


Figure 1. The cottage remains of the birthplace of Sir John Rhys, Professor of Celtic Studies at Oxford University




Figure 3. A circular feature, probably a rick stand or corn drying kiln.

1. Site Description

A stone built and tin roofed farm building associated with Aberceiro Farmstead. It has recently been used as an animal shed, but shows evidence of being a domestic cottage originally.

A long, low building range of three parts. At the south end is the animal byre, with 3 simple A-frame trusses and corrugated iron roof. Sockets within gable end indicate the height of a former loft, now removed. A central doorway in the west wall and a small window or ventilation slit, now blocked, and an opening in the gable end at loft height.

The middle section has a central doorway flanked by small square windows, at different heights. The north gable wall has a flue recessed into the stonework which presumably would have supported a wicker chimney hood, now lost. Again sockets in the north gable indicate the height of a former (crog) loft.

The third, northern, section is a later addition to the former cottage and contains a stable and cart shed with granary overhead - accessed by a first floor opening in the gable end.


2. Current Condition

The building is in fair condition and the current owner endeavours to maintain it. It would benefit from some repairs or renewal to the tin roof which is leaking in some places. The wall bulges on the west side by the former gable end of the cottage, though the current owner believes this hasn't moved in decades.

Management Issues

There is some water ingress through the roof and the stability of the walls should be assessed by a qualified professional.

4. Management Advice

The building will require some repair and maintenance to ensure that it does not deteriorate. Repairs will ensure that the building is retained in a weatherproof condition. Any works should endeavour to repair rather than replace, to retain the historic integrity of the building. The building is largely constructed with an earth building matrix and lime mortar has only been used in some areas as a pointing finish. This selective pointing should be respected in any repairs.

4.1 Management Works Methodology

Seek advice from a conservation professional to assess the building and to advise on repairs and stability of the structure. Intervention should be minimal to maintain the historic fabric of the building.

4.2 Long-term Management Recommendations / Best Practice

Maintenance is a continuous process and once the building has been repaired it should be regularly inspected to identify any problems. Limewashing should be undertaken every few years to retain its appearance and to offer weatherproofing.




Figure 5. The farm building from the south end.






Figure 9. Looking west along the possible mine working.








Figure 14. A gateway or entrance through the linear bank into the earthwork enclosure.




