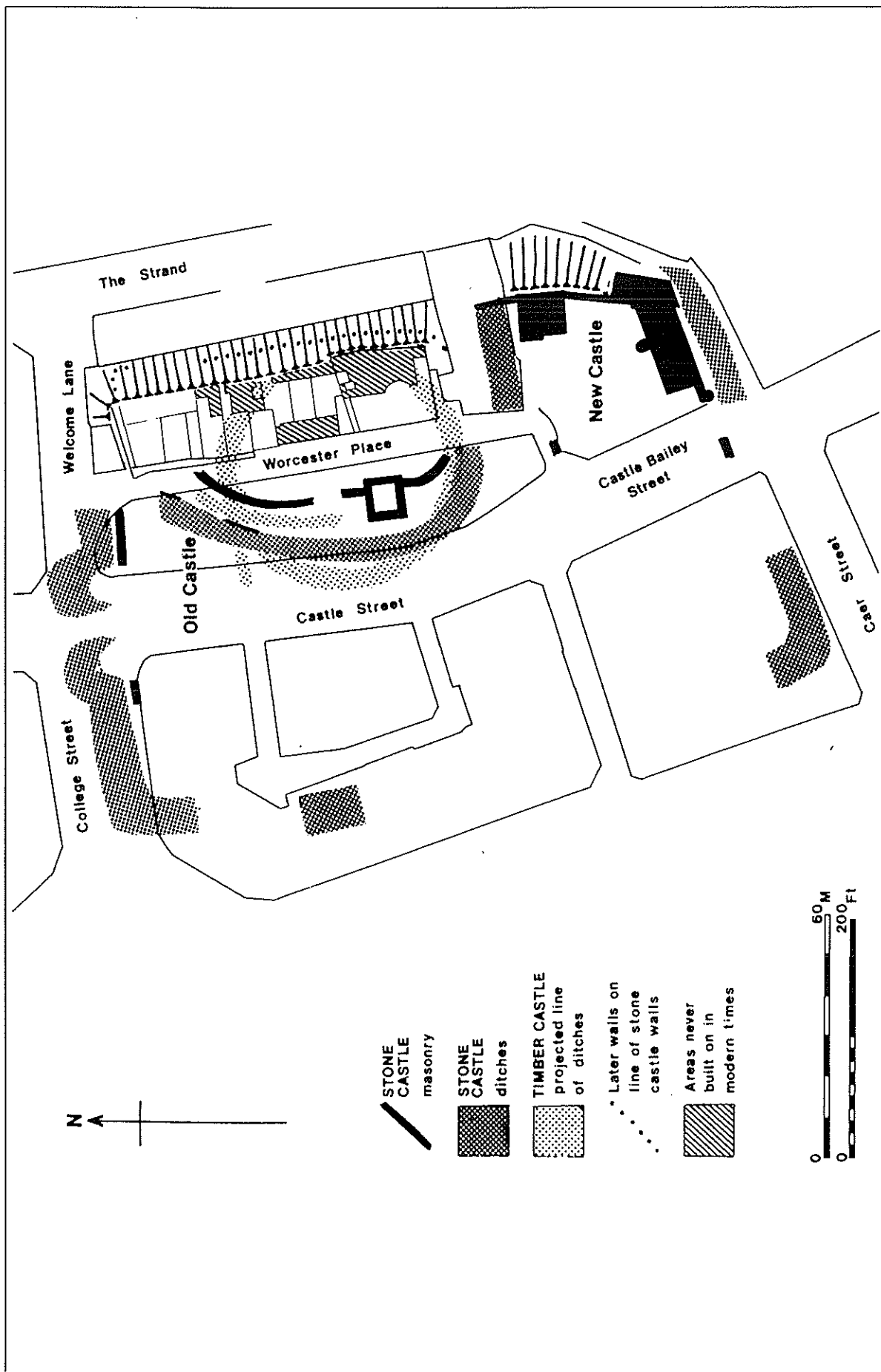


Fig. 6 Swansea Castle - plan of surviving and excavated features
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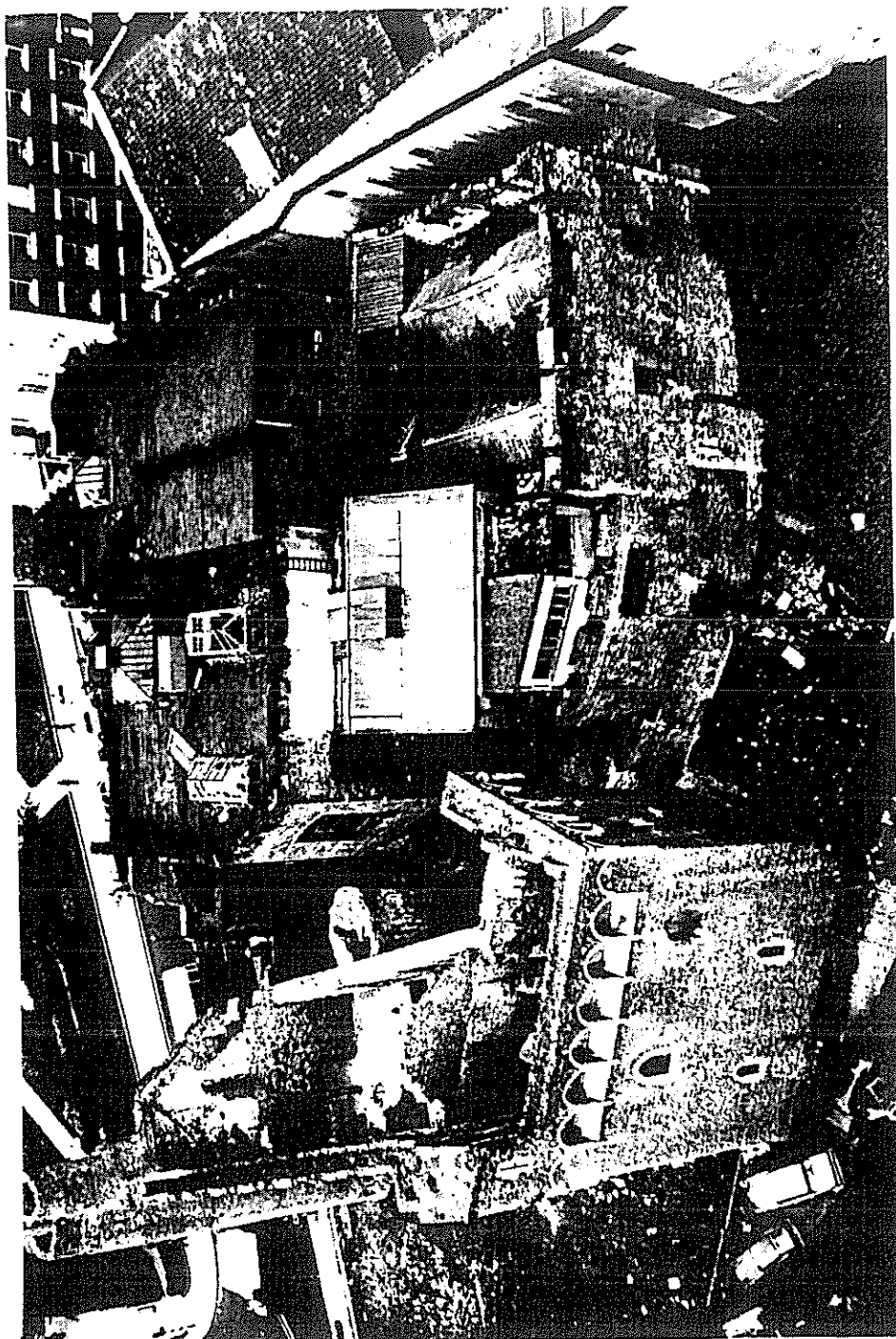
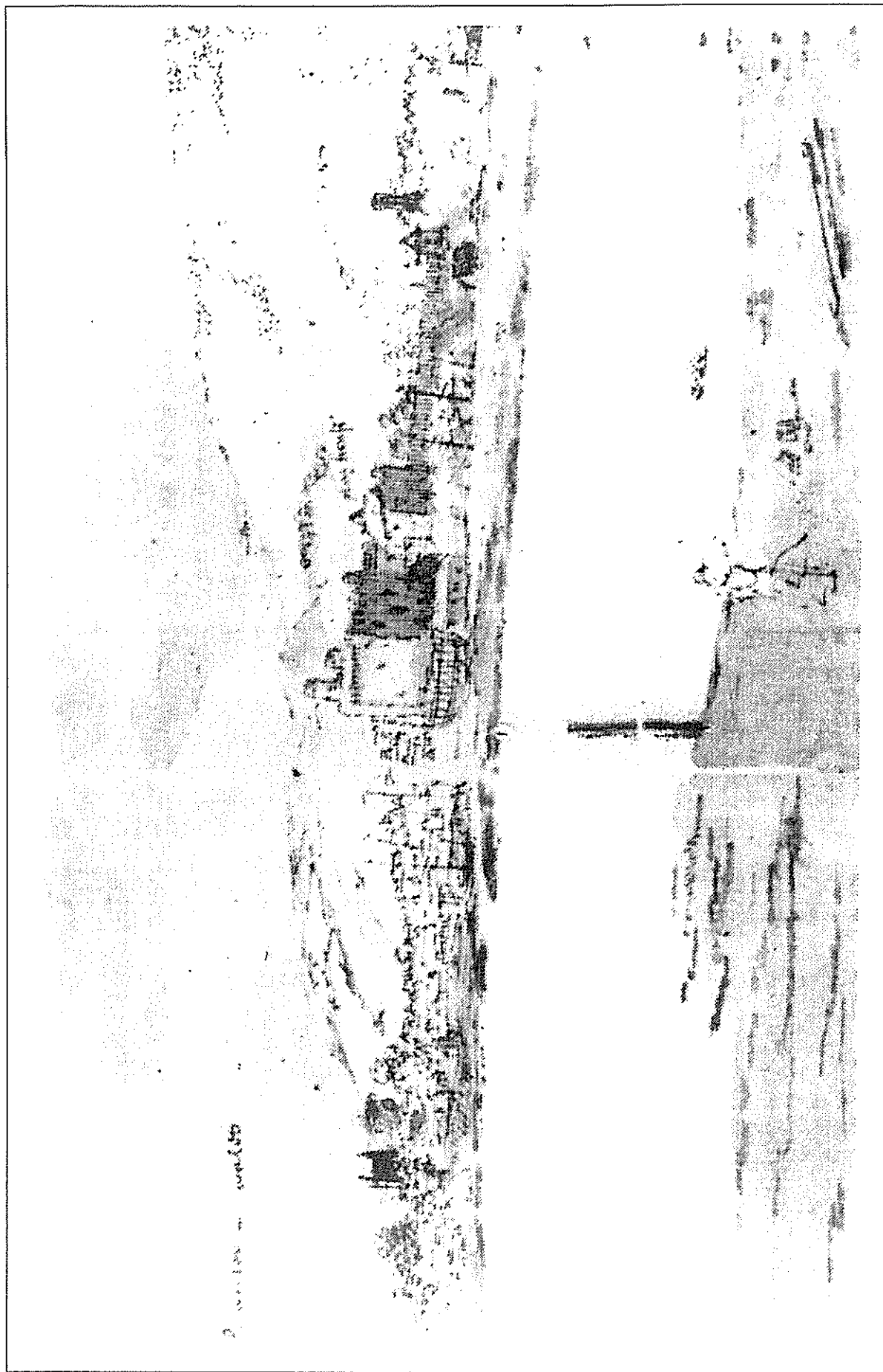


Fig. 7 Swansea Castle from above in the early 1970s, prior to demolition of the press buildings

