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
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


## **AROLWG CYMUNEDOL YSTRAD FFLUR**

Diffinnir ardal yr astudiaeth hon gan ffin ardal y Cyngor Cymuned modern.

I raddau helaeth, mae'r safleoedd hanesyddol ac archaeolegol sydd wedi eu cofnodi o fewn yr ardal yn nodwediadol o'r math o safleoedd a ganfyddir ar draws gweddill Canolbarth Ceredigion.

Yn Rhan 1 o'r adroddiad hon, cyflwynir esboniad o'r prif ffrydiau hanesyddol sydd ar glawr, fesul cyfnod archaeolegol. Mae rhai themâu lleol cryf hefyd yn cael eu cyflwyno i derfynu.

Mae Rhan 2 yn cynnwys rhestr o'r safleoedd sydd ar glawr yn ôl math y safle, gyda chyfres o fapiau thematig i ddangos eu lleoliad o fewn y gymuned.

Yn Rhan 3, cyflwynir manylion yr holl safleoedd archaeolegol ac hanesyddol sydd wedi eu cofnodi yn y Cofnod Safleoedd a Henebion. Er bod rhestr hir o safleoedd wedi eu cynnwys fe welir, yn ddiua, fod yna safleoedd a lleoedd o bwys hanesyddol nad ydynt wedi eu cofnodi eto. Ein gobaith yw y bydd gwybodaeth ychwanegol yn cael ei ychwanegu i'r cofnodion yn sgil y gwaith hwn i greu cofnod llawnach a chywirach o hanes y gymuned.

## **YSTRAD FFLUR COMMUNITY AUDIT**

The area of this study is defined by the boundaries of the modern Community Council area.

To a large extent, the historic sites that are recorded within this area are typical of the site types that are to be found across the rest of Central Ceredigion. The information included in this working report is derived solely from the regional Sites and Monuments Record that is maintained by Cambria Archaeology.

Part 1 of this report includes a description of the main historical themes that are known to us, arranged by archaeological period. Some themes of particular relevance to the community are presented in summary.

Part 2 includes a list of all recorded sites arranged by site type, with a series of thematic maps showing their location within the community.

Part 3 includes details of all archaeological and historical sites recorded in the Sites and Monuments Record. Despite there being a long list of sites presented here, it will doubtlessly be the case that there will be sites and themes of historic importance that are not included. It is to be hoped that new information can be added to the record as a result of this project in order to create a fuller and more accurate record of the community's history.

## **RHAN 1: Hanes ac archaeoleg**

### **PART 1: History and archaeology**

### Mesolithig (10,000 CC – 4000 CC)

Yn ystod y cyfnod pell hwn, tybir fod cymunedau dynol yn defnyddio coedwigoedd naturiol yr ardal mynyddig yma ar gyfer hela yn achlysurol. Roedd pobol y cyfnod yn helwyr-gasglwyr, nid ffermwyr, ac felly yn tueddu crwydro o fan i fan yn hytrach na byw mewn mannau sefydlog.

Gan nad oedd ynt yn adeiladu tai parhaol na chladdu mewn beddau y medrwn ni eu hadnabod heddiw, mae'n anodd canfod safleoedd sy'n dangos presenoldeb bobol yr oes yma. Yn aml, yr unig arwyddion y gellir eu hadnabod yw'r gwasgariadau fflint gadawsant wrth wneud eu teclynnau ac sydd yn dynodi'r safleoedd lle y byddai grwpiau o'r helwyr hyn yn aros am gyfnod, ac hefyd arfau fflint a gollwyd neu daflwyd i ffwrdd.

Ychydig o safleoedd tebyg sydd wedi eu hadnabod hyd yma yn y fro hon, yn wir, 'does dim un o fewn cymuned Ystrad Fflur eto. Mae yna wasgariadau o fflint wedi ei ddarganfod i'r gogledd yn Nantymoch, Blaenrheidal (sydd bellach dan ddwr y llyn) ac un pen brysgyll (*macehead*) fflint a ganfuwyd yn ymyl y Bwa, yng nghymuned Pontarfynach.

### Neolithig (4,000 CC – 2500 CC)

Y Neolithig oedd oes y ffermwyr cyntaf yn y wlad ac mae'n lled bosibl roedd y broses o ffermio'r tir wedi dechrau yn yr ardal yma.

Mae cofnod am un heneb bosibl ac un darganfyddiad o fewn y gymuned sydd wedi ei briodoli i'r cyfnod yma yn bresennol. Ym 1929, disgrifiodd Iorwerth Peate garnedd hir a oedd, yn ei dyb ef, yn dyddio i'r Neolithig, ond nid yw hyn wedi ei gadarnhau hyd yma. Cofnodwyd hefyd fod bwyell carreg Neolithig wedi ei darganfod yn lleol ym 1951, ond nid yw lleoliad y bwyell, nac union lleoliad ei ddarganfod, yn hysbys i ni.

Nid yw'r ddau safle hyn yn ddigon i'n galluogi ni i ddweud llawer am raddfa y bresenoldeb dynol yn yr ardal yn ystod y cyfnod, ond mae archaeoleg y fro yn gyffredinol yn dangos yn eglur inni fod yna gymdeithas drefnus yma yn ystod Oes yr Efydd ac fe all fod ei seiliau i'w canfod yn y Neolithig.

### Oes yr Efydd (2500 CC – 800 CC)

Mae cymuned Ystrad Fflur, yn enwedig y tir mynyddig i'r ddwyrain, yn frith ag olion carneddau claddu Oes yr Efydd. Yn ogystal â'r carneddau, mae nifer o meini hirion posibl yn y gymuned, ond maent oll yn enghreifftiau bychain. Mae enw Banc Carreg Bica (PRN 9044) yn awgrymu'n gryf fod maenhir wedi sefyll yna ar un adeg ond mae'r garreg wedi diflannu erbyn hyn.

Mae carneddau a meini hirion wedi eu profi i fod yn gysylltiedig â chladdfeydd amlosgiad, gyda lludw'r meirw yn cael ei gosod mewn yrnau claddu priddfaen. Mae dwy garnedd yn y gymuned wedi cael eu cloddio gan archaeolegwyr yn y gorffennol. Darganfuwyd claddedigaeth plentyn yng Nghrug Cynon (PRN 8419) ym 1928 ac yrn claddu ag esgyrn mewn carnedd ar Garn Gron (PRN 5565). At eu gilydd, mae'r henebion hyn yn ffurfio grwp hynod bwysig o safleoedd defodol. Mae saith o garneddau ac un maenhir yn y gymuned sydd wedi'u diogelu fel Henebion Cofrestredig, fel cydnabyddiaeth o'u pwysigrwydd genedlaethol.

