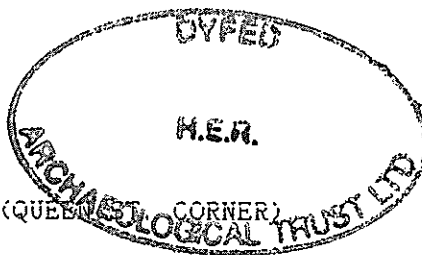

CARMARTHEN: No. 4-5 KING ST. (QUEEN ST. CORNER)

WATCHING BRIEF FEBRUARY 1993

The demolition of No. 4 King St. was watched over several days during February 1993.

The site occupies a central position in medieval Carmarthen lying just outside the 13th century East (Prisoner's) Gate, within the 15th century enceinte.

However, such was the extent of cellarage beneath the building, all former soils had been removed. In no area was even one peripheral section seen.

The cellar in the SW (Queen St.) third of the site was very modern, being constructed from prefabricated concrete uprights & horizontal sections. This partly cut through the remaining cellarage which appeared typically (?late) 19th century. No earlier material was seen.

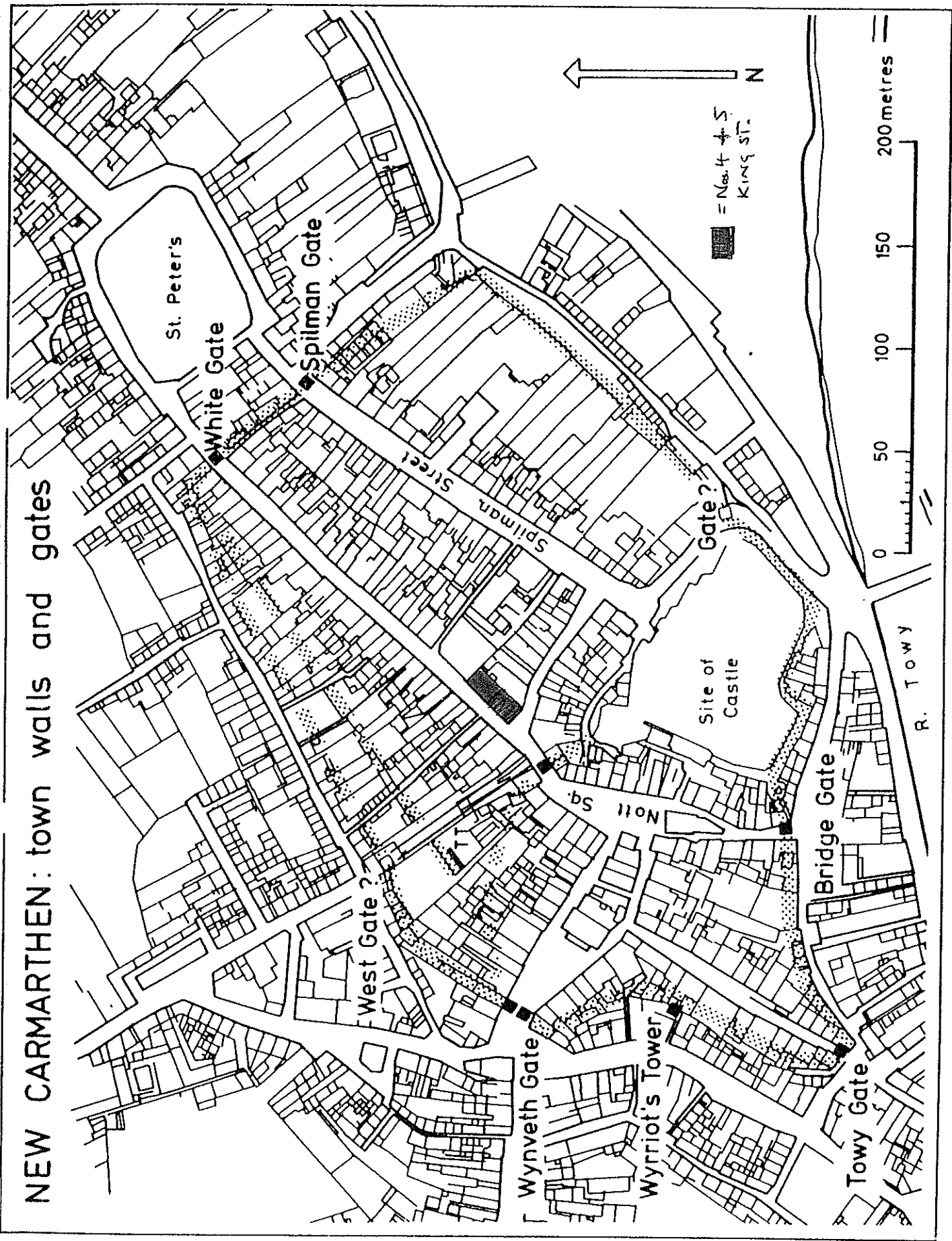


Figure 4.5: Property boundaries based on OS 1:2500 (1890 edn.).