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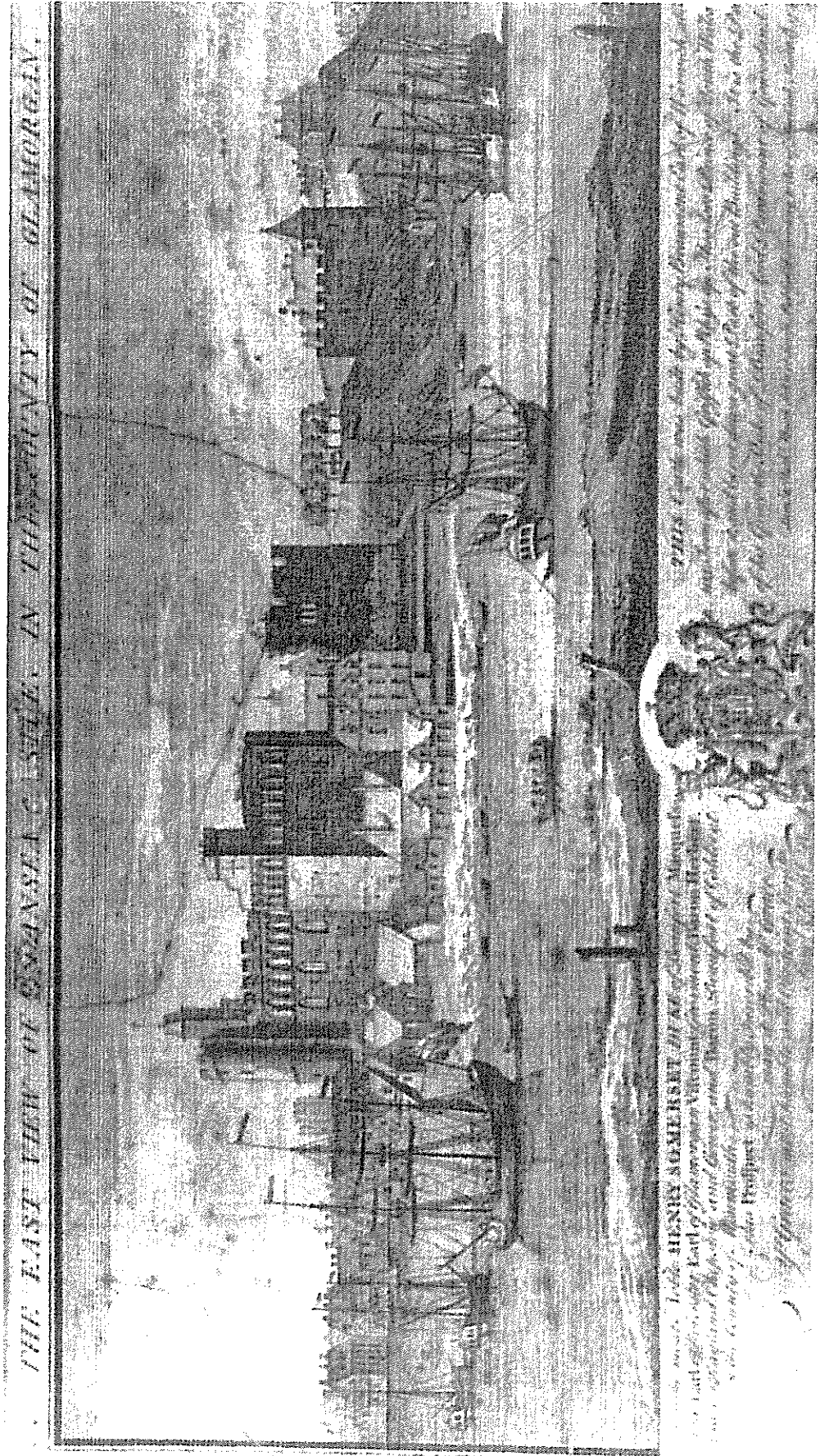
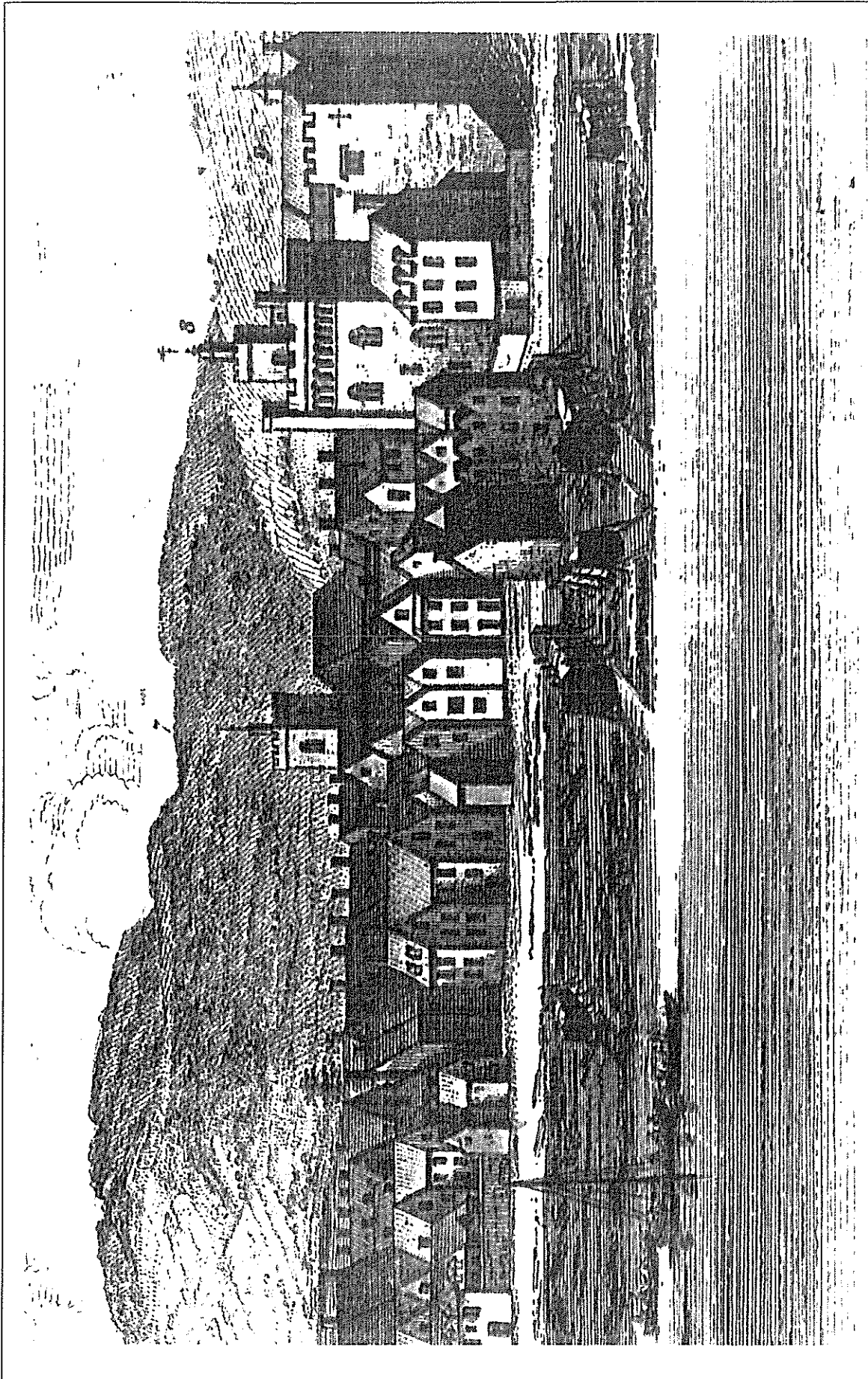


Fig. 9 Swansea from the east in 1741, by S. and N. Buck (reproduced by courtesy of Swansea Museum)

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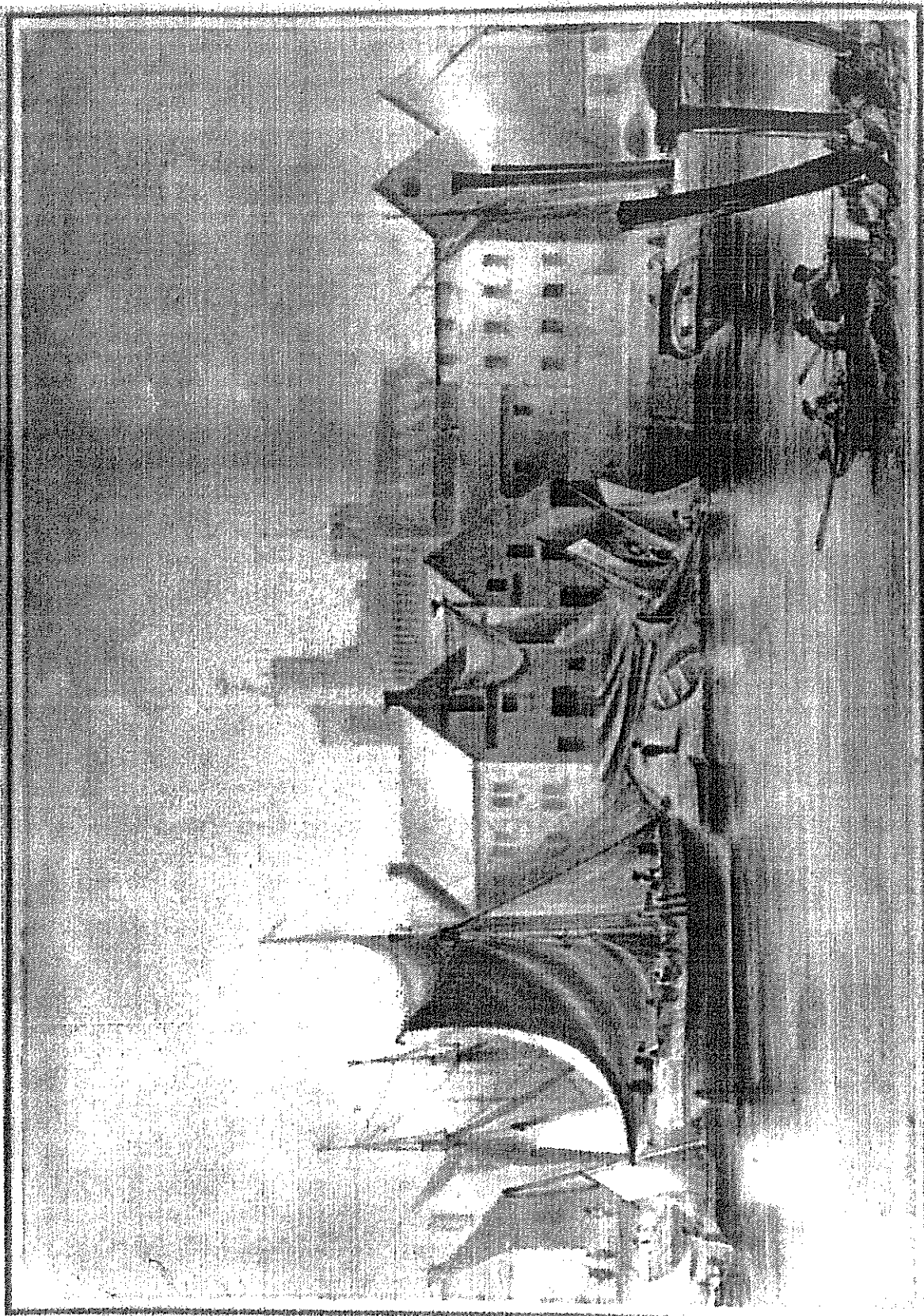


Fig. 12 The Strand from the east in the early 19th century

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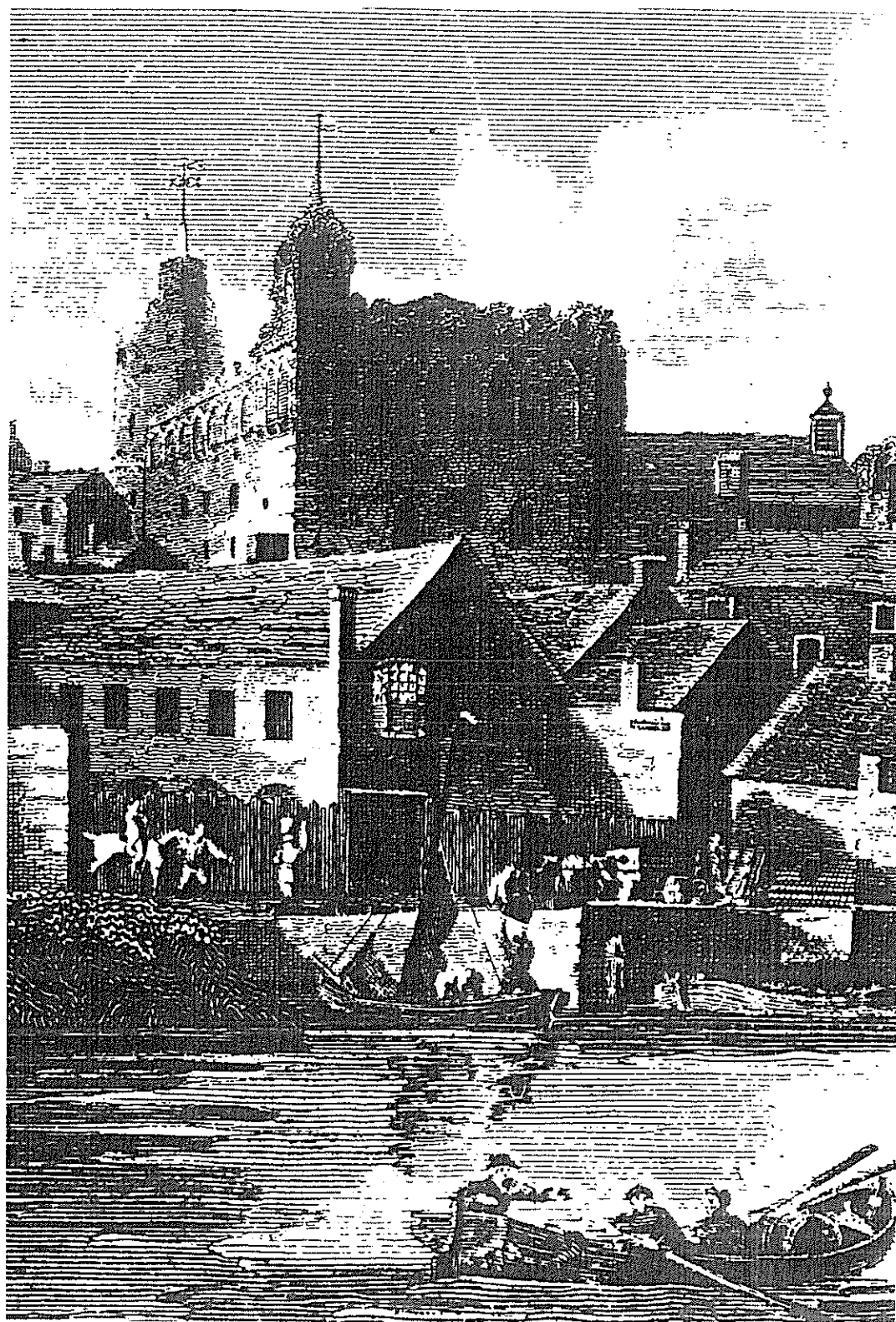
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Fig. 13 Castle Lane from the east in c.1820, by G. Shepherd

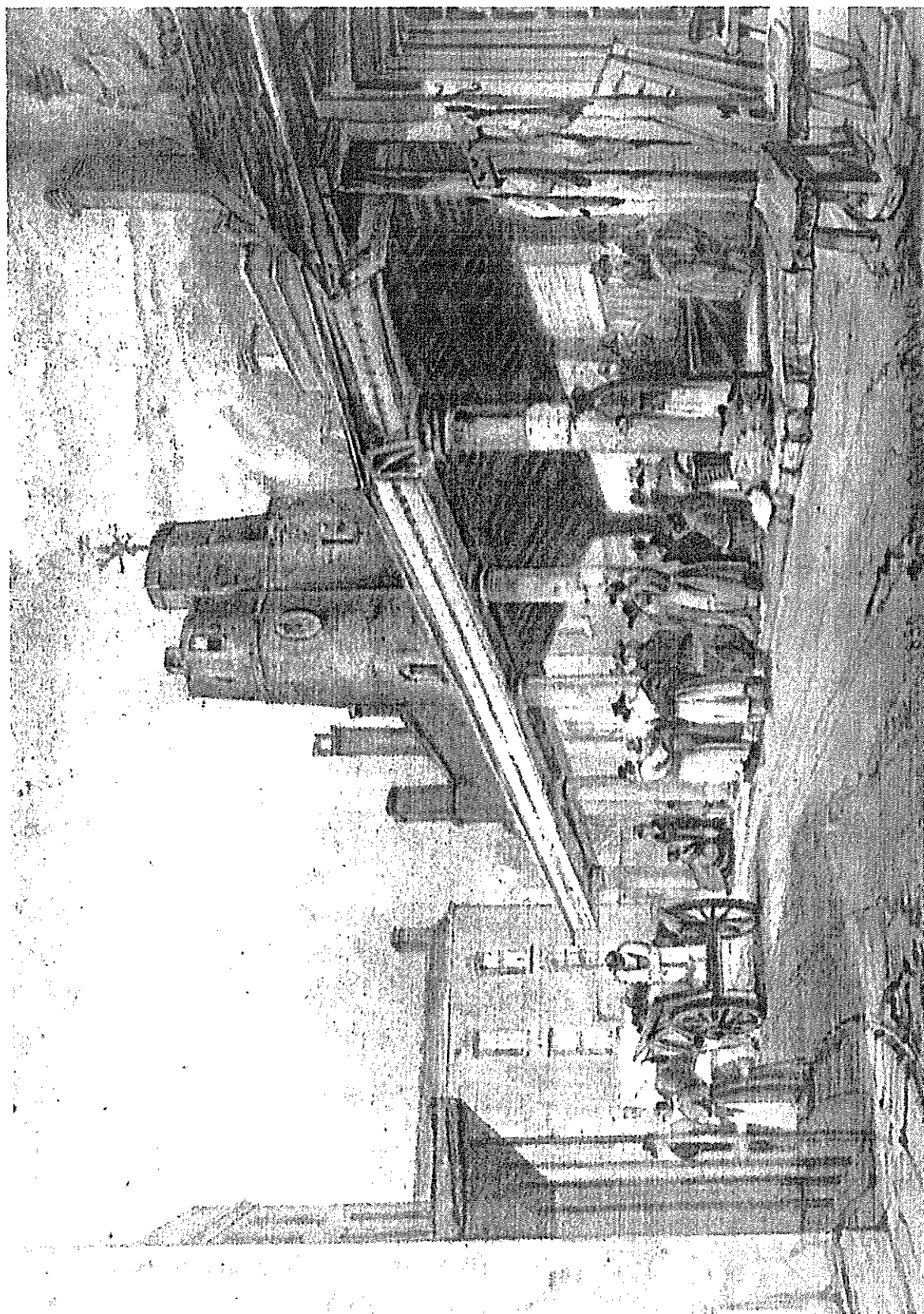
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Fig. 14 The Strand from the east, c.1830, by Henri Gastineau

