1. Introduction

The Dyfed Archaeological Trust has been involved with the pan-Wales Deserted Rural Settlements Project since 1996-7. Four successive years of fieldwork and desktop research were carried out by the Trust between 1996 and 2001 and in total some 900 Deserted Rural Settlements were visited and assessed. However, this survey was confined to 23 specific survey areas across all three counties. In order to determine the number of DRS sites elsewhere in the region, the work during 2001-2 focused on a desk-based review of all the potential DRS sites recorded on the regional Sites and Monuments Record. In particular, it was recognised that many potential DRS sites had been entered into the SMR under misleading or inappropriate site-type descriptions. In total over 8300 records were reviewed and amendments made to attempt to correct and standardise site-type descriptions.

The 2001-2 project made it possible for DAT, for the first time, to quantify the extent of the DRS resource across the region. Importantly, it also allowed for the identification of all relevant sites that had not been included in the earlier Deserted Rural Settlements Project surveys. Over 600 such sites were identified and a two-year project was proposed to ensure that this group could be examined through fieldwork and desktop assessment.

In 2002-3, the process of assessing these sites began, focusing on those in Ceredigion and North Pembrokeshire. The findings of that work were presented to Cadw in April 2003. This report deals with the second year of the concluding project, presenting the findings of fieldwork and desktop assessment undertaken during 2003-4, looking at sites located in Carmarthenshire and South Pembrokeshire.

1.1 Site Selection & Study Areas (see Map 1)

The earlier DRS survey work in southwest Wales had used a broad definition of the term 'Deserted Rural Settlement' and the 900 sites visited and assessed included deserted sites recorded as 'Cottage' or 'Farmstead' and ancillary structures such as 'Shelter' and 'Sunken Shelter'. However, for the 2001-2 stage of the project, and subsequent stages, the use of a narrower definition of site types, that focused on only those site types described as 'Deserted Rural Settlement', 'Longhouse', 'Long Hut' and 'Platform', allowed a closer comparison with the site types visited and assessed as part of the Deserted Rural Settlements Project by the other Welsh Archaeological Trusts.

The 2000-1 project identified a total of 1085 sites in the regional SMR that were described as certain or possible 'Deserted Rural Settlement', 'Longhouse', 'Long Hut' and 'Platform'. 317 of these had been previously assessed by Cambria as part of the Deserted Rural Settlement Project. 668 of these sites had not been included in these earlier surveys.

This group of 668 sites was broken down into three categories:

- 243 sites were identified as being located in Ceredigion and North Pembrokeshire, to be assessed during 2002-3
- 316 were identified as being located in Carmarthenshire and South Pembrokeshire, to be assessed during 2003-4
- A further 109 sites across the whole region were known to have been recently visited by other recent
 field projects and it was felt that sufficient in-house knowledge was available to make another field
 visit unnecessary and that the records of these 109 sites could be rapidly enhanced to conform to the
 DRS project standards as a desk-based exercise, to be undertaken during 2002-3

These figures have been amended subsequently as the SMR is a dynamic record that changes from day to day. Thus, when project work began in the 2002-3, a total of 348 sites were identified for assessment within Ceredigion and North Pembrokeshire, including the 109 sites that had been subject to recent field assessment.

For Carmarthenshire and South Pembrokeshire, the area covered in 2003-4, the total of 316 sites was subsequently revised to 313 sites when a software error was identified as having created an extra site and it was found that two Ceredigion sites had been erroneously located in Carmarthenshire.





2. Site visits

The need to reassess the 668 sites identified in 1.1 above arose due to a lack of reliable or recent information about their condition and character. Deserted Rural Settlement Project work between 1995 and 2000 had shown that many existing records were inaccurate, with sites often recorded under the wrong site type. There was also a lack of detail of the condition and landscape context of previously recorded sites that needed attention. It was also important that information was recorded regarding threats to the continued survival of sites, or that, where appropriate, sites were identified for consideration for statutory protection as Scheduled Ancient Monuments.

To meet these objectives, re-assessment of each of the 313 sites, including a fresh desktop appraisal or rapid field visit, was undertaken during 2003-4. During the autumn and winter of 2003-4, a two-person team undertook field visits to all sites located in upland or marginal land contexts, whilst a single field worker visited those sites located on enclosed farmland.

Site specific, proforma record sheets were used in the field, which were based on the structure of the SMR database and included all relevant information held by the SMR for each site. These record sheets now form an important part of the project archive. Their use greatly enhanced the ability of the fieldworkers to make an accurate and rapid assessment of each site.