Er y gallwn adnabod safleoedd lle claddwyd y meirw yn ystod Oes yr Efydd, mae absenoldeb o dystiolaeth am anheddau pobl y cyfnod ar hyn o bryd.

Math o safle sy'n absennol o'r gymuned hon, ond yn bresennol mewn ardaloedd cyfagos ac sydd fel rheol yn cael ei briodoli i Oes yr Efydd yw'r "aelwydydd" neu bentyrrau o gerrig llosg. Credir fod y twmpathau hyn yn mannau coginio, neu hyd yn oed yn chwystai (*sweat lodges*) hynafol, ond nid yw'n bosibl eto dehongli eu rôl mewn cymdeithas oedd yn cael ei nodweddu gan boblogaeth amaethyddol, sefydlog.

Mae darganfyddiadau lleol o fwyelli cerrig yn ein helpu i ddod yn agosach at bobl y cyfnod hefyd. Mae un enghraifft da wedi ei chofnodi o Fwlchydwyallt yn yr ardal hon (PRN 12199). Cedwir y bwyell yn Amgueddfa Genedlaethol Cymru, Caerdydd.

Mae'r hyn sy'n hysbys yn ddigon i ddangos i ni fod cymunedau sefydlog yn y fro hon 3,500 o flynyddoedd yn ôl. Yn anffodus, nid yw wedi profi'n bosibl i adnabod safleoedd anheddiad o Oes yr Efydd yn yr ardal eto ac mae angen gwneud llawer o waith eto cyn y deallwn natur y cymunedau oedd yn bodoli yma yn ystod y cyfnod hwn.

### **Yr Oes Haearn (800 CC – 43 OC)**

Ymhlieth y safleoedd sy'n nodwediadol o'r cyfnod hwn y mae'r bryngaerau amddiffynnol, a godwyd er mwyn diogelu pobl ac eiddo mewn cymdeithas oedd yn cael ei dominyddu gan penaethiaid rhyfelgar a'u gosgorddion. Mae bryngaer cryf, mewn cyflwr da yn sefyll o hyd ar ben Penybannau (PRN 2040), ychydig i'r dwyrain i bentref Pontrhydygroes. Mae'r bryngaer yma yn Heneb Gofrestredig ac yn cael ei nodweddu gan rhagfuriau cadarn iawn o gwmpas y mynedfa. Oddi mewn i'r rhagfuriau yno, mae olion posibl nifer o dai crwn i'w gweld o hyd.

Roedd y safleoedd amddiffynnol hyn o adeiladwaith gryf iawn fel arfer ac felly maent wedi goroesi ers dros 2,000 o flynyddoedd. Yr hyn sydd wedi ei golli o'r cyfnod yw'r tystiolaeth am gartrefi y bobl gyffredin nad oedd ynt yn byw yn y caerau. Mae'n debyg mai y tu allan i'r caerau byddai'r rhan fwyaf yn byw – yn ffermio'r tir ac yn byw mewn tai a bythynnod gwasgaredig, o bosibl yn ddianc i ddiogelwch y caerau ar adegau o ryfel neu ymosodiadau gan lwythi eraill – 'does dim amheuaeth fod bywyd yn beryglus ar adegau i bobl yr oes.

Mae presenoldeb y bryngaerau yn awgrymu yn gryf inni fod ffermio ac anheddu parhaol yn ardal gymuned Ystrad Fflur yn ystod y cyfnod hwn, yn ogystal â defnydd o goedwig oedd a phorfeydd mynyddig yr ardal er mwyn cynnal y boblogaeth. Yn wir, fe all fod y traddodiad hir o fugeilio a chadw hafod yn dyddio yn ôl i'r cyfnod pell hwn.

### **Y Cyfnod Rhufeinig (43 OC – 410 OC)**

Eto, ychydig iawn a wyddom am yr ardal yn ystod y cyfnodau Rhufeinig (y ganrif 1af OC – 5ed ganrif OC). Mae'n bosibl fod bywyd mewn ardal wledig fel Ystrad Fflur wedi parhau yn dawel yn ystod blynyddoedd hyn, ond y tebyg yw i'r ardal brofi cryn dipyn o newid diwylliannol ac economaidd dros bron i 400 mlynedd o ddyylanwad gan y byd Rhufeinig. Gwyddom, er enghraifft, fod yr hen fryngaerau oll wedi cael eu gadael yn segur ar ôl i'r Rhufeiniaid orchfygu Cymru.

Mae rhagor o dystiolaeth i'r Rhufeiniaid fod yn bresennol yng nghyffiniau'r fro oherwydd lleoliad caerau Rhufeinig Trawsgoed i'r gogledd, Cae'r Gaer (plwyf Llangurig, Powys) i'r gogledd-ddwyrain a Llanio i'r de. Gwyddom hefyd am fodolaeth y ffordd Rhufeinig sy'n rhedeg o Bumsaint, Sir Gaerfyrddin, trwy ganol Ceredigion, i fyny i ardal Machynlleth. O bosibl, roedd mwynau Canolbarth Ceredigion yn atyniad i'r Rhufeiniaid.

Mae yna gofnod o ddarganfyddiad o arian Rhufeinig ger Ystrad Fflur, wedi ei ddisgrifio yn ystod y 1920au. Codwyd padell bres o'r ddaear yn ymyl yr abaty, oedd yn cynnwys 16 darn arian sy'n dyddio i ail hanner y 3ydd ganrif OC ac yn dwyn enwau'r Ymherodwyr Gallienus (253 – 268 OC) a Claudius Gothicus (268 – 270 OC), tri o ymherodwyr Gaul a Phrydain Victorinus (269 – 271 OC), Tetricus I (271 – 273 OC), Tetricus II (273 – 274 OC), a Carausius, ymherodr Prydain (286 – 293 OC). Mae'n anodd gwybod sut ddaeth yr arian i Ystrad Fflur, ond gall fod yn dystiolaeth uniongyrchol o dylanwad Rhufain yn ystod y 3ydd ganrif OC.

### **Yr Oesoedd Tywyll neu "Oes y Saint" (410 OC – 1092 OC)**

Yn ôl traddodiad, cai Ceredigion ei enw oddi wrth Ceredig fab Cunedda, tywysog Cymreig a ddaeth i'r fro o Ogledd Prydain er mwyn amddiffyn arfordir gorllewinol y Cymry oddi wrth y Gwyddelod. Dywed traddodiad hefyd fod y Ceredig hwn yn daid i Dewi Sant, mabsant Cymru.

Yng Nghymru, "Oes y Saint" yw'r enw sy'n cael ei rhoi ar y cyfnod hwn yn aml, yn hytrach na'r Oesoedd Tywyll, i dystio am dwf yr eglwys trwy ymdrechion llu o saint Celtaidd cynnar. Gwelir hwn fel cyfnod o oleuni yn hytrach na thywyllwch yng Nghymru gan lawer i hanesydd.