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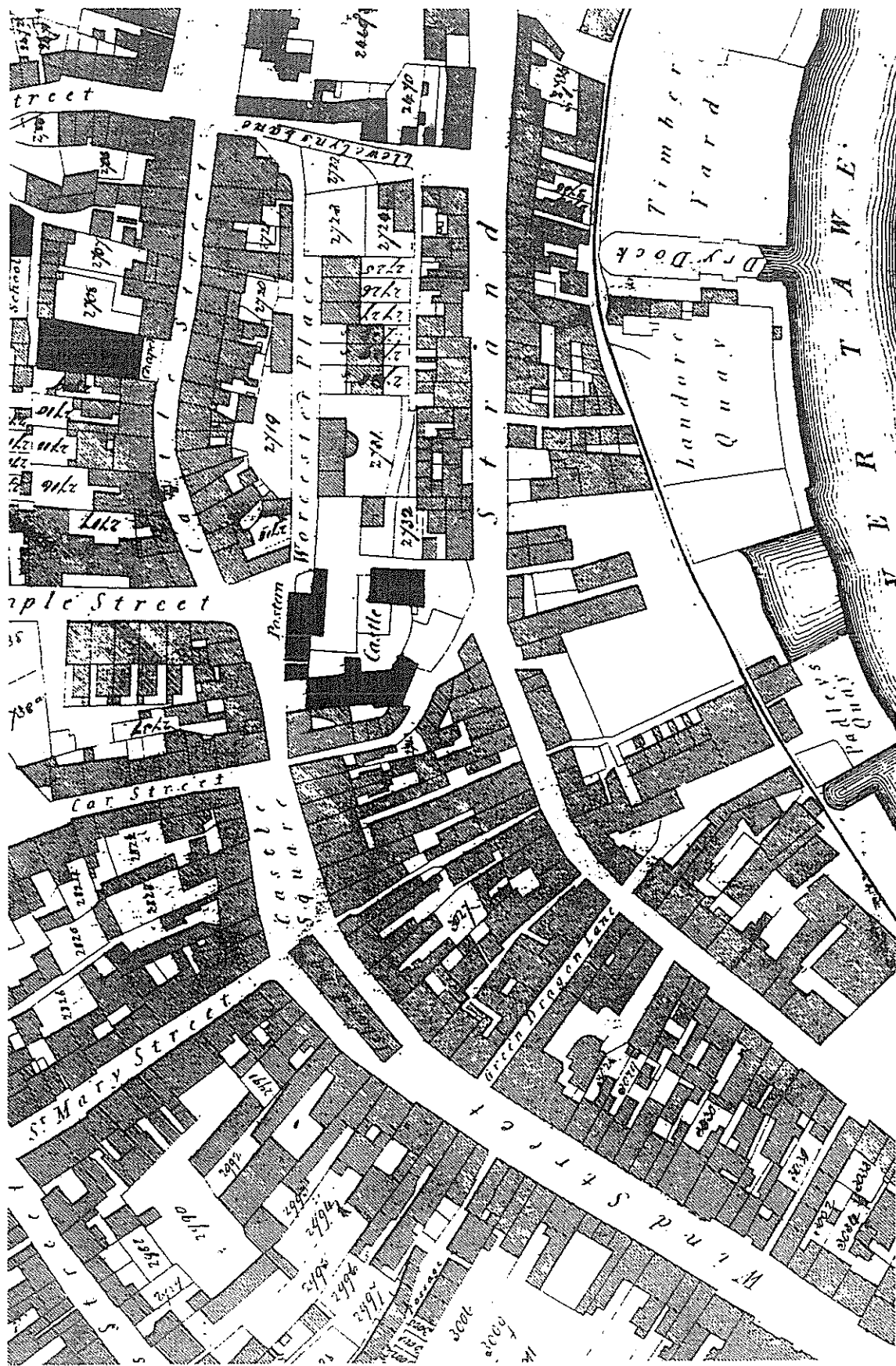
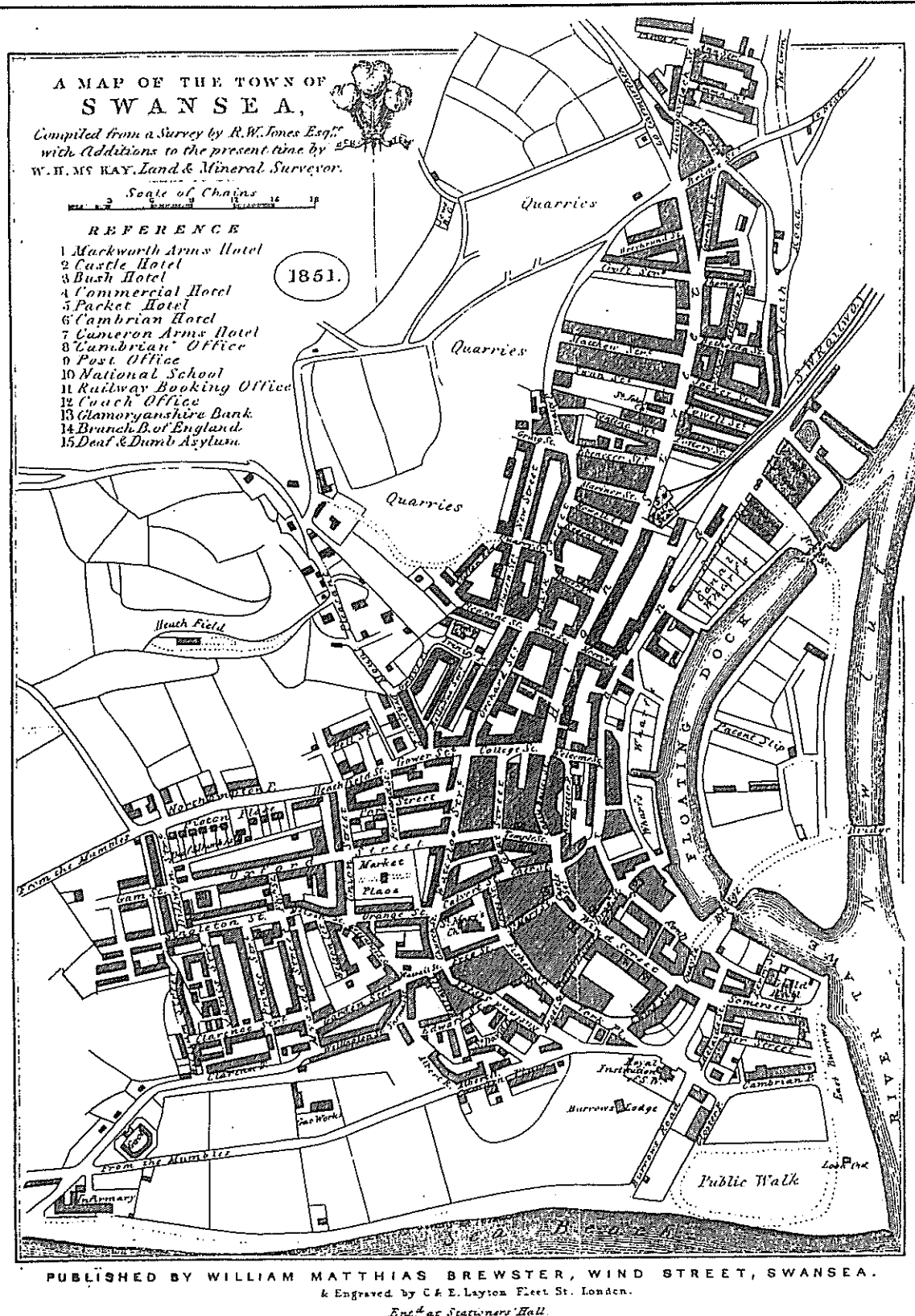


Fig. 18 Plan of central Swansea in 1843

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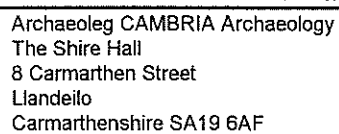
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Fig. 19 Plan of Swansea in 1851 by W. H. McKay

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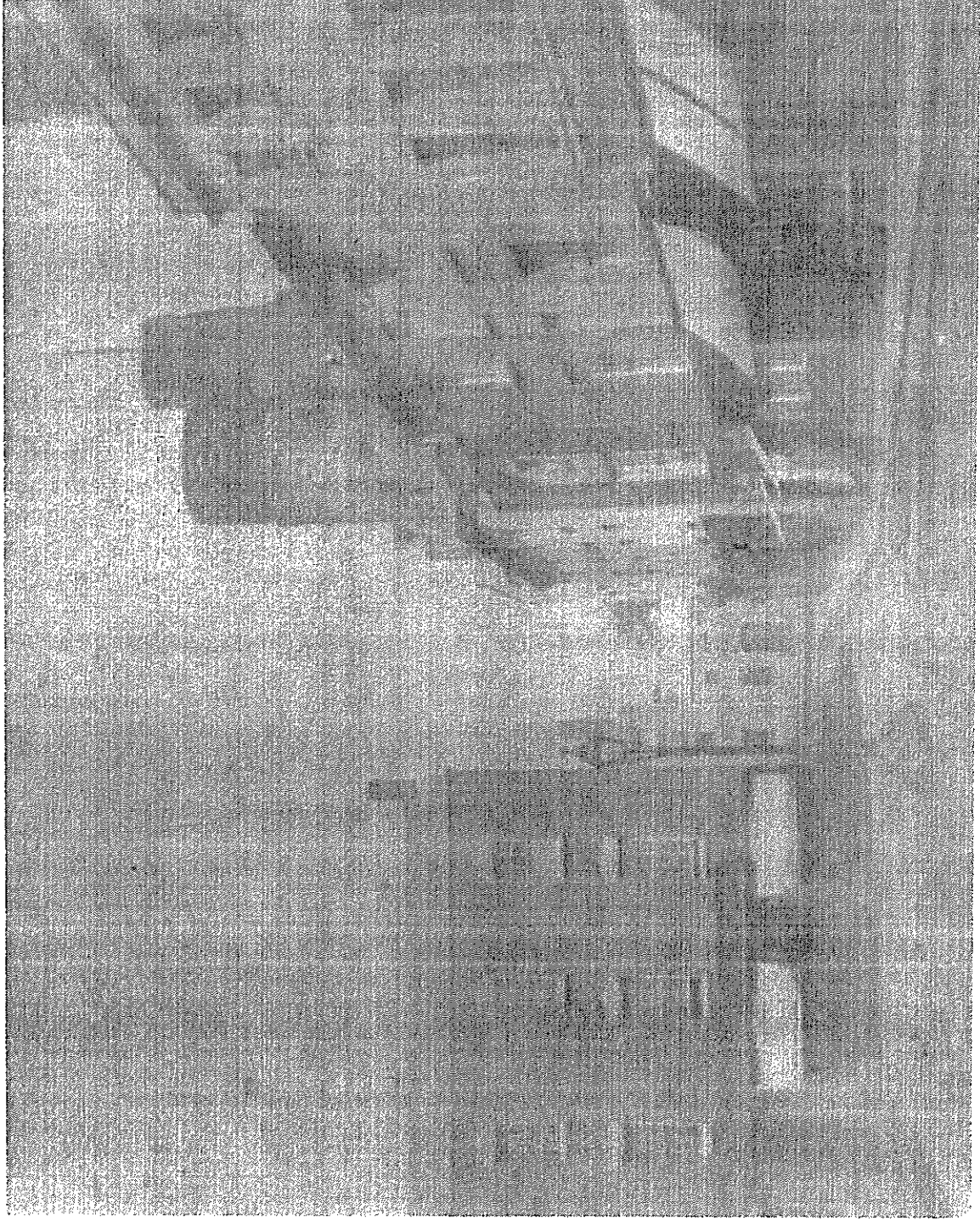


Fig. 21 Photograph of Castle Square from the south-west, in 1947
(Swansea Museum, 1992, 12.3, reproduced by courtesy of Swansea Museum)

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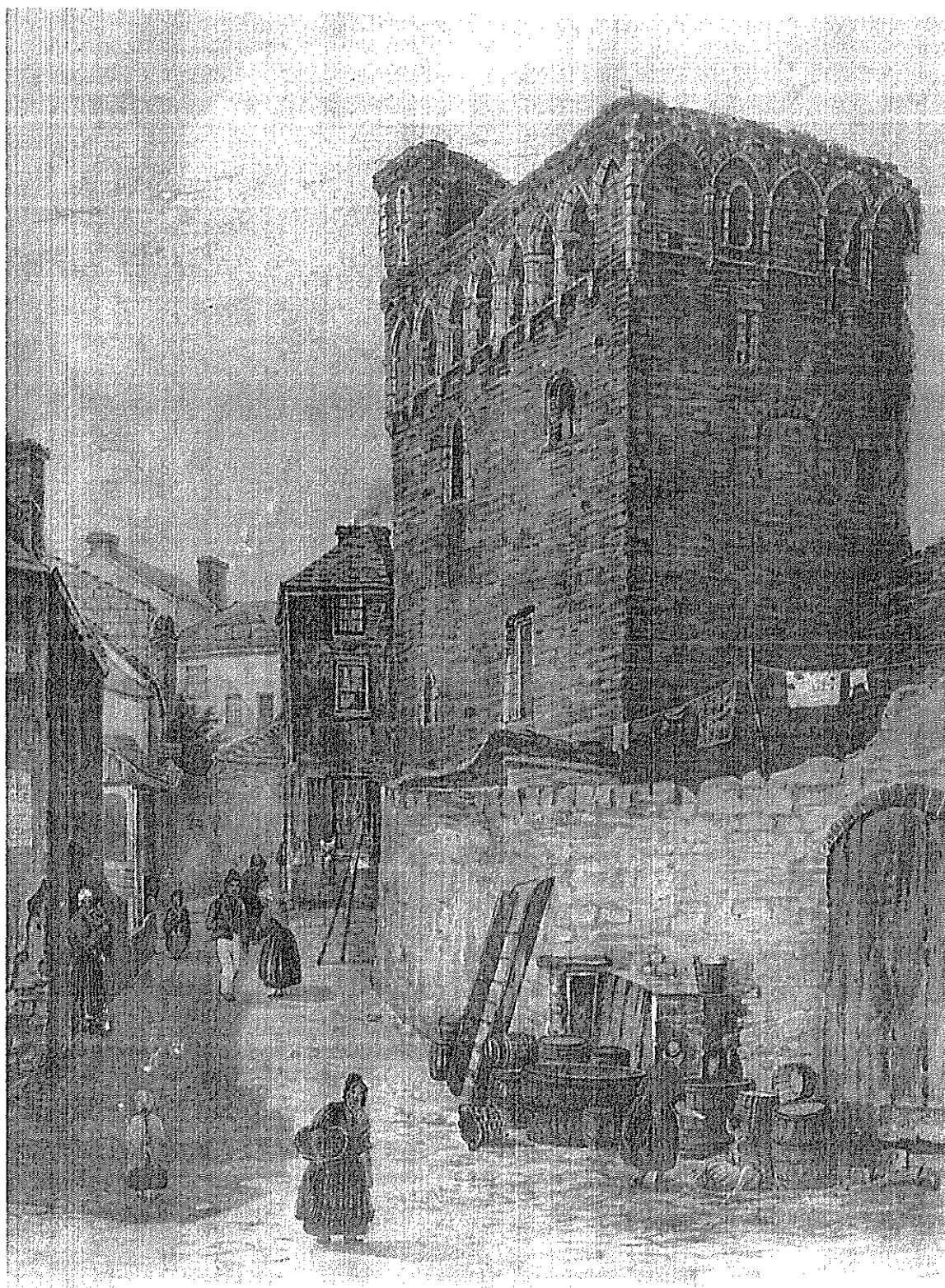
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Fig. 22 Photograph of Castle Lane from the east, in 1847