2.1 Unassessed sites

Not all of the sites identified as requiring a visit were reached by the project and these fall into two categories:

2.1.1 Discounted sites

Of the 313 sites included in the assessment, a preliminary desktop assessment of these sites made it possible to identify 112 sites within this group that could be excluded from the field assessment by virtue of the fact that they were demonstrably not deserted settlement sites as defined by the narrow definition adopted by the 2001-2 project, for the following reasons;

- Sites that remained in use as dwellings or for some other purpose and are therefore not deserted settlements (such as "Longhouses" that remain in use as farmhouses or farm buildings where the condition was A, B or R Occupied, Modernised or Restored)
- Sites for which desktop assessment made it necessary to amend their site types to terms that placed them outside the remit of the Deserted Rural Settlement Project (e.g. "Cottage" or "Farmstead")
 Sites that could be shown as being mid-19th century or later in origin (based on tithe and Ordnance
- Sites that could be shown as being mid-19" century or later in origin (based on tithe and Ordnance Survey evidence) and therefore categorised as "Cottage", "Dwelling" or "Farmhouse" and also placed outside the remit of the Deserted Rural Settlement Project

Tables 3 and 4 below allow for comparison of the site types used before and after the assessment had been undertaken.

2.2 Visited sites

201 sites recorded as Deserted Rural Settlements, Long Huts, Longhouses and Platforms were visited by project staff during 2003-4. 112 sites were subject to a desktop reassessment. These sites are discussed in more detail in 3.1 below and shown in Maps 5, 6, 7 and 8. They are also listed in Table 5.

2.2.1 Unlocated sites

It should be noted that 23 of the 201 sites visited (11.5%) were not reassessed due to a failure to locate the recorded feature (which may have been caused either by errors in the original grid reference co-ordinates or the destruction of features since the original record was made.) These sites are listed in Table 3 and shown on Map 4. Many of the sites not located in the uplands are suspected as having been given inaccurate grid-reference numbers in the past as their records date to a time before GPS was available to upland fieldworkers.

2.2.2 New Sites

During 2003-4, 37 new sites were recorded during fieldwork. These include a range of settlement related structures that encompass both presumed dwellings (such as longhouses and longhuts) and also ancillary features (shelters, sunken shelters etc, sheep folds etc). An indication of their distribution can be seen on Map 1 above and they are included both in the Site Type list in Table 4 and also in the Site Gazetteer in Appendix 2.

3. Site types

As suggested in 1.1 above, a major concern throughout the project was to ensure that deserted settlements are recorded with the use of the appropriate site type terminology, conforming to the current Extended National Database glossary. Much of the reassessment of known sites carried out in the 2001-2 Deserted Rural Settlement Project involved correcting errors in terminology.

Table 3 lists the site types used in the regional SMR to describe the 313 sites assessed during 2003-4. From this table, it can be seen that for many sites there was uncertainty regarding their true character. The application of the term Deserted Rural Settlement to these sites was largely the result of the 2001-2 desktop assessment of all records. Where a written description was suggestive of a site being a possible settlement site, the site type "Deserted Rural Settlement" or "Deserted Rural Settlement?" was used, sometimes in conjunction with the extant site type description (i.e. Deserted Rural Settlement; Cottage?").

The value of reassessing these sites, either through field visits or the examination of previously existing descriptions, can be seen by comparing Table 3 and Table 4. The latter shows the significant amendments to the record that were made as a result of this project (and also includes the 37 new sites recorded during 2003-4).

Even field assessment does not remove doubt as to the true nature of all sites. The observation of surface features alone can sometimes make accurate classification very difficult, particularly at denuded sites, for which sub-surface archaeology alone may hold clues as to their true purpose. Thus, the identification of 5 visited sites as LONG HUT?;SHEEP FOLD? reflects genuine uncertainty in the interpretation of a site's surface remains.

3.1 Distribution of sites by type



3.1.1 Map 3: Deserted Rural Settlements

Map 3 shows sites recorded as Deserted Rural Settlements. The term is occasionally applied to features that are believed to be settlement sites but for which insufficient information is available to allow for a precise description of the site type to be made. However, these sites are mostly complexes of well-defined settlement-related features. It is important that, where possible, the relationship between features recorded in the field is reflected within the SMR. An example of this would be a site where a platform, shelter and fold are found in close association and reasonably interpreted as being contemporary and associated features. Each of these features would be allocated a unique record number, but the whole complex will also be recorded as a DRS and allocated its own unique record number. This causes some unavoidable duplication of records within the SMR.


In 2003-4, the desktop assessment saw the recategorisation of many sites previously recorded as Deserted Rural Settlements. It was possible to show that sites recorded as possible Deserted Rural Settlements in previous years were in fact better described by terms such as cottages, mansions, farmsteads and dwellings and were accordingly amended (these sites are included in the Site Gazetteer in Appendix 2 of this report.

In terms of distribution, it is of course important to stress that the term is purely reflective of area in which Deserted Rural Settlement project work has been undertaken in recent years. Map 3 shows that the use of the term Deserted Rural Settlement in the study area is mostly confined to the uplands. It is likely that some similar sites in the lowlands may be recorded as farmsteads, but the combination of longhouses, long huts, platforms, shelters and folds that characterise many Deserted Rural Settlement sites are themselves generally only encountered in upland or marginal contexts.