Er bod y traddodiadau yn hysbys inni, gwyddom ond ychydig am gymdeithas y cyfnod yn yr ardal hon. Serch hynny, mae dystiolaeth bendant o weithgarwch y saint cynnar yn ardal Ystrad Fflur. Mae un garreg arysgrifenedig yn sefyll y tu allan i wal ddwyreiniol Eglwys Fair, Ystrad Fflur. Mae croes wedi torri ar y garreg sydd wedi ei dyddio gan rai i'r cyfnod 7fed ganrif – 9fed ganrif OC, a chan eraill i'r 10fed – 11eg ganrif. Gall presenoldeb y garreg hon awgrymu fod eglwys gynnar wedi sefyll yn yr ardal, o bosibl yn agos i safle'r eglwys bresennol.

Mae'n bosibl fod safleoedd rhai eglwysi mewn ardaloedd cyfagos hwythau yn hynafol iawn, gyda'u gwreiddiau yn y cyfnod hwn. Meddyliwn yn bennaf, wrth gwrs, am eglwys hynafol Llanddewi Brefi i'r de, sy'n gysylltiedig â hanes Dewi Sant ei hun. Mae tair carreg hynafol â chroesau wedi eu cerfio arnynt i'w gweld hefyd yn Eglwys Llantrisant, Pontarfynach, i'r gogledd. Maent yn dyddio i'r cyfnod rhwng tua 600 OC a 1100 OC ac yn brawf bendant o weithgarwch yr eglwys gynnar yn y fro. Yng nghymuned Ystrad Meurig, i'r gorllewin, ceir carreg yn eglwys Llanwnnws, sy'n dwyn arysgrif Lladin tra ddiddorol, er cof am Hiroidil mab Carotinn ac yn dyddio i'r 9fed ganrif OC.

### **Y Canoloesoedd (1092 OC – 1540 OC)**

Yn ystod y cyfnod hwn y gwelwn Ceredigion yn ddod yn un o brif rhanbarthau Cymru. Cafodd ei concro gan y Normaniaid yn 1093 a dilynodd gyfnod ansicr iawn, gyda'r Cymry a'r Normaniaid yn brwydro am oruchafiaeth am 200 mlynedd bron. Yn ystod ail-hanner y 12fed ganrif, daeth Ceredigion i fod yn rhan annatod o deyrnas Ddeheubarth, o dan arweinyddiaeth Rhys ap Gruffudd, Yr Arglwydd Rhys, o Ddinefwr. Ar ôl ei farwolaeth ef, bu gwrthdar o ymhellach rhwng ei feibion a Llywelyn Fawr o Wynedd. Ni ddihangodd Ceredigion oddi wrth rhyfeloedd y 13eg ganrif ychwaith, pan goncwerwyd Cymru gyfan adeg cwmp Llywelyn ap Gruffudd.

Mae gan Ystrad Fflur rhai safleoedd pwysig iawn mewn cysylltiad â'r cyfnod allweddol yma yn hanes datblygu'r genedl. Saif castell mwnt a beili ar lan yr Afon Meurig, ychydig lathenni yn unig oddi wrth y ffin â chymuned Ystrad Meurig. Mwy na thebyg, hwn yw'r castell adeiladol o'r Normaniaid yn agos i Ystrad Meurig ar ddechrau'r 12fed ganrif pan feddiannwyd Ceredigion

ganddynt. Erbyn diwedd y 12fed ganrif, roedd castell cryfach o lawer, gyda thwr carreg cadarn, wedi codi yn ymwl y pentref presennol yn Ystrad Meurig.

Sut bynnag, yn nhermau archaeoleg a threftadaeth, y gem yng nghorон y gymuned yw safle abaty Sistersaidd Ystrad Fflur. Hanes hynod ddiddorol sydd i ddatblygiad yr abaty a'i ystadau eang o'r 12fed ganrif ymlaen, ac mae'n cynnwys cysylltiadau gyda nifer o gymeriadau hanesyddol o bwys mawr.

Sefydlwyd yr abaty gwreiddiol yn Ystrad Fflur gan y penarglwydd Normanaidd Robert fitz Stephen ym 1164. Cangen oedd Ystrad Fflur i Abaty Sistersaidd Hendygwyn ar Daf a byddai'r mynachod cyntaf wedi dod yma o'r Hendygwyn. Mae safle'r abaty cyntaf hwn i'w cael tua 3 cilomedr i'r de o'r abaty presennol, ar lan yr Afon Fflur. Saif Fferm yr Hen Abaty ar y safle heddiw.

Ym 1166, concwerwyd tiroedd y penarglwyddi Normanaidd yng Ngheredigion gan Rhys ap Gruffudd, Tywysog Deheubarth, a ddaeth i feddianu'r sir. Sefydlodd yr abaty newydd, ar y safle bresennol, ym 1184. Roedd Rhys ap Gruffudd a'i feibion yn noddwyr hael iawn i'r abaty a rhoddasant ystadau mawr o dir yng Ngheredigion, Powys a Sir Gaerfyrddin i'r mynachod yn ystod y 12fed a 13eg ganrifoedd. Cafodd yr abaty enw da fel canolfan ysgolheictod ac mae'n bosibl cafodd Brut y Tywysogion, sy'n cofnodi datblygiadau gwleidyddol a milwrol Cymru'r canoloesoedd. Ar hyd cyfnod o wrthdar o chwerw rhwng y Tywysogion Cymreig a'r Normaniaid, safodd Ystrad Fflur yn gadarn o blaid y Tywysogion, hyd yn oed pan fygythiodd y Brenin John ddinistrio'r abaty fel cosb ym 1212. Mae beddau rhai o deulu brenhinol Deheubarth, a gladdwyd yma yn ystod y 13eg ganrif, i'w gweld yn ymwl adfeilion yr abaty hyd heddiw.

Gyda'u rhoddion o diroedd eang gan y tywysogion, roedd gan y mynachod cyfrifoldeb am reoli nifer o ystadau mawrion, oedd yn cynhyrchu bwydydd, gwartheg, defaid a gwlan, yn ogystal â phlwm o fwyngloddiau'r abaty, y mwyaf ohonynt yng Nghwmystwyth. Mae cymuned Ystrad Fflur yn cynnwys ardal ystad gartrefol yr abaty, a ddaeth yn ffocws brysur o weithgarwch am sawl ganrif.