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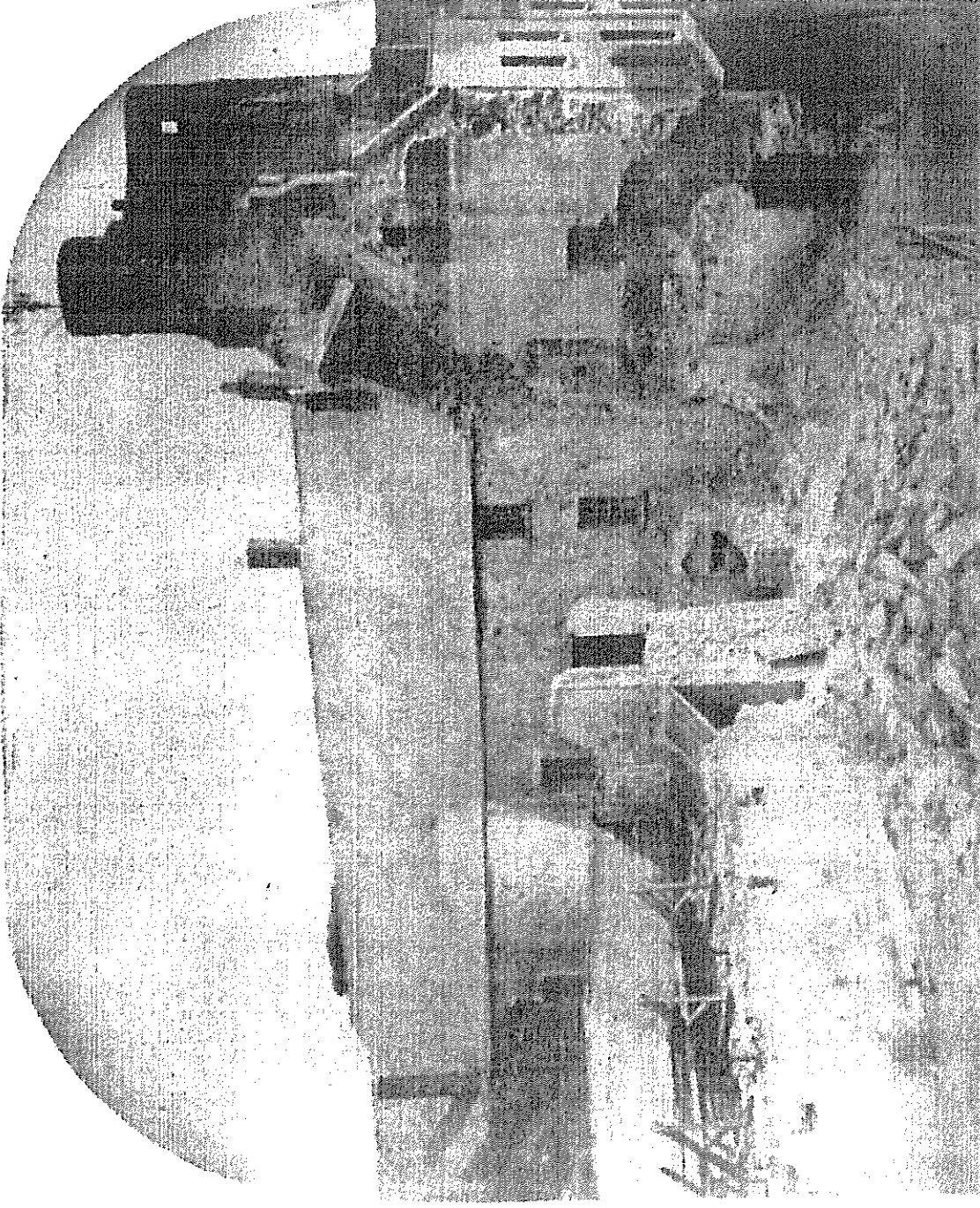
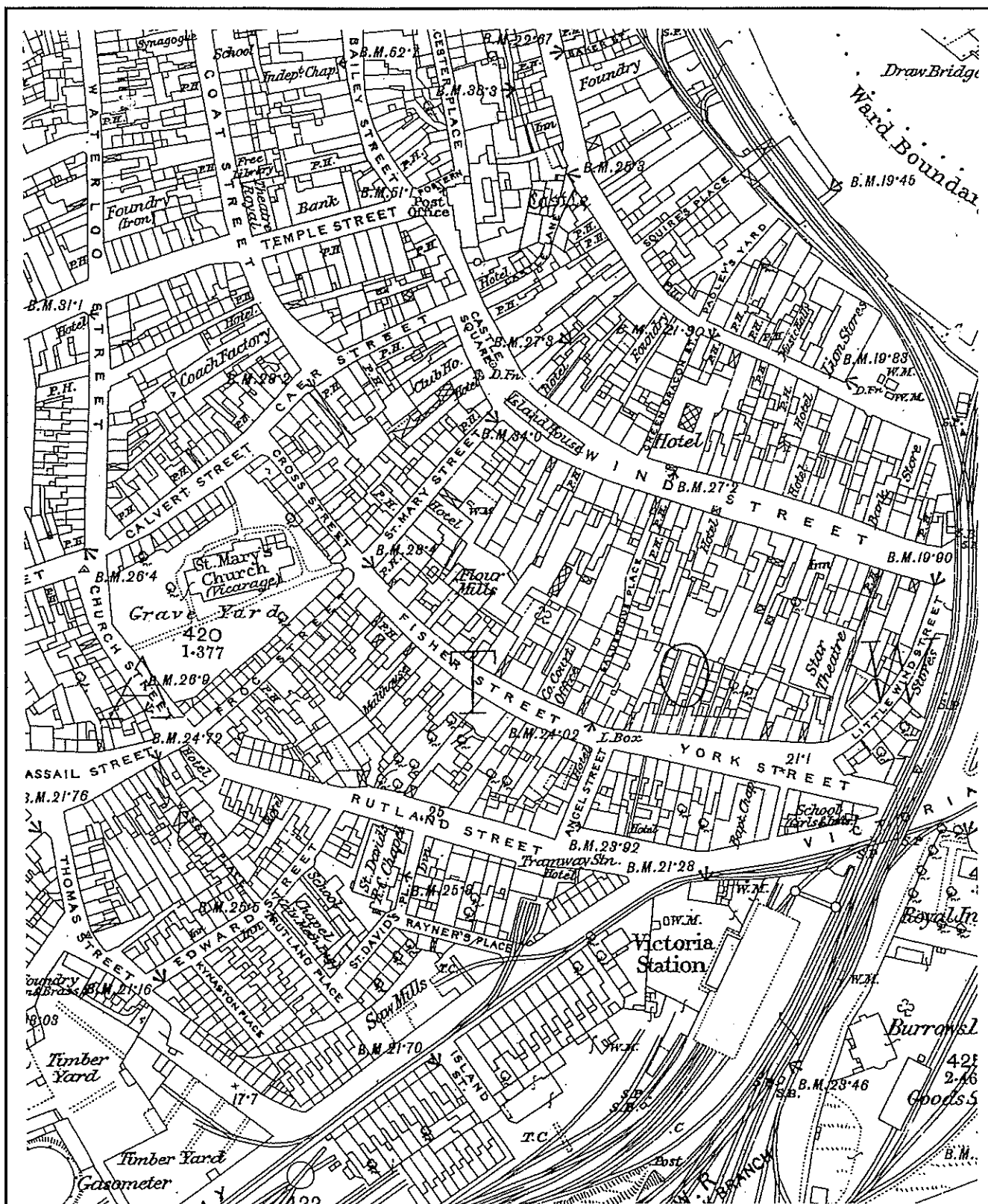


Fig. 24 Photograph of the demolition of the old Town Hall showing Castle Lane from the west, 1856 (Swansea Museum, 1992, 12.14, reproduced by courtesy of Swansea Museum)

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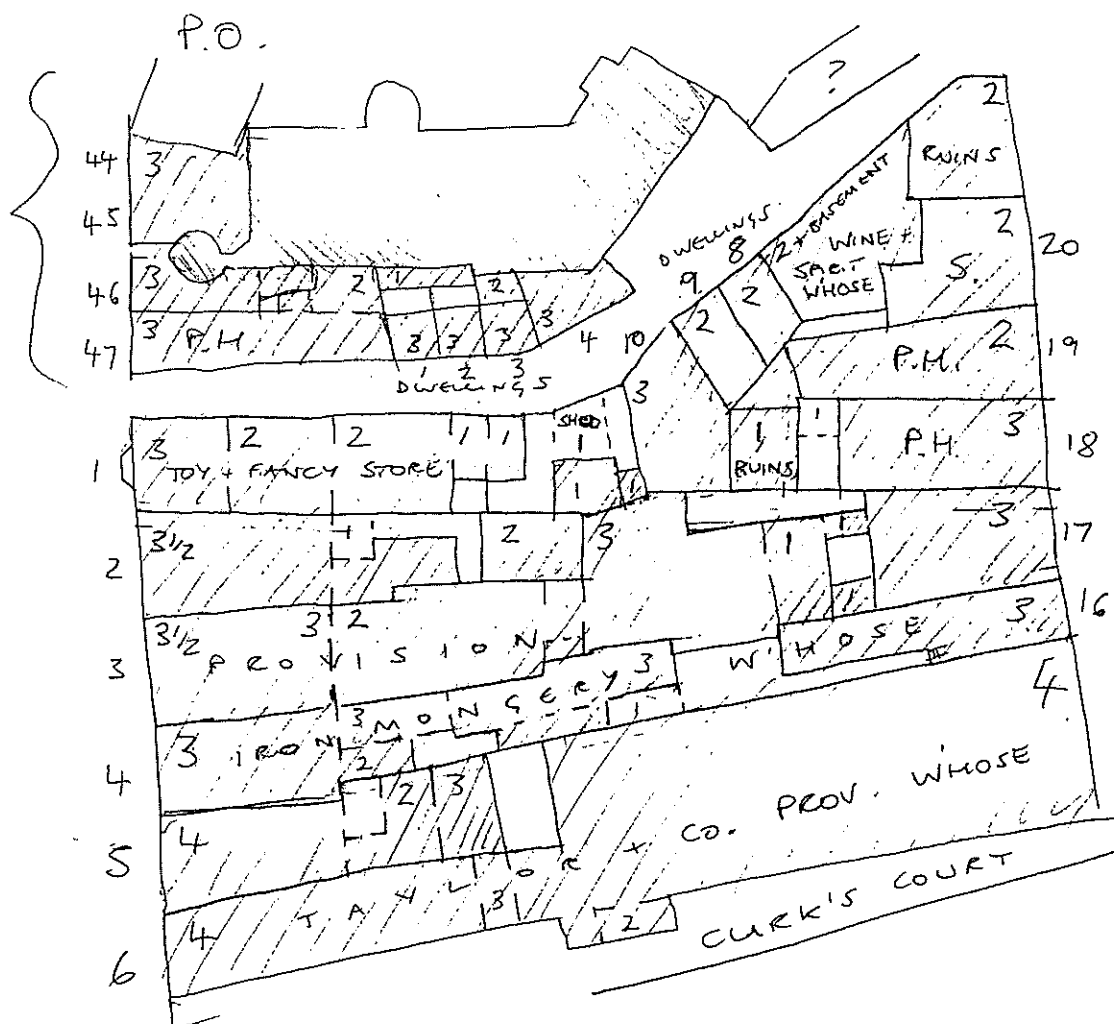
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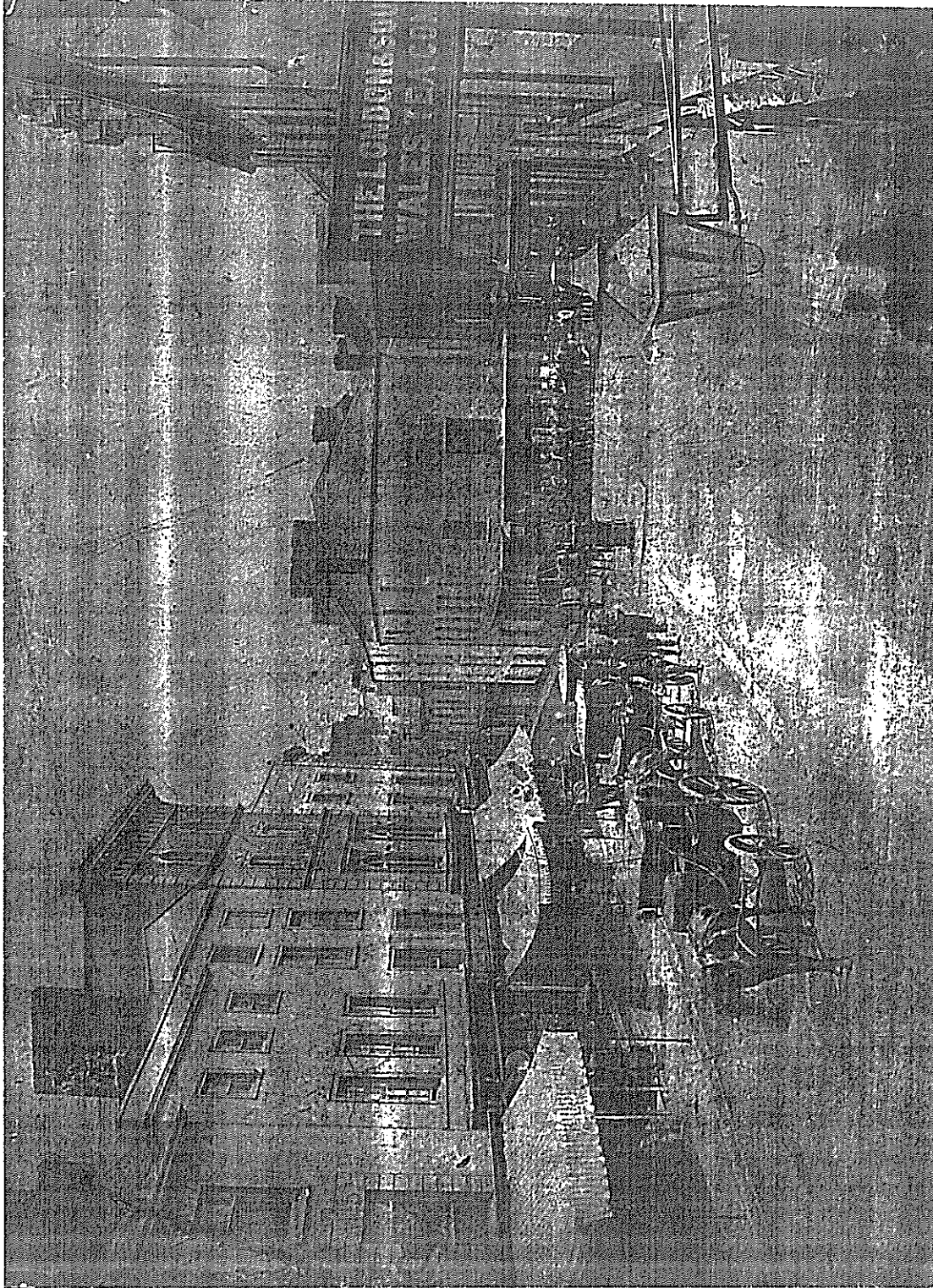


