

INTRODUCTION

A building survey (PRN 42560, Report No. 2001/7) was undertaken in 2001 by Cambria Archaeology, on behalf of the National Museums and Galleries of Wales (NMGW). The building survey was part of a review of the Museum of the Welsh Woollen Industry (MWWI) housed in the former Cambrian Mills (PRN 22585; NGR SN3551\$699) at Dre-fach Felindre, Carmarthenshire. During the survey, a considerable quantity of graffiti was noticed in various parts of the mill buildings. This graffiti was recognised as a valuable resource in understanding both the use-history of the building and in researching the social history of those that worked in the mills. Additional funding was acquired in order to undertake the recording of the graffiti. This work was undertaken while the mill buildings were being re-furbished in January 2003. This gazetteer is intended to summarise the nature of the graffiti as a resource for further study. It does not attempt to represent all the graffiti in visual form although some photographs are included as part of this gazetteer (the original tracings and note books will be available as part of the project archive).

During the internal survey work a large amount of graffiti was noted throughout the mill buildings. The graffiti varies in content from carpenters' marks (relating to the construction of the buildings), technical information about the running of the mill, to personal notes and details. The graffiti also varies in form, including pencil, chalk, pen and carved or scratched inscriptions.

Where it is dated the graffiti ranges in date from 1913 through to the 1970s, although the undated writings may represent a broader period. This resource has the potential to aid an understanding of the spatial and social dynamics within the building, staff interactions and personal histories of workers at the mill.

Only some rooms contained graffiti, either because they have been repaired or redecorated or because there were parts of the building in which the writing of graffiti was inappropriate. Much of the graffiti is written on wooden doors and plank partitions, some of which may have moved from their original positions.

The following are some of the broad classes into which the graffiti can be divided, although it is undoubtedly possible to identify many other groups and classes of subject matter:

Constructional:

Carpenters marks on the roof timbers

Technical:

Talley lists Stock control information Sketches of machinery

Personal:

Names and addresses
Initials and dates
Details of births, marriages and deaths
Records of employment dates

Miscellaneous:

drawings cartoons general shapes patterns and lines.

The graffiti was often complex, with several overlying phases of inscription. Some graffiti had been whitewashed over, making it difficult to decipher and often making its original form uncertain and many of the inscriptions had faded making them difficult to interpret. The condition of the wall finishes was also a factor in the accurate interpretation of the graffiti as in places the whitewash was loose and flaky which resulted in the loss of parts of some inscriptions. In some areas, particularly with faded pencil or lightly scratched entries, careful lighting was required to illuminate the inscriptions enough to allow transcription.

It is hoped that the majority of the graffiti that is written on wooden boards can remain *in situ* or be removed and preserved in storage in case more detailed analysis is required in the future.

METHODS

Recording the graffiti was carried out using a variety of methods. The locations of all individual entries were marked on the ground plans and internal elevations produced during the building survey carried out in 2001 and numbered using a site code (e.g. G1.3/1, where G = graffiti; 1.3 = room number; /1 = inscription number). Legible inscriptions were transcribed into a notebook and areas of complex or illegible entries were traced using acetate sheets and draughting film. Where possible, the graffiti was also recorded using digital photography.

The graffiti has been compiled into a gazetteer (see below) and it is hoped to create a computerised database in the future to facilitate the easy cross-referencing of the various names, addresses and dates throughout the building.

THE GAZETTEER

In this gazetteer, letters and words, which were clearly legible, are represented in block capitals. Some words appear to be clear but are either spelt incorrectly, or the letters have been transcribed incorrectly. Due to difficulties in reading handwriting styles or distinguishing some letter combinations (B & R; P & F; A & H can be mistaken) some of the transcriptions are incomplete. In these cases uncertain letters or words are represented in lower case in brackets while suggestions for probable missing letters are represented in lower case with a question mark.

No attempts have been made to correct spellings or to replace whole words. Apparently meaningless words are represented as they appeared and in some cases it may be necessary to refer to the tracings in order to make proper sense of some words.

Only those rooms in which graffiti was noted are listed below.

ROOM 1.1 GALLERY 2

The only graffiti identified in this room is located on the door-frame for the stairs leading up to Room 1.2 at the west end of the building. This door was no longer present at the time the graffiti recording was undertaken.

The room is entered via the original staircase (1906-1913) from the ground floor Room 1.1. Graffiti identified in this room was written on wooden shelving constructed from planks (possibly re-used), built against the stair panelling at the west end of the room. More detailed location of the graffiti on the wooden shelving is contained in the project notebooks. In addition there was graffiti carved into the hand rail that edged the stairwell before it was encased with pitchpine panelling.

ROOM 1.3 ATTIC ROOM

Stairs lead up to the attic from the west end of Room 1.2 (below). The western bay (Bay 1) is occupied by the winch for the hoist that leads into the attic from the taking-in door in the first floor Room 1.2. Graffiti was located primarily in Bays 1-5 which have been partitioned off with wooden planks upon which much of the graffiti is written. It is possible that some of the planks may be re-used from elsewhere. In addition there is graffiti on the winch frame and the hoist itself. The structural survey refers to a roof truss bearing the graffito 'NEW ROOF 194(4)'. This suggests that the roof may have been at least partially rebuilt at that time. This graffito was not however located during this project.




Plate 4: Stair rail upon which graffiti G 1.2 /6 is situated.




Plate 5: G 2.4 /1




Plate 6: G 2.5.2/10




Plate 7: G 2.5.2/12




Plate 8: G 2.5.2/14




Plate 9: G 2.5.2/10




Plate 10: G 2.5.2/15




Plate 11: G 2.5.2 /2




Plate 14: G 2.5.2 /8




Plate 19: G 1.3 /2