Un o elfennau pwysicaf economi'r ystadau oedd y ffermio bugeiliol a ddatblygwyd er mwyn cymryd mantais o'r porfeydd mynyddig eang yng nghanolbarth Ceredigion. Roedd y mynachod yn weithgar iawn mewn clirio a gwella ansawdd y tir, a roeddent yn arbenigo mewn bridio defaid. Roedd hafota yn rhan bwysig o'r dull o amaethu ar ystadau'r abaty. Symudwyd defaid a gwartheg i'r porfeydd mynyddig ar gyfer misoedd yr haf er mwyn rhyddhau'r tiroedd isel ar gyfer tyfu cnydau. Byddai'r bugeiliaid a'u teuluoedd yn treulio'r haf ar diroedd yr hafod i ofalu am yr anifeiliaid. Buasent yn godro ar yr hafod, gan gynhyrchu llaeth ac hefyd menyn, caws a chig i'w storio at ddefnydd y gymuned gyfan dros fis oedd y gaeaf, pan fyddai'r bobol i gyd yn dychwelyd i'r "hendrefi," y ffermydd ar y tir isel. Roedd gwlan hefyd yn gynnrych pwysig o'r system yma.

Mae dystiolaeth archaeolegol am yr hafod canoloesol i'w gael ar y mynyddoedd tua'r dwyrain, ar hyd cymoedd yr afonydd Egnant a Mwyro, mewn hen aneddleoedd fel Hafod Eidos (PRN 9328), Hafod Frith (PRN 9317) a Throedyrhiw (PRN 8611), lle mae llociau mawr hir-sgwâr wedi goroesi; Gorsafodd, o bosibl, lle byddai'r anifeiliaid yn cael eu crynhoi at ei gilydd yn ymwl y mynydd-dir. Ar ben hynny, mae nifer sylweddol o hen gytiau hir ar y mynyddoedd ac rhaid bod llawer ohonynt yn gytiau a ddefnyddid gan y bugeiliaid tra'n wyllo dros eu preiddiau ar y mynydd agored. Mewn cysylltiad â rhai o'r safleoedd hyn ceir ystordai cerrig bychain, wedi'u suddo i mewn i'r pridd, o bosibl ar gyfer storio bwydydd darfodus fel menyn a chaws. Gwelir strwythurau fel hyn yn Hafod Frith.

Roedd bridio defaid a chynhyrchu gwlân mor bwysig i abaty Ystrad Fflur, rhoddwyd trwydded arbennig i'r mynachod gan y Brenin John yn gynnar yn y 13eg ganrif i'w galluogi i allforio gwlân i'r cyfandir trwy Borthladd Caerfyrddin. Roedd rhwydwaith o ffyrdd yn cysylltu Ystrad Fflur gyda'r byd tu allan, ac un o'r pwysicaf oedd y ffordd i'r de, heibio Ystradffin, ar y ffin â Sir Gaerfyrddin, i ystad yr abaty yn Nantbai, Rhandirmwyn ac ymlaen i Gaerfyrddin. Wrth gwrs, roedd y cysylltiadau rhwng Ystrad Fflur a'r cyfandir wedi eu sefydlu llawer yn gynharach, pan ddaethpwyd â chalchfaen o'r Eidol ar gyfer adeiladu'r abaty trwy harbwr Aberarth, ar lannau Bae Ceredigion.

Roedd ffordd bwysig arall, a elwir weithiau "Ffordd y Mynachod" yn cysylltu Ffair Rhos, lle gynhalwyd ffeiriau gwartheg mawr o dan reolaeth yr abaty, draw i abaty Cwmhir ym Mhowys.

Daeth diwedd i hanes goleuedig yr abaty pan ddiddymwyd yr abatai gan Harri'r VIII. Gadawyd yr abaty yn segur a gwerthwyd yr adeiladau a thiroedd i berchnogion newydd. Sut bynnag, ychydig o flynyddoedd cyn hynny, daeth y teithiwr o Loegr, John Leland trwy'r ardal i ymweld â'r abaty ac mae ei ddisgrifiad o'r abaty a'r ffordd mynyddig rhwng Ystrad Fflur a'r gweithfeydd mwyn yng Nghwmystwyth yn rhoi y cipolwg cyntaf, hynod werthfawr, ar gymeriad y fro

Dywed traddodiad fod Dafydd ap Gwilym, bardd enwocaf Cymru'r canoloesoedd, oedd yn byw yn ystod y 14eg ganrif, wedi ei gladdu o dan ywen yn yr abaty, lle gwelir cofeb er cof amdano.

### Y Cyfnod Ôl-ganoloesol (1540 OC – 1900 OC)

#### *Diwydiant*

Yn annhebyg i'r cymunedau i'r gogledd, mae Ystrad Fflur wedi aros yn gymuned wledig yn bennaf ar hyd y ganrifoedd. Mae'r rhan fwyaf o'r gymuned yn gorwedd y tu allan i brif-ardal y mwyngloddiau ac felly ychydig iawn o olion diwydiannol sydd i'w cael yma. Dim ond ddau fwynglawdd cymharol fawr sydd yn y gymuned, sef Gwaith Abbey Consols neu Strata Florida (PRN 9310) a Gwaith Fairchance (PRN 9309), ond nid yw'r naill na'r llall yn cymharu yn nhermau ei lefelau cynhyrchu i'r mwyngloddiau mawr sydd ymhellach i'r gogledd ym mro'r mwynau.

Nid mwyngloddio oedd yr unig fath o ddiwydiant i gyrraedd y fro. Mae nifer o chwareli bach yn y fro lle cloddiwyd am gerrig adeiladu ers lawer dydd.

Mae'n bwysig iawn hefyd i gofio am bwysigrwydd torri mawn allan o Gors Caron yn y gorffennol, hyd at yr 20fed ganrif. Roedd mawn yn rhad ac hawdd i'w gael ac yn cael ei ddefnyddio'n helaeth yng nghanolbarth Ceredigion, lle mae coed Tân wedi bod yn adnodd brin ers talwm.

Mae yna felinau yd a gwlân wedi eu cofnodi yn lleol hefyd. Roedd melin yd yn Felin Fflur, ger Fferm yr Hen Abaty hyd at ganol yr 20fed ganrif (PRN 19420). Safai ffatri wlân y Wern (PRN 19682) ar ochr ogledol pentref Pontrhydfendigaid, a ffatri wlân arall ar gyrraedd y pentref, ar lan yr Afon Teifi. Roedd y ddau yn segur erbyn canol yr 20fed ganrif.

Gwasanaethwyd yr ardal gan rheilffordd y Milford & Manchester o ddiwedd y 19eg ganrif hyd at ail-hanner yr 20fed ganrif. Mae'n hen orsaf rheilffordd Ystrad Fflur (PRN 19669) yn sefyll y tu allan i ffiniau'r gymuned, yng nghymuned Ystrad Meurig, ond mae hen gwrs y lein i'w weld o hyd yn ymlwybro trwy ochr orllewinol y gymuned. Yn ddiau, roedd y rheilffordd wedi gwneud llawer i hybu masnach a datblygiad o fewn y gymunedau yr oedd yn ymweld â nhw ac efallai wedi sbarduno tyfiant pentrefi fel Pontrhydfendigaid.