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Fig. 25 Plan of central Swansea in 1879

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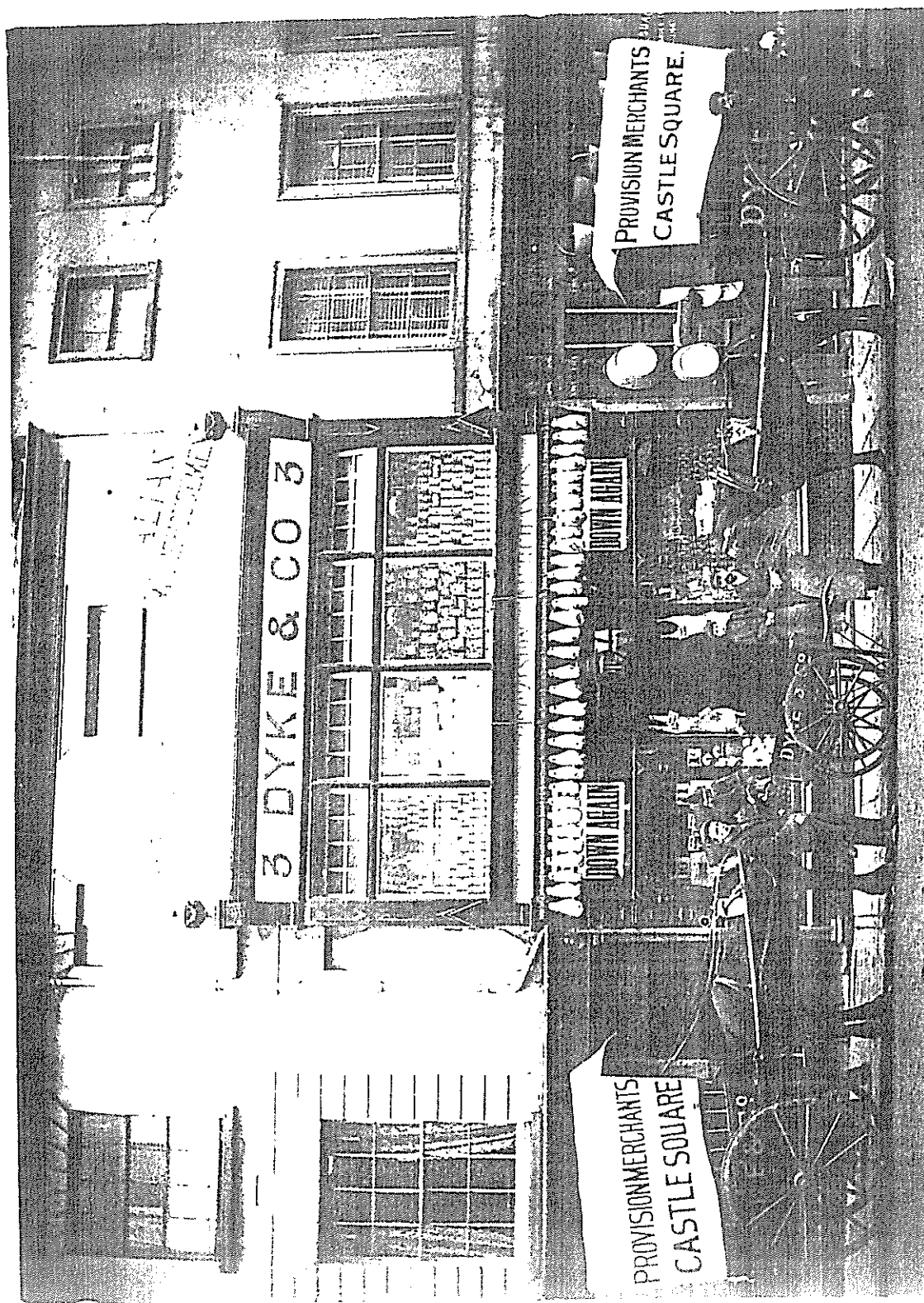
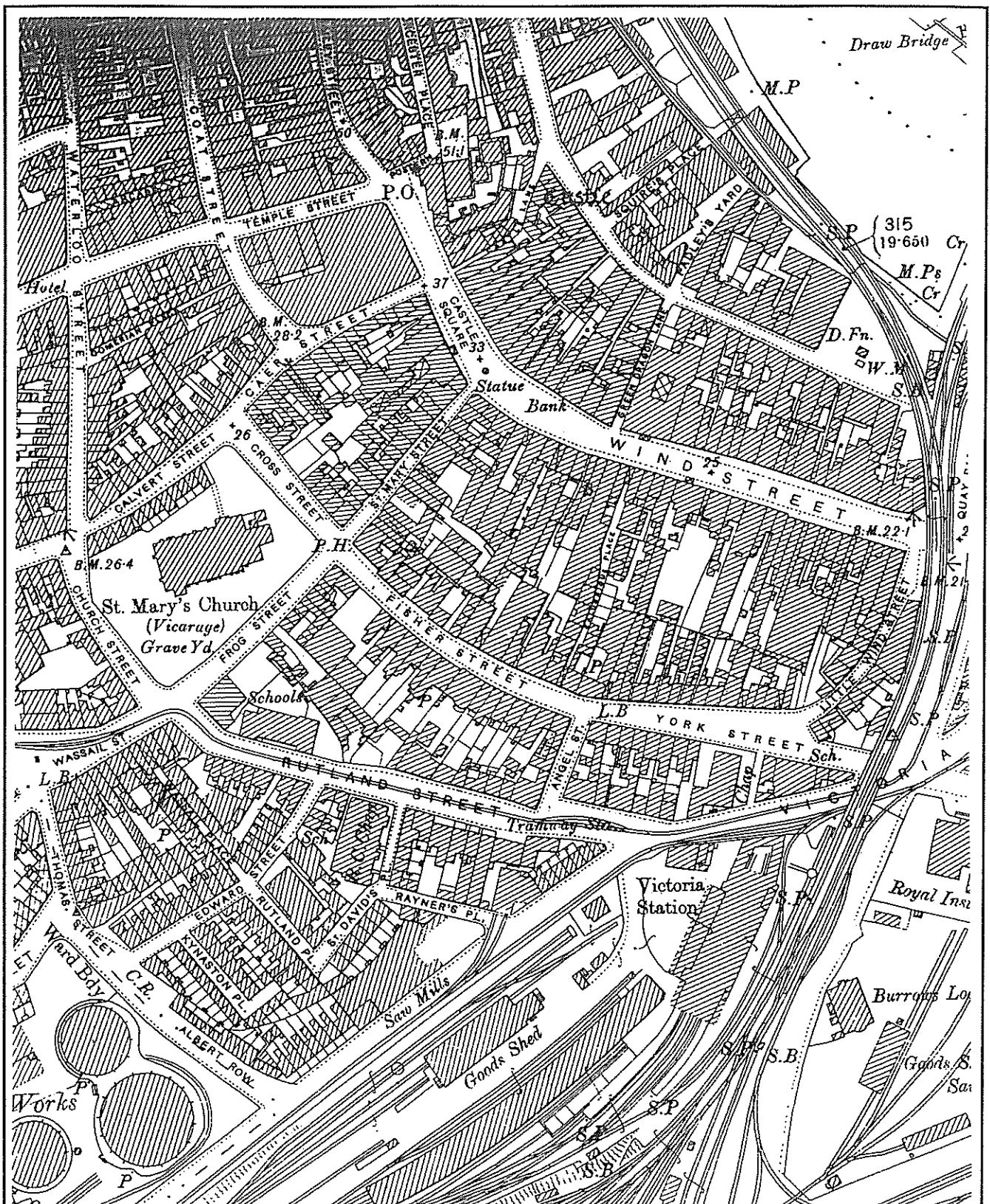


Fig. 28 Nos. 2-4 Castle Square from the west, c.1890

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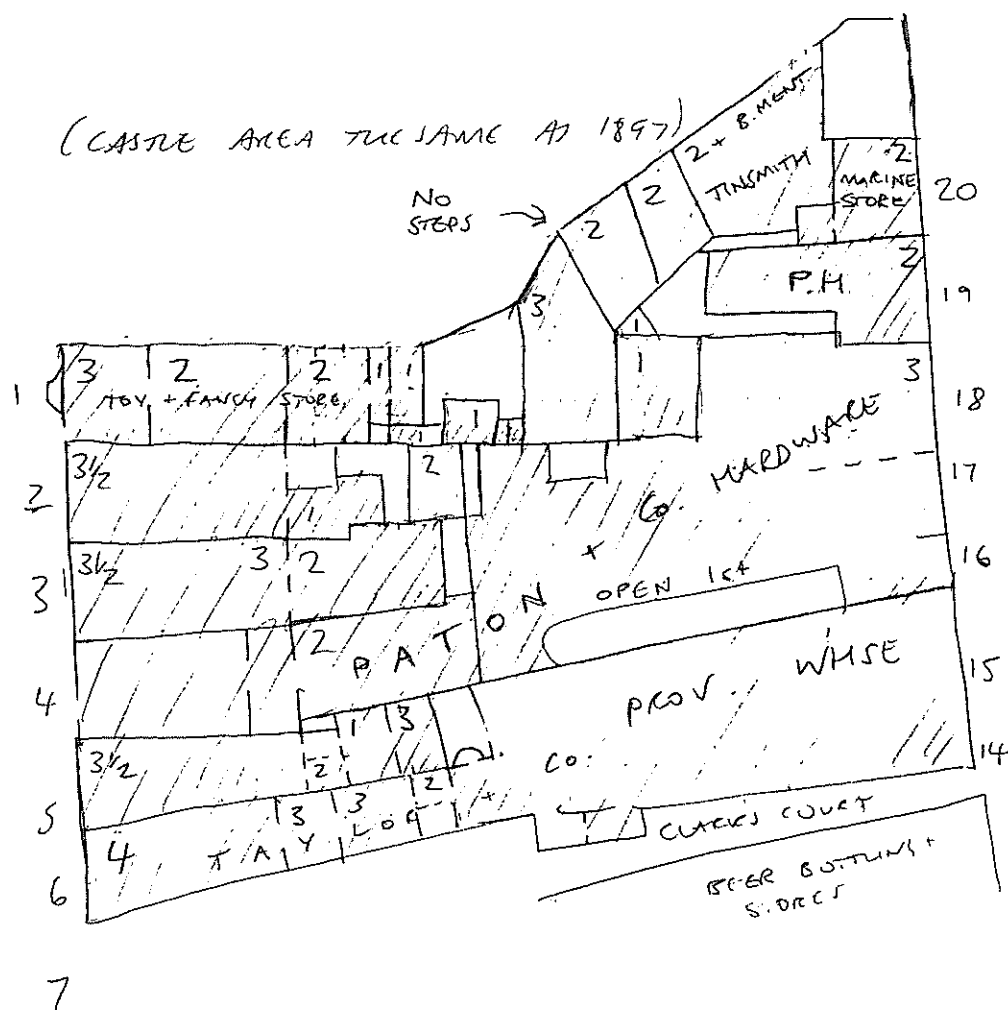
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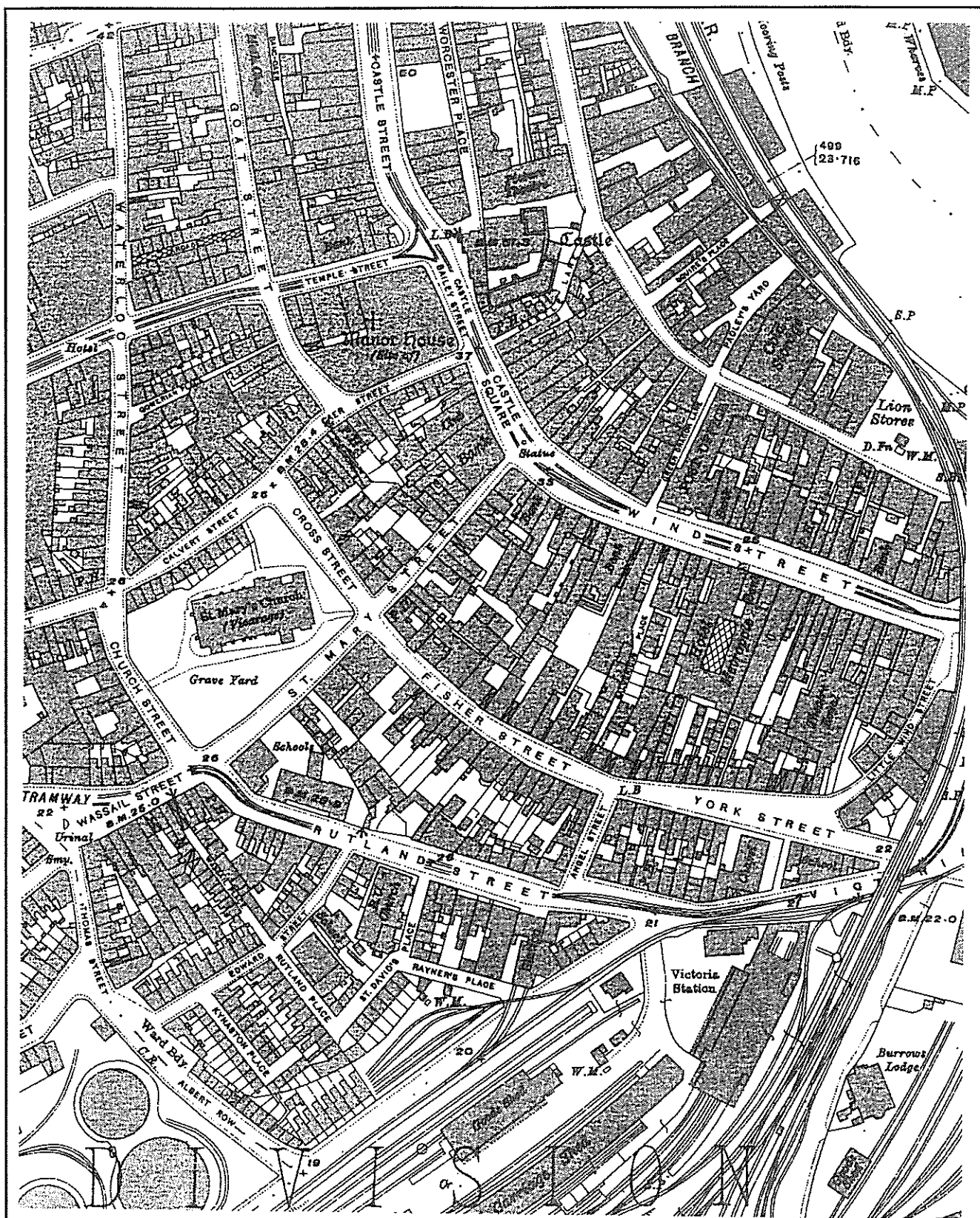