### *Amaeth ac Anheddau Gwledig*

Ers canrifoedd, mae natur amaethyddiaeth y fro wedi cael ei nodweddu gan ffermydd a phentrefi bychain gwasgaredig a ffermio sydd wedi bod yn asgwrn gefn y fro ers cyfnodau cynnar. Yn ôl pob tebyg, roedd ffermydd yr ardal yn y cyfnod Ôl-ganoloesol yn symud eu creaduriaid i'r porfeydd mynyddig i'r dwyrain dros fisoedd yr haf, fel y gwnaethpwyd yn y cyfnod Canoloesol, am fod ychydig o dir ymylol neu fynydd-dir ar gael yma at y diben. Gwelodd y cyfnod Ôl-ganoloesol twf y lluestau - neu anheddau bugeilio parhaol ar y mynydd-diroedd – yn lle'r hen hafodydd.

Roedd nifer sylweddol o fythynnod tlawd yn y fro hefyd, cartrefi'r llafurwyr amaethyddol, torwyr mawn a mwynwyr. Yn wir, tua ddechrau'r 19eg ganrif, tynnwyd nifer o deithwyr i'r fro sylw at y tlodi dychrynllyd a ddioddefwyd gan y tlotaf yn y gymuned leol.

Mae'r patrwm anheddu modern yn dal i fod yn un o anheddau gwasgaredig ar y cyfan, gydag ond ychydig o bentrefi wedi datblygu dros y 200 mlynedd diwethaf. Nid yw Pontrhydfendigaid yn ymddangos ar fap Saxton o Geredigion, 1578, er bod Ffair Rhos ac Ystrad Fflur ill dau yn ymddangos arno. Tra bo'r ddau bentref ddiwethaf wedi colli poblogaeth ers hynny i bob tebyg, mae'n amlwg fod Pontrhydfendigaid wedi datblygu i fod yn bentref gymharol fawr erbyn dechrau'r 19eg ganrif, fel y mae mapiau cynnar yr Ordnance Survey yn dangos. Roedd wedi tyfu yn ystod y 18fed a 19eg ganrifoedd, i gynnwys Eglwys Dewi Sant, dau gapel, tafarndai, melinau gwlan ac yd ac o leiaf ddwy efail. Mae Pontrhydfendigaid, yn bennaf, yn ganlyniad i ddatblygiadau cymdeithasol ac economaidd y cyfnod Ôl-ddiwydiannol.

### *Yr ystadau mawrion*

Rhwng y 16eg a'r 20fed ganrifoedd, roedd nifer o ystadau mawrion yn berchen ar y rhan fwyaf o'r tir yn yr ardal. Tyfodd rhai o'r rhain allan o ystadau Abaty Ystrad Fflur. Pan ddiddymwyd yr Abatai yn ystod y 1530au gan y Brenin Harri VIII, dechreuwyd y broses o rannu tiroedd eang a gweddol gyfoethog Ystrad Fflur a'u gwerthu i mewn i ddwylo preifat. Mae enwau ystadau'r Hafod, Nanteos, Trawsgoed a Gogerddan yn hanfodol i astudiaeth o hanes canolbarth Ceredigion.

Aeth tiroedd eraill yr abaty yn y fro i Iarll Essex, ac yna ym 1630 i Ystad Trawsgoed (Crosswood), un o ystadau pwysicaf y sir, a'r pwysicaf mewn perthynas â chymuned Ystrad Meurig. Gwelir y cysylltiad yn enw mwynglawdd Fairchance, oedd hefyd yn cael ei adnabod fel Gwaith De Lisburne.

### *Addysg*

Mae yna ysgol bentrefol Fictorianaid ym Mhentreuchaf, Pontrhydfendigaid, sy'n dal i fod ar agor. Roedd ysgol eglwysig wedi arfer cael ei gynnal mewn ysgoldy ger abaty Ystrad Fflur (canolfan ymwelwyr yr abaty bellach). Pan ddaeth comisiynwyr arolwg y Llyfrau Gleision i'r fro ym 1847, disgrifiwyd ysgol gyda'r enw rhyfedd y "Strata Florida Adventure Day School" ganddynt, yr unig ysgol oedd yn gwasanaethu'r ardal pryd hynny, a safai rhwng Pontrhydfendigaid a'r abaty.

### *Anghydffurfiaeth*

Y Methodistiaid Calfinaidd oedd yr enwad cryfaf yn y fro, ac mae dri chapel Methodistaidd o fewn y gymuned, gyda dau ohonynt yn dal i gael eu defnyddio yn 1998. Capel Rhydfendigaid (PRN

5557), Pontrhydfendigaid yw'r mwyaf a'r hynaf, yn dyddio i 1794. Saif Carmel, Capel y Bedyddwyr (PRN 19680) ym mhentref Pontrhydfendigaid hefyd. Enillodd y Bedyddwyr rhywfaint o dir yn yr ardal yn gynnar yn y 19eg ganrif ac mae hwn yn un o'u capeli prin yng nghanolbarth Ceredigion. Y Parch. WJ Gruffydd yw gweinidog presennol Carmel, bardd nodedig sydd hefyd yn gyn-Archderwydd yr Eisteddfod Genedlaethol.

### *Corff Cors Goch*

Ym 1811, tra'n gweithio ar Gors Caron, daeth torwyr mawn ar draws corff dyn, heb ei ben, wedi claddu rhyw 3 metr i lawr yn y gors. Aed â'r gorff i fynwent Ystrad Meurig i'w hail-gladdu. Ni wyddys beth oedd oed y gorff ond, o ystyried y dyfnder a'r modd roedd yr olion wedi cael eu cadw mewn cyflwr da yn y mawnog, mae'n lled gredadwy i awgrymu mai olion dyn canoloesol ydoedd, neu hyd yn oed dyn o'r Oes Haearn neu Oes yr Efydd. Mae cryn nifer o gyrff o gyfnodau cynhanesyddol wedi eu darganfod mewn corsydd ar draws Ewrop, fel yr enghreifftiau enwog o Ddenmarc, lle daethpwyd o hyd i gyrff a'i pennau wedi torri ymaith a'i ddwylo wedi clymu – claddedigaethau defodol o bosibl – yn dyddio i Oes yr Haearn.

## Prif themâu

Yn fras, dyma rhestr o'r brif themâu hanesyddol y gellir eu hadnabod yn seiliedig ar y gwybodaeth sy'n cael ei gynnwys yn y Cofnod Safleoedd a Henebion:

1. Mae adfeilion abaty Ystrad Fflur eisoes wedi cael eu dehongli ar gyfer ymwelwyr, ond mae'r dirwedd o gwmpas yr abaty yn cynnwys amrywiaeth da o safleoedd archaeolegol o berthynas i'w hanes a datblygiad a dylid edrych ar ffyrdd i esbonio'r cysylltiad y fro yn ei gyfanrwydd â'r abaty yn hytrach na rhoi mwy o bwyslais ar yr adfeilion. Meddylir yn enwedig am y llwybrau allan o'r abaty sy'n dwyn cerddwyr i mewn i dirweddau hanesyddol a hardd y cymoedd i'r dwyrain ac i fyny i lynnoedd Teifi.
2. Dafydd ap Gwilym. Mae'r ffaith fod un o feirdd enwocaf Cymru wedi claddu yn Ystrad Fflur yn sicr yn thema o bwys mawr.
3. Pentref Pontrhydfendigaid. Byddai dehongliad o hanes y pentref hwn yn thema diddorol ar gyfer ymwelwyr i'r fro.
4. Cors Caron. Mae hanes y gors yn thema o bwys, yn enwedig mewn cysylltiad â'r traddodiad o dorri mawn a'r hanes am gorff y gors.
5. Penybannau. Mae'r bryngaer yma yn golygfa gwych sydd o fewn cyrraedd cerddwyr ac efallai yn deilwng o sylw fel man i ymweld ag ef.

## Part 1: History and archaeology

### Mesolithic (10,000BC – 4000BC)

During this distant period, it is thought that human communities periodically used the natural forests of this mountainous area as hunting grounds. The people of the time were hunter-gatherers and therefore moved from place to place rather than staying in settled communities.

As they didn't build permanent houses, or bury their dead in graves that we can recognise today, it is difficult to find sites associated with Mesolithic peoples. Often, the only evidence that we can recognise are the flint scatters derived from tool making activities, which denote the sites where groups of hunters would stay for a time, as well as flint tools that were lost or discarded.

Very few sites of relevance are known at present in this area, indeed there are none yet known within Ystrad Fflur community. Two flint scatters have been found to the north, at Nantymoch, Blaenrheidal (now beneath the waters of the reservoir), and a single flint mace-head has been found near The Arch, in Pontarfynach community.

### Neolithic (4,000BC – 2500BC)

The Neolithic was the age of the first farmers in the country and it is possible that the process of farming the land began locally during this period.

There are records of one possible monument and one findspot located within the community that are thought to date to the Neolithic. In 1929, Iorwerth Peate described a long barrow, which he believed to be Neolithic in date, but this has not yet been confirmed. In 1951, a record was made of a Neolithic stone axe being found locally, but the exact findspot and the present location of the axe are not known to us.

These two sites alone do not permit us to say much about the extent of human activity in the area during this period, but the archaeology of the wider district shows clearly that there was a settled community here during the Bronze Age, the origins of which may well lie in the Neolithic period.

### Bronze Age (2500BC – 800BC)

The landscape of Ystrad Fflur community, especially the mountains to the east, is dotted with a significant number of Bronze Age burial mounds. As well as these cairns, there are a number of possible standing stones in the community, although they are all small examples. The name of Banc Carreg Bica (Bank of the Pointed Stone – PRN 9044) strongly suggested that a standing stone was once located there, although the stone itself appears to have been lost.

Cairns and standing stones have been shown to be associated with cremation burials, with the ashes of the dead often buried in earthenware urns. There are two cairns in the community which have been excavated by archaeologists in the past. The cremation burial of a child was found at Crug Cynon (PRN 8419) in 1928 and burial urn and bones have been found at a cairn on Garn Gron (PRN 5565). As a group, these sites form an exceptionally important collection of ritual monuments. There are seven cairns and a standing stone in the community which are protected as Scheduled Ancient Monuments, recognising their national importance.

Although we can identify some of the sites where Bronze Age people buried their dead, there is an absence of evidence at present for the settlements in which the population lived. A prehistoric site type absent from this community but found in neighbouring areas, and usually attributed to the Bronze Age, is the “burnt mound.” These piles of burnt stone are thought to be cooking places, or alternatively the sites of ancient sweat-lodges, but we do not understand how they may have related to community life in what was a society characterised by a settled, farming population.

Local discoveries of stone axes also help bring us closer in touch with the people of the period. A good example of such a tool has been found locally at Bwlchydwyallt (PRN 12199). The axe is now kept at the National Museum of Wales, Cardiff.

The little we know is enough to tell us that settled communities existed in this area some 3,500 years ago. Unfortunately, it hasn’t yet been possible to identify evidence of Bronze Age settlements locally and much more work will be needed in future before we will be able to properly understand the nature of the communities that existed in the area during this period.

### **Iron Age (800BC – 43AD)**

This period is noted for the defensive hillforts, which were built to defend people and property in a society characterised by warrior chieftains and warbands. A strong hillfort, in good condition, still stands on Penybannau (PRN 2040), a short distance to the east of Pontrhydfendigaid village. This hillfort is a Scheduled Ancient Monument, characterised by strong defences around its entrance. Within the defensive banks, the possible sites of a number of round houses can still be seen.

Such defensive sites were of good construction and have usually survived the ravages of the past 2,000 years. What has been lost from the period is evidence of the homes of the common people who lived outside the hillforts. It is likely that the majority were engaged in farming the land, living in scattered houses and huts, perhaps escaping to the forts at times of war or when attacked by other tribes – there is no doubt that life could be dangerous at times for the inhabitants of the area.

The presence of hillforts does indicate that farming and permanent settlement was present in the Ystrad Fflur district during this period, as well as the exploitation of local woods and mountain pastures to sustain the population. Indeed, it is possible that the long tradition of shepherding and keeping a hafod has its roots in this distant period.

### **The Roman Period (43AD – 410AD)**

We know very little about the area during the Roman period (1st century AD – 5th century AD). Life in a rural area such as Ystrad Fflur may have proceeded peacefully throughout the Roman period, although there must have been considerable cultural and economic influences from the Roman world during nearly 400 years of contact. It is known, for instance, that the old hillforts fell out of use across Wales after the Roman conquest.

We know that the Romans were present in adjacent districts, as there are Roman forts at Crosswood, to the north, Cae'r Gaer to the northeast (Llangurig parish, Powys) and Llanio, to the south. We know also of the Roman road running from Pumsaint, Carmarthenshire, through mid-Ceredigion and northwards to Machynlleth. It is possible that the metal ores of Central Ceredigion were an attraction for the Romans.

There are records of a find of Roman coins at Ystrad Fflur, described during the 1920s. A bronze bowl was dug up near the abbey, which contained 16 coins dating to the second half of the 3<sup>rd</sup> century AD. They include coinage of the Emperors Gallienus (253 – 268 AD) and Claudius Gothicus (268 – 270 AD), three of the emperors of Gaul and Britain, Victorinus (269 – 271 AD), Tetricus I (271 – 273 AD), Tetricus II (273 – 274 AD), and Carausius, emperor of Britain (286 – 293 AD). It is not known how the coins came to be at Ystrad Fflur, but they may well be direct evidence of the Roman influence in the area during the 3<sup>rd</sup> century AD.