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Fig. 29 Plan of central Swansea in 1899

1:2500, Edition of 1919, Glamorganshire Sheet XXIV.5)

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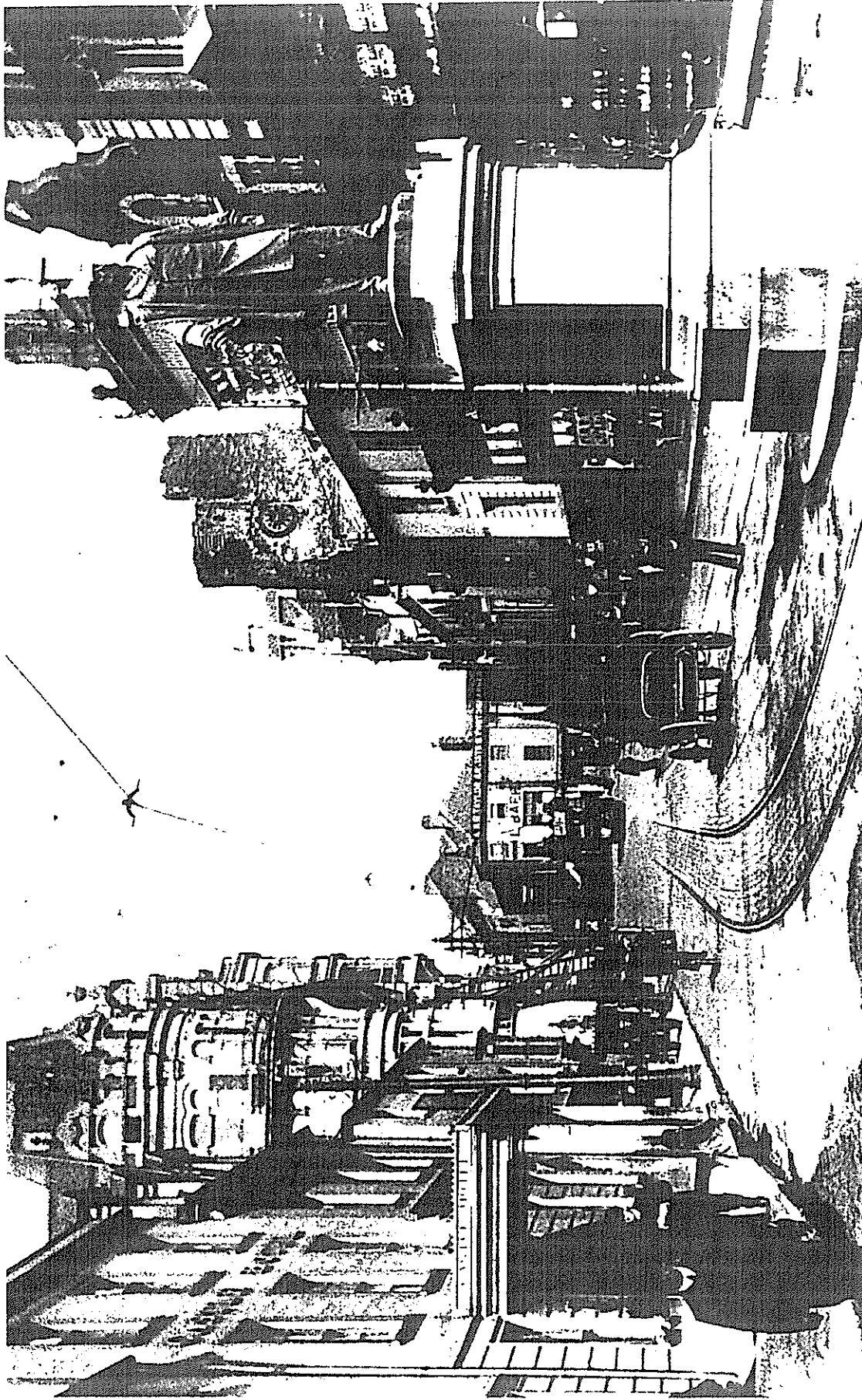


Fig. 32 Castle Square from the south-west, in 1908

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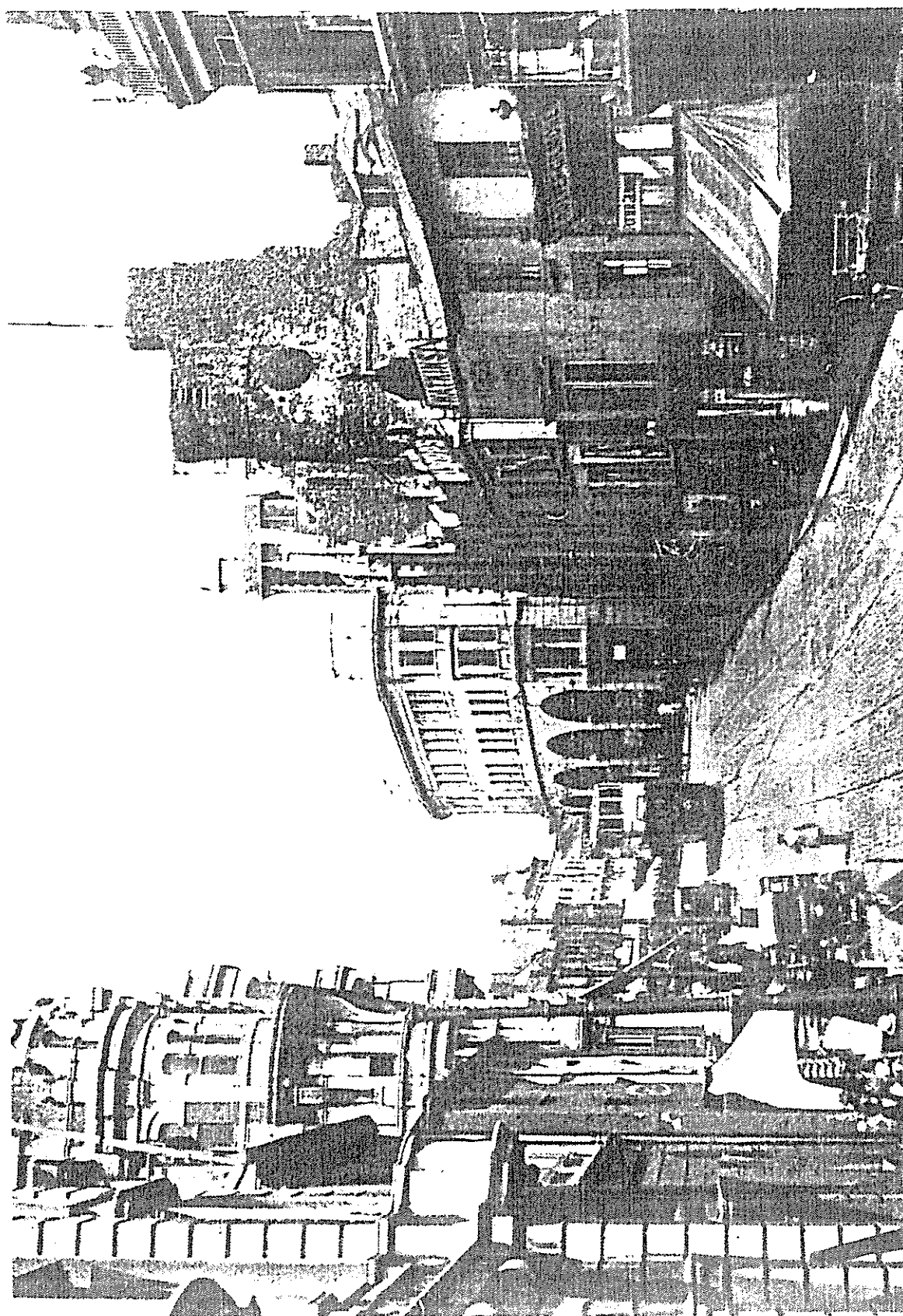


Fig. 33 Castle Square from the south-west, c.1920
(West Glamorgan Record Office, P/PR/714/2)

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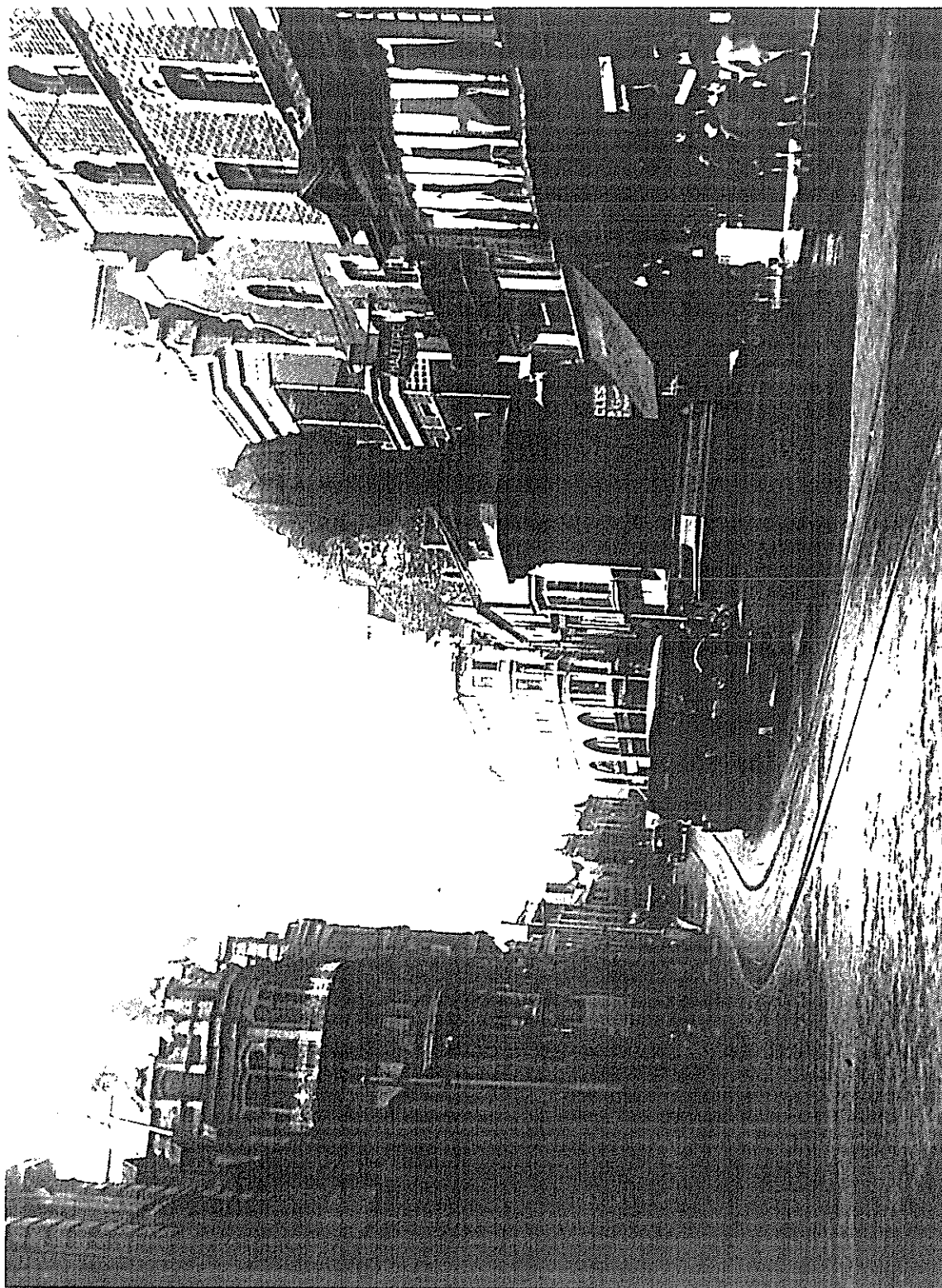
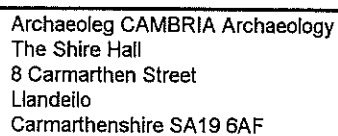


Fig. 34 Castle Square from the south-west, c.1930

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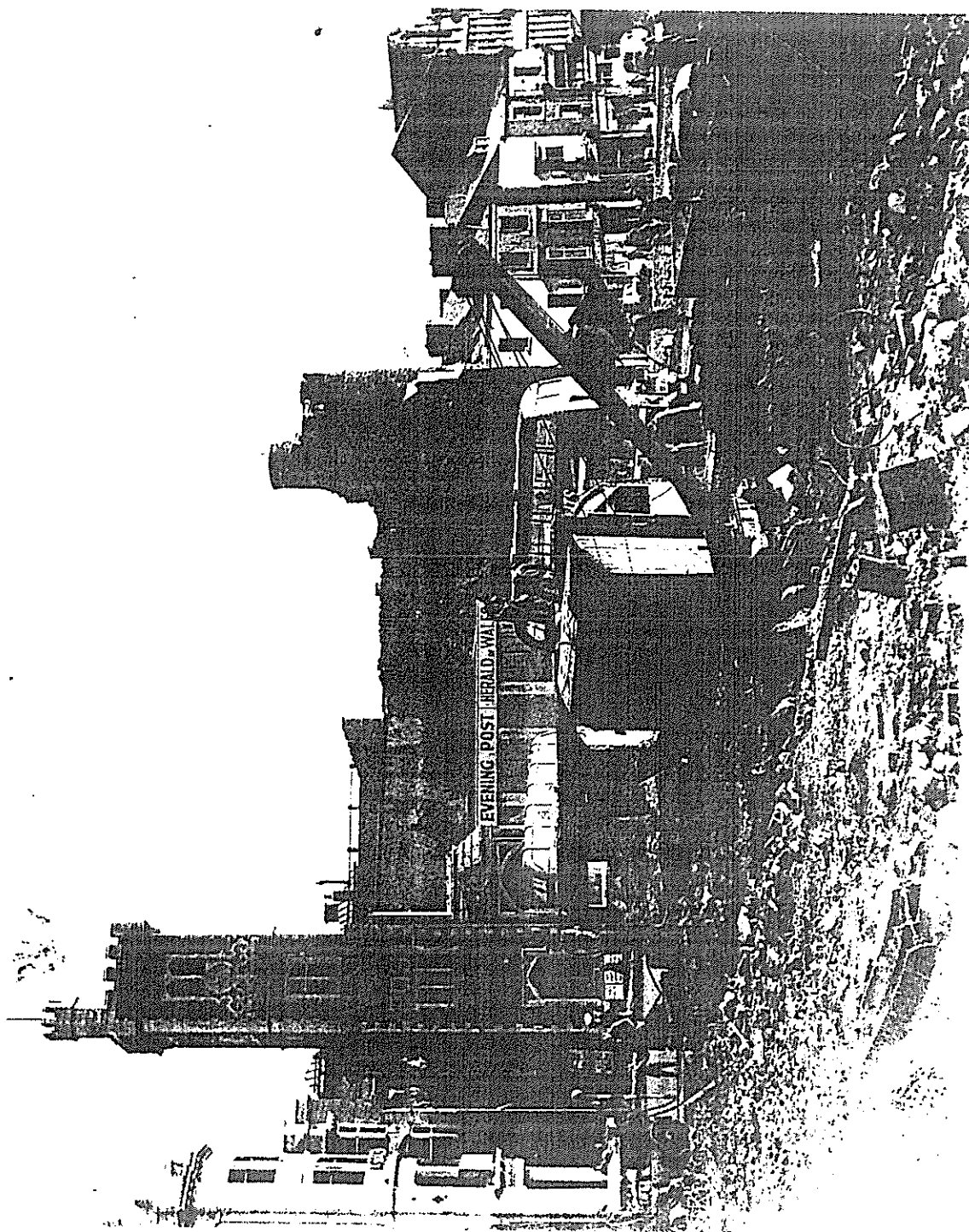
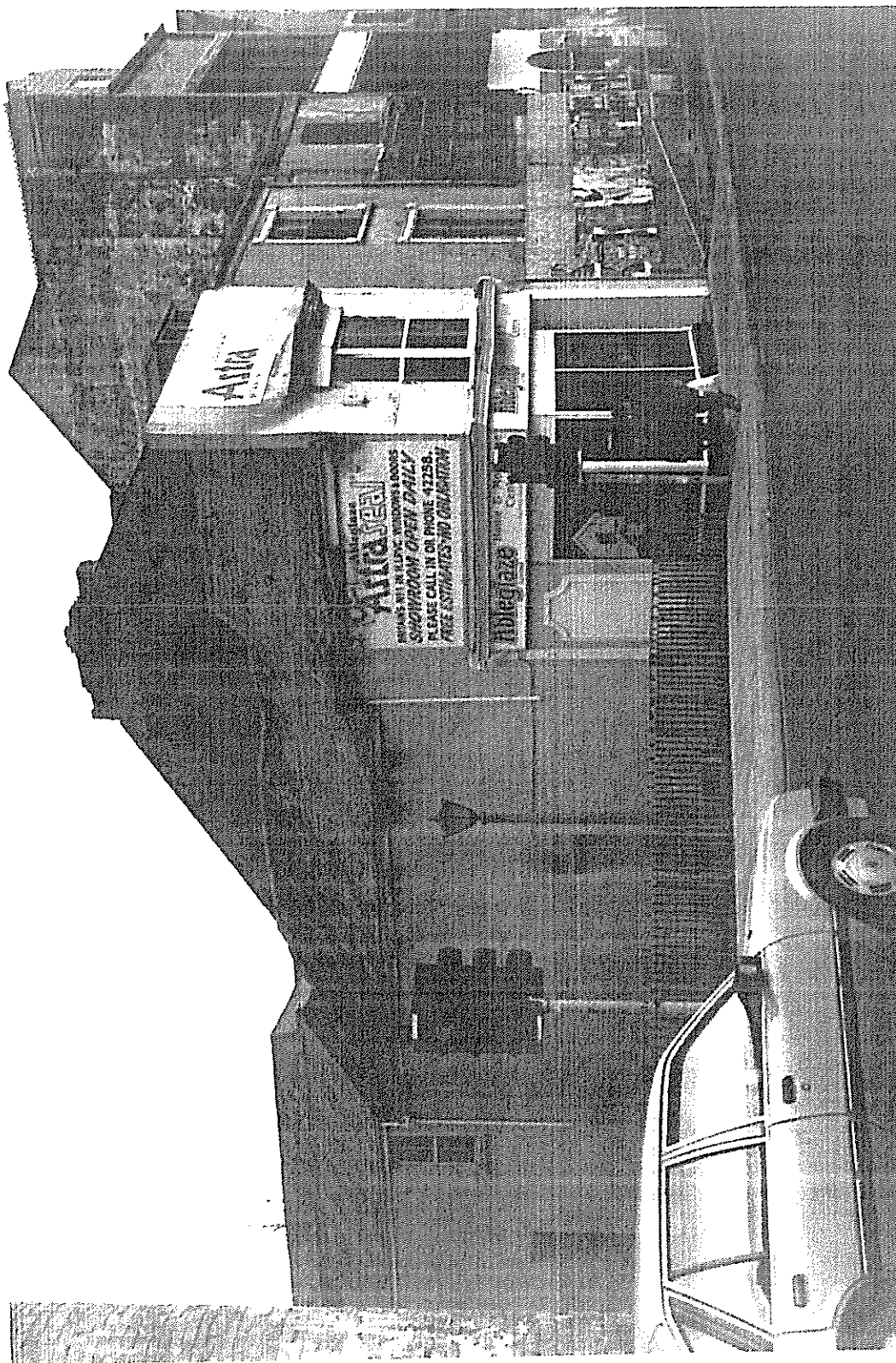


Fig. 36 Castle Square from the north-west, and the demolition of the old Post Office building, in 1949

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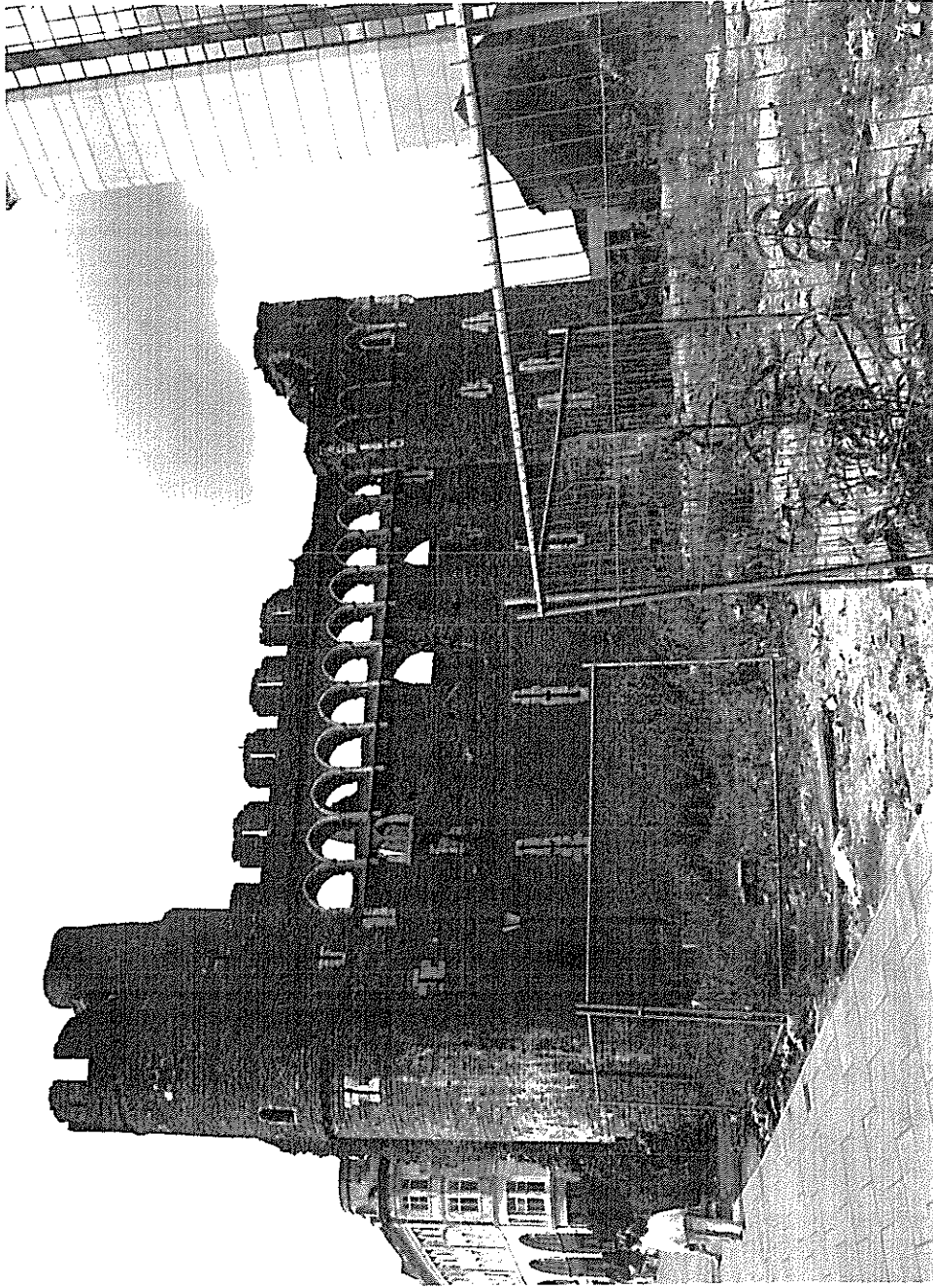


Fig. 38 The study area in June 1999 - general view from the south-west

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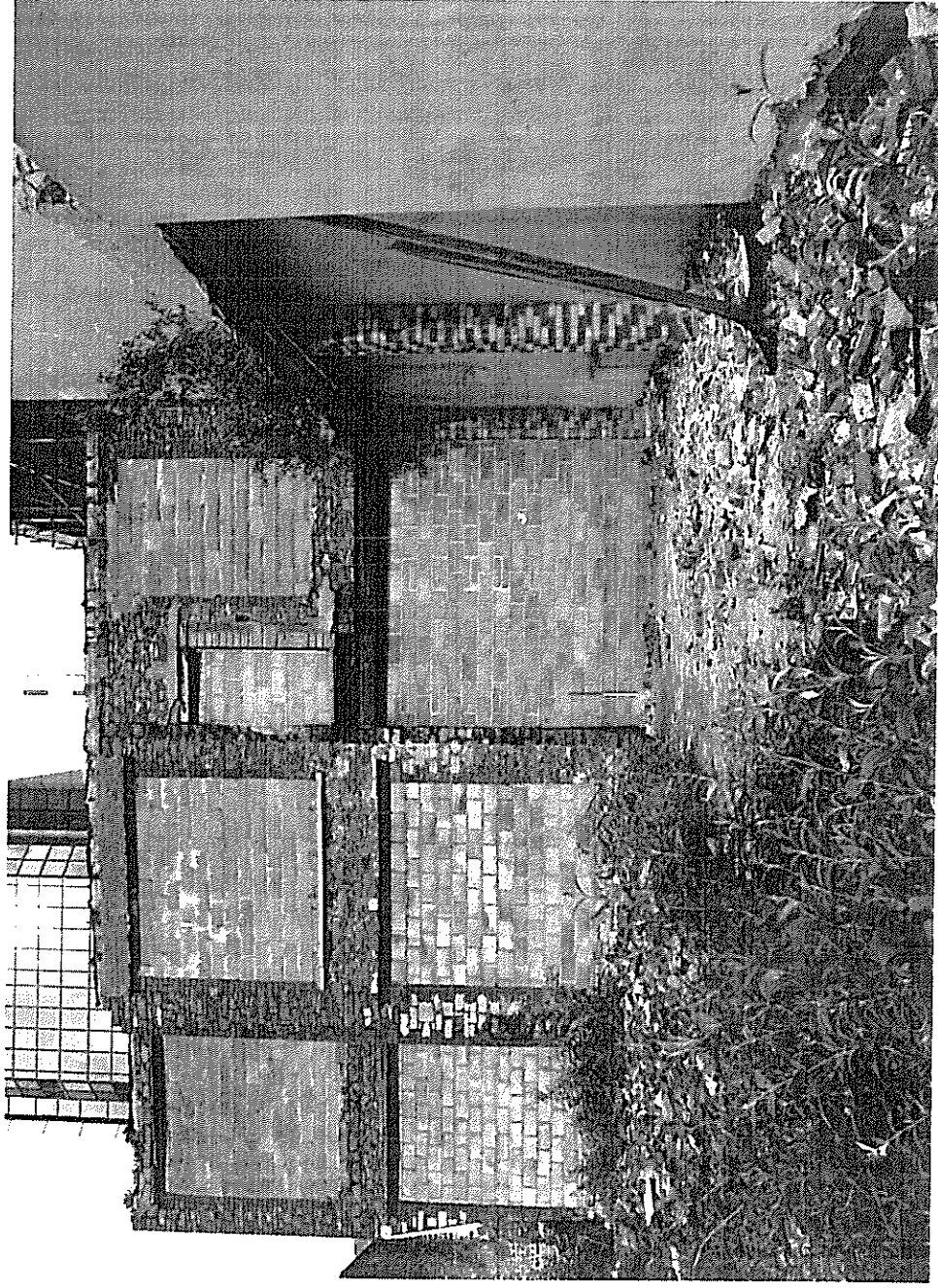