### *The Dark Ages or “The Age of the Saints” (410AD – 1092AD)*

According to tradition, Ceredigion is named after Ceredig son of Cunedda, a Welsh prince who came from North Britain to defend the west coast from Irish incursions. Tradition also has it that St David, the patron saint of Wales, was the grandson of Ceredig.

Also in Welsh tradition, this period in history is often referred to as “The Age of the Saints,” rather than the Dark Ages, because of the growth of the early church by the efforts of numerous Celtic saints. It is seen as an age of enlightenment, rather than a dark age, in Wales by many historians.

Despite such traditions being known to us, we know very little about the society of the time in this district during this period. Nevertheless, there is clear evidence of the activities of the early church in the Ystrad Fflur area. There is a single inscribed stone, which now stands outside the eastern wall of St Marys Church, Ystrad Fflur. A cross is cut into the stone, which has been dated by some to the period of the 7<sup>th</sup> – 9<sup>th</sup> centuries AD and by others to the 10<sup>th</sup> – 11<sup>th</sup> centuries. The presence of the stone suggests that an early church may have stood in the area, perhaps close to the site of the present church.

It is possible that some churches in the adjacent areas are ancient, with their origins in this period. In particular, we think of the ancient church of Llanddewi Brefi, to the south, which is associated with St David. There are also three Early Christian stones at Llantrisant church, Pontarfynach with crosses carved onto them. These date to the period c. 600 AD to 1100 AD and are proof of early ecclesiastical activity in the district. In Ystrad Meurig community, to the west, there is an inscribed stone at Llanwnnws church, which bears an interesting Latin inscription in memory of Hiroildil son of Carotinn and dates to the 9<sup>th</sup> century AD.

### *The Medieval Period (1092AD – 1540AD)*

During this period, we see Ceredigion developing as one of the most important regions in Wales. It was conquered by the Normans in 1093 and thereafter followed a period of uncertainty, with the Welsh and Normans fighting for supremacy for nearly 200 years. During the second half of the 12<sup>th</sup> century, Ceredigion became an integral part of the kingdom of Deheubarth, led by Rhys ap Gruffudd, The Lord Rhys of Dinefwr. Following his death, there was further warfare between his sons and Llywelyn Fawr of Gwynedd. Ceredigion was also affected by the wars of the later 13<sup>th</sup> century, when Wales was finally conquered upon the fall of Llywelyn ap Gruffudd.

Ystrad Fflur possesses some very important sites associated with this key period in the development of the nation. A motte and bailey castle stands on the banks of the Afon Meurig, a few metres from the boundary with Ystrad Meurig community. This is probably a castle built at by the Normans early in the 12<sup>th</sup> century when they first occupied Ceredigion. By the end of the 12<sup>th</sup> century, a much stronger castle, with a strong stone keep, had been built at the edge of the present village of Ystrad Meurig.

However, in terms of archaeology and heritage, the jewel in the crown of the community is undoubtedly the site of the medieval Cistercian abbey of Strata Florida or Ystrad Fflur. The development of the abbey and its extensive granges from the 12th century onwards is a fascinating story, which brings the district into contact with several historical figures of great importance.

The first abbey of Strata Florida was founded by the Norman Robert fitz Stephen in 1164. It was a daughter house of the Cistercian abbey at Whitland, and the first monks would have come to Strata Florida from Whitland. The first abbey stood 3km southwest of the present site, on the banks of the Afon Fflur. Old Abbey Farm, Pontrhydfendigaid now marks the site.

In 1166, Rhys ap Gruffudd, Prince of Deheubarth, conquered the Norman lordship in Ceredigion and seized control of the area. He founded the new abbey, at its present site, in 1184. Rhys ap Gruffudd and his sons were generous benefactors to the abbey and gifted large land estates in Ceredigion, Powys and Carmartheshire to the monks during the 12th and 13th centuries. The abbey gained a reputation as a centre of scholarship and it is possible that the Chronicle of the Princes (*Brut y Tywysogion*), which details the political and military events of medieval Wales, was compiled here. Throughout the period of often bitter conflict between the Welsh princes and the Normans, Strata Florida remained staunchly loyal to the princes, even when threatened with destruction as punishment by King John in 1212. The graves of members of the royal family of Deheubarth, buried here during the 13th century, can still be seen outside the abbey ruins.

Gifted extensive landholdings by the princes, the monks were responsible for managing several large granges, which produced foodstuff, cattle and sheep, wool and lead from the abbey's mines, the largest of which was at Cwmystwyth. Ystrad Fflur community includes the area of the home grange of the abbey, which became the busy focus of activity for several centuries.

One of the most important elements in the grange economy was the pastoral farming that developed to exploit the large area of mountain pasture in central Ceredigion. The monks were active in clearing and improving land, and specialised in sheep rearing. Transhumance was an important aspect of the farming regime. Sheep and cattle were moved onto the upland pastures during the summer months to free up the lowlands for crop production. Herdsman and their families would spend the summer on the "hafod" (summer-place) lands and ensure that stock animals were well looked after. Milking would have been carried out at the hafod, producing milk, as well as butter, cheese and meat, which could be stored for the use of the community during the winter months, when the population returned with the animals to the "hendrefi" or homesteads on lower ground. Wool was also an important product of this system.

The archaeological evidence for the medieval hafodydd is found on the hills to the east of the abbey, along the valleys of the Egnant and Mwyro streams at deserted settlement sites such as Hafod Eidos, Hafod Frith (PRN 9317) and Troedyrhiw, where large, rectangular corral-like enclosures survive, probable gathering stations for bringing animals together on the fringes of the mountain pasture. There are also numerous small long huts, many of which must have been the summer shelters of the herdsman watching the animals on the higher pasture. Some of these are associated with stone-lined cool-stores, sunk into the ground surface, presumably to store perishable foods such as butter and cheese. Such features can be found at Hafod Frith.

Such was the importance of sheep breeding and wool production to Strata Florida that a special licence was granted by King John in the early 13<sup>th</sup> century, allowing Strata Florida to export wool to the Continent via the Port of Carmarthen. There was a network of roads that connected the abbey and its granges with the outside world, one of the most important being that south, past Ystradffin on the Carmarthenshire border, to the grange of Nantbai, Rhandirmwyn and on to

Carmarthen. The links between Strata Florida and the Continent had been established much earlier, of course, with Italian limestone being brought in to build parts of the abbey via the port of Aberarth, on the Cardigan Bay coast.

Another important communications route, known as “Monks Trod”, ran from Ffair Rhos, where important medieval cattle fairs were held under the control of the abbey, across to Cwmhir abbey in Powys.