Fig. 44 No. 4 Castle Square in June 1999 - concrete floor from the west

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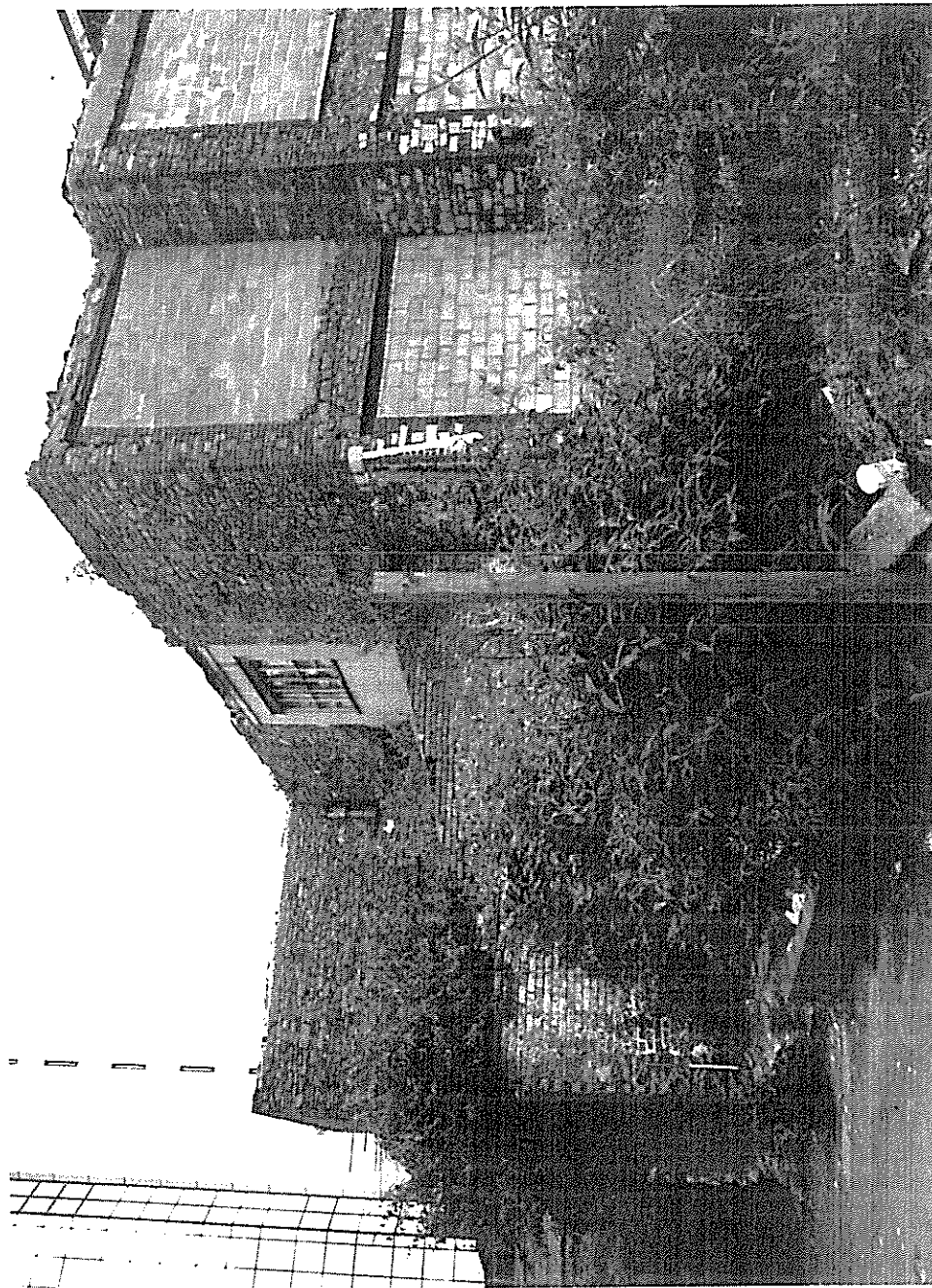
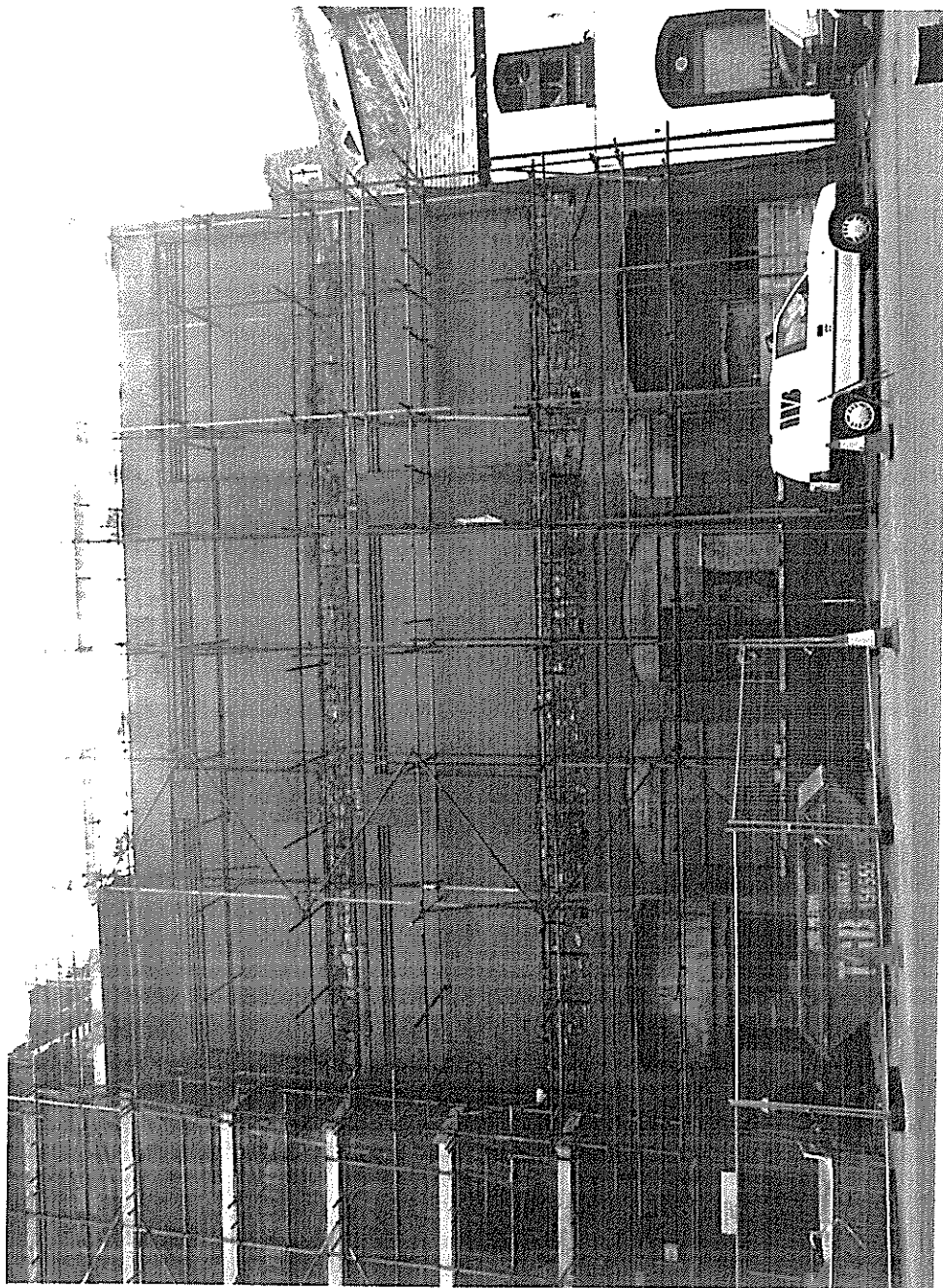


Fig. 45 Nos. 17 and 18 The Strand in June 1999 - the standing warehouse from the north-west

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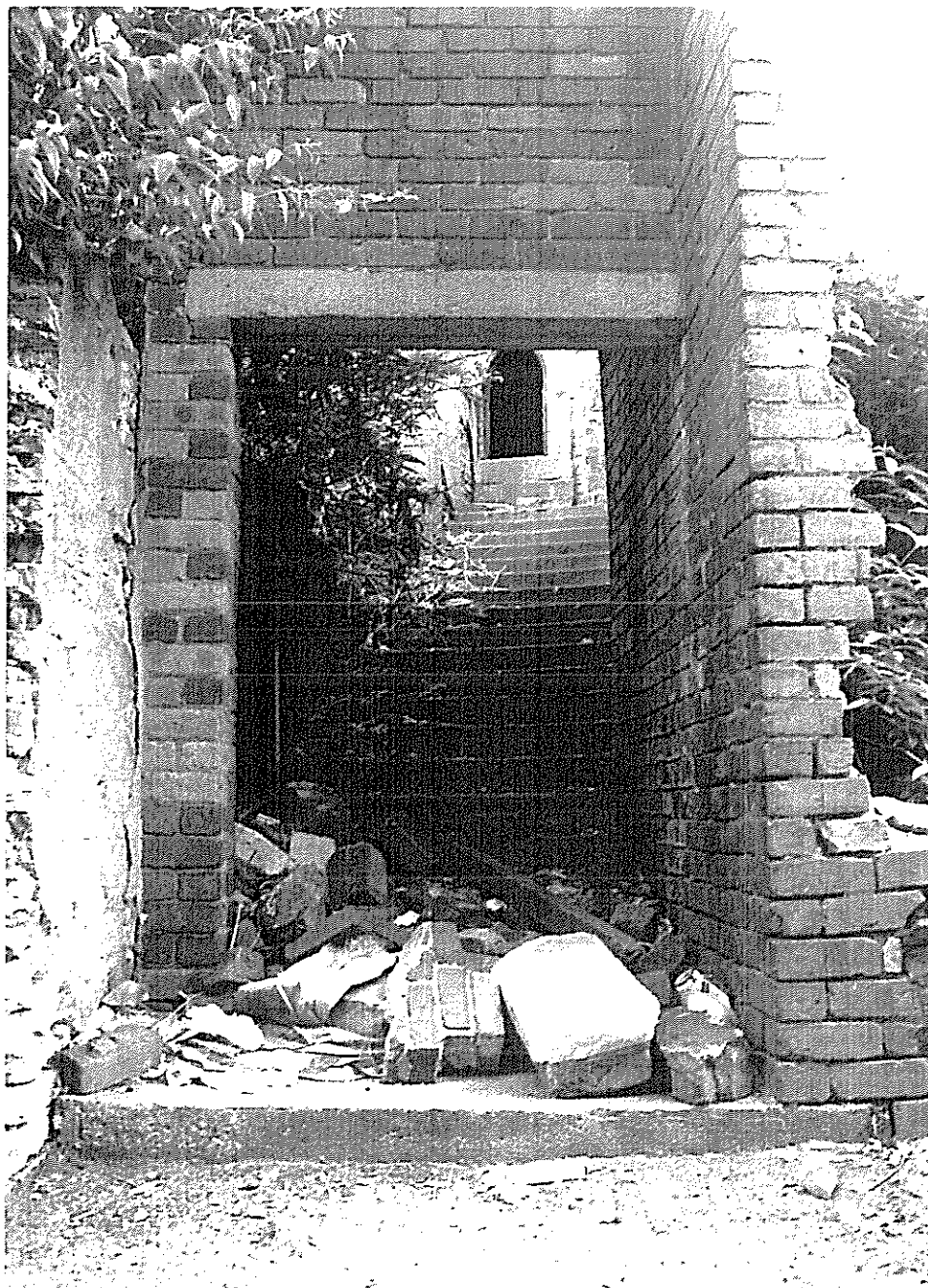
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Fig. 46 Nos. 17 and 18 The Strand in June 1999 - the standing warehouse frontage from the east

the former first-floor entry in the warehouse north wall, and steps, from the north

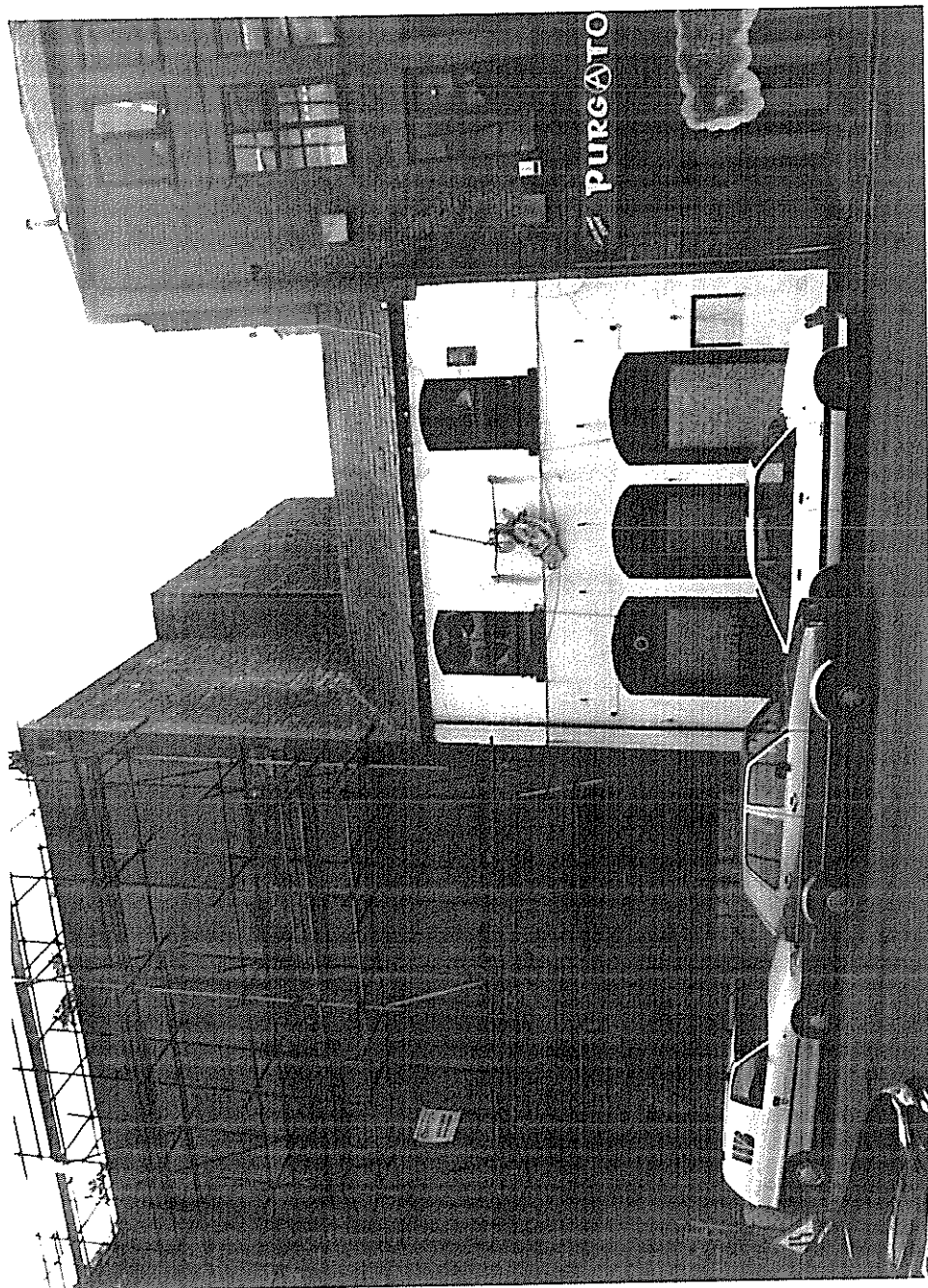
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Fig. 48 Nos. 17 and 18 The Strand in June 1999 -