The abbey's illustrious history came to an end with the Dissolution of the Monasteries by Henry VIII, when the buildings were abandoned and sold off to new owners. However, a few years before the closure came, the English traveller John Leland visited the abbey and his written description of the abbey, the mountain track from Ystrad Fflur to Cwmystwyth and the lead mines there, remain our first fascinating insight into the landscape of the area.

Tradition has it that Dafydd ap Gwilym, the greatest poet of medieval Wales, who lived during the 14th century, was buried under a yew tree at the abbey, where a memorial slab commemorating him stands.

### **Post-medieval (1540AD – 1900AD)**

#### *Industry*

Unlike neighbouring communities to the north, Ystrad Fflur has always been a predominantly rural community. Most of the community area lies outside the main Ceredigion mining district, therefore there are very few metal mines within its boundaries. Only two relatively significant lead mines lay within the community, namely the Abbey Consols or Strata Florida mine (PRN 9310) and the Fairchance Mine (PRN 9309), but neither compare in output levels to the great mines further north in the ore field.

Mining wasn't the only local industry. Several small quarries are recorded in the community also, excavated in the past to provide building stone for the area.

It is also important to remember the significance of peat cutting on Cors Caron to the local community until the early 20<sup>th</sup> century. Peat was a cheap and plentiful fuel source much used in Central Ceredigion, where wood has long been in short supply.

There are corn and woollen mills recorded locally also. There was a corn mill at Felin Fflur, near Old Abbey Farm until the mid-20<sup>th</sup> century (PRN19420). The Wern woollen factory (PRN 19682) stood at the northern edge of Pontrhydfendigaid village and another, unnamed, woollen factory was located on the banks of the Teifi, south of the village. Both became disused by the mid-20<sup>th</sup> century.

The area was served by the Milford and Manchester Railway during the late 19<sup>th</sup> and for most of the 20<sup>th</sup> centuries. The old Strata Florida railway station lies outside the modern community in neighbouring Ystrad Meurig, but the old track bed skirts within the western boundary of Ystrad Fflur. This railway undoubtedly did much to encourage trade and development in the communities through which it passed and may have given a new lease of life to villages such as Pontrhydfendigaid.

### *Farming and Rural Settlement*

For centuries, the local landscape has been characterised by scattered farms and small hamlets and farming has been one of the mainstays of the area since early times. As in medieval times, the farms of the community are likely to have moved stock to the mountains to the east for summer grazing as limited areas of marginal or mountain land have been available for summer pasture within the farmed landscape. The post-medieval period saw the rise of the lluest – permanent shepherding cottages on the mountain pastures – in place of the old communal hafodydd.

There were also a large number of poor cottages in the area, the abodes of the landless labourers and peat cutters. Indeed, many commentators of the early 19<sup>th</sup> century noted the grinding poverty suffered by many of the poorest people in local society.

The modern settlement pattern is still one of scattered dwellings, with only a few small villages having developed during the last 200 years. Pontrhydfendigaid does not appear on Saxtons Map of Ceredigion of 1578, although Ffair Rhos and Ystrad Fflur are both marked. Whereas there has been a loss of population from the latter settlements since then, Pontrhydfendigaid has clearly developed and had become a relatively large village by the early 19<sup>th</sup> century, as shown on early Ordnance Survey maps. It expanded during the 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> century, acquiring St Davids Church, two chapels, inns, woollen mills and smithies and is very much a product of post-medieval social and economic developments.

### *The Great Estates*

Between the 16<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> centuries, a number of large estates owned most of the land the district. Many of these grew out of the estates of Strata Florida Abbey. With the Dissolution of the Abbeys under Henry VIII during the 1530s, the process of breaking up Strata Florida's extensive and fairly wealthy estates and selling them into private ownership began. The names of estates such as Hafod, Nanteos, Crosswood and Gogerddan are fundamental to the study of the history of central Ceredigion.

Many of the abbey lands in the area went to the Earl of Essex, and from 1630 to the Lords of Lisburne's Crosswood estate, one of the most important in the county, and the most important estate in relation to Ystrad Fflur community. This can be seen in the mining interests of the estate in the area – the Fairchance mine was also known as the Lisburne Mine.

### *Education*

There is a late Victorian village school at Pentreuchaf, Pontrhydfendigaid, which remains open. Formerly there was a church school at Ystrad Fflur abbey (now the abbey's visitor centre). When the commissioners undertaking the infamous "Blue Book" survey of Welsh schools visited the area in 1847, they described the remarkably named Strata Florida Adventure Day School, the only school serving the area, which was located on the road between Pontrhydfendigaid and the abbey.

### *Nonconformism*

The Calvinistic Methodists were the strongest denomination in the area in the past, and there are three Methodist chapels in the community, two of which were still in use in 1998. Capel Rhydfendigaid (PRN 5557), Pontrhydfendigaid is the largest and oldest, dating to 1794. Carmel

Baptist chapel (PRN 19680) also stands in Pontrhydfendigaid village. The Baptists gained a foothold in the district in the early 19<sup>th</sup> century and only a few of their chapels are found in the district. The Rev. WJ Gruffydd is the present minister, a renowned poet and former Archdruid of the National Eisteddfod.

### *The Bog Man*

In 1811, peat cutters working on Cors Caron uncovered the headless body of a man, buried 3 metres down in the bog. The body was taken to Ystrad Meurig churchyard for reburial. It is not known how old the body was, but the depth at which it was found and the state of its preservation, tanned by the peat in the bog, make it credible to suggest that it was at least of Medieval date, and possibly even of Iron Age or Bronze Age date. Prehistoric bodies are not uncommon finds in European peat bogs, such as the famous examples of possible ritual burials from Denmark, dated to the Iron Age, where decapitated and bound corpses have been found.

## Main themes

In outline, this list presents the main historical themes that can be identified from the information held within the Sites and Monuments Record.

1. The ruins of Strata Florida Abbey are already interpreted for visitors, but the landscape around the abbey contains a remarkable range of archaeological remains of relevance to its history and development and consideration should be given to methods of explaining the relationship of the wider area to the abbey, rather than putting more emphasis on the ruins themselves. This is especially the case with the trackways that run away from the abbey into the historic and attractive landscape of the valleys to the east and towards the Teifi lakes.
2. Dafydd ap Gwilym. The fact that one of Wales' most important and famous poets is buried at Strata Florida abbey is certainly a theme of great importance.
3. Pontrhydfendigaid village. Interpretation of the history of this village would be an interesting theme for visitors to the area.
4. Cors Caron. The history of the bog is an important theme, especially in connection with the tradition of peat cutting and the story of the bog body found there in 1811.
5. Penybannau. This hillfort is an outstanding viewpoint, which is within reach of walkers and perhaps deserving of promotion as a place worthy of visiting.