3.1.2 Map 4: Long Huts


Map 4 shows that the distribution of long huts, numerically the most important site type encountered by the project, is also clearly concentrated into upland areas. It may be that this reflects the tendency to use long hut as a term to describe ruined sites that would usually be described as cottages in a lowland context. Surface evidence alone suggests that this may be the case, but archaeological excavation could help differentiate between upland and lowland sites that appear, superficially at least, to share many similar characteristics. It is however not certain that all long huts served as dwellings. Some may well have been ancillary buildings within settlement complexes.



3.1.3 Map 5: Longhouses

Map 5 shows a similar pattern for the distribution for long houses to that of long huts. However, it is noticeable that the occurrence of longhouses is markedly less frequent.


It is likely that this distribution shows that traditional longhouses in the lowland areas of the region remain occupied or in use as farm buildings and therefore do not fall into the classification of "Deserted Rural Settlements."



3.1.4 Map 6: Platforms

Map 6 shows a wider distribution of platform sites, although these too are predominantly found in upland contexts. Again, this is felt to reflect the influence of previous work having been concentrated in upland areas.

On the basis of surface evidence, a platform is a platform, regardless of its purpose. Some platforms may have been the sites of timber houses, others of timber buildings that had non-settlement purposes. Other platforms in upland and marginal contexts may well have been the sites of peat stacks or hayricks, or even ancillary timber huts and pens. The archaeological excavation of a number of platforms in varying contexts and of varying dimensions is needed to throw light on such issues.



4. Site analysis

The enhancement of the SMR record for Deserted Rural Settlement sites included the gathering of information regarding the landscape context and condition of each site, in the hope that more informed comment could be made about their purpose and also assist in their future management.

The following tables reflect the information now recorded in the SMR with regard to the condition of, and threats to, the DRS resource studied in 2003-4, as well as the landscape context of each site.

4.1 Condition

Table 6 records the condition of the 201 DRS sites visited by project staff. The following definitions are currently used by Cambria:

- A Intact
- B Largely intact
- C Ruined
- D Ephemeral
- E Destroyed
- F Renovated (recently introduced and not applied to this project)
- R Restored
- V Varying condition (applied to complex sites with component features in varying states of preservation
- U Unknown (those sites classified in the U category are all listed in Table 3 above)

The use of the condition code cannot be said to have been consistent in the past and therefore it is particularly useful in reassessing recorded sites to correct or update the site's condition record. Indeed, sites recorded as A or B category 20 years ago may have declined significantly and need redefining in the C or even D category.

No sites are classed as being of A condition. This category should not be applied to any deserted rural settlement, as such sites are by definition not intact, they are abandoned and at best derelict.

It can be seen that overall, 166 out of 201 sites (82.5%) have been recently found to be of B or C category. B category sites will usually include building remains and/or complex features in relatively good condition. Importantly, this shows that most of the sites encountered have good surface preservation and can be easily interpreted in terms of their surface extent and component elements. Their sub-surface archaeological evidence remains unrecorded, however, and the condition classification in no way reflects the archaeological value or potential of these sites. Some category D sites may invariably be proven to have greater archaeological and historical importance that category A or B sites.

4.2 Threats

Field visits are of course particularly valuable in allowing an assessment to be made of potential threats to the continued survival of individual sites.

As Tables 7-9 show, over half of the 201 sites assessed during 2003-4 were found to have no specific threat. This high figure reflects the fact that the majority of the sites visited are located within the Brecon Beacons National Park and therefore enjoy a degree of protection that was not shared by similar sites, in similar landscapes, outside the National Park. Even within the National Park however, erosion was found to be a threat to a significant number of structures, 37 (18.5%). Other threats appear to score very low, but it is important to remember that previous work has already recorded and assessed sites within the same area that are threatened by agriculture and forestry.

The large number of Unassessed sites includes those sites that could not be located in the field and those complexes classed as Deserted Rural Settlements for which the assessment was made for component structures, but not applied to the record for the Deserted Rural Settlement.

In terms of the significance of the threat, Table 8 shows that relatively few sites are exposed to a high danger of being damaged. Stream erosion at several sites was found to be the most significant threat.

Table 9 shows that the majority of sites faced a low level of threat, and most had no perceptible short or medium term threat. Active erosion was caused by stream erosion in a small number of locations. In a significant number of cases, structures located close to fast flowing, upland watercourses can be predicted as being exposed to a long-term threat of erosion, although it is virtually impossible to assess the timescale that might be involved.

4.3 Landscape Context

Tables 10 - 13 record details relevant to the landscape context of each of the 201 sites visited.

The small number of sites not assessed were sites addressed by the desk-based review for which a proper assessment of the landscape context was not possible due to lack of information.

From Table 10, we can discern that there is a preference for locating settlements on hillslopes or valley slopes. This accounts for 81 sites or 40% of the total. Sheltered positions on hillslopes and valleyslopes where flat ground is available are also favoured – thus a further 58 (29%) of sites are found on hillside, riverside or streamside terraces.

Table 11 shows the tendency for deserted settlements to be found on sloping ground, although in many cases, 90 sites (45%), the degree of slope was defined as being gentle or moderate. Clearly, there were benefits for drainage to be had by building on slightly inclined ground. Relatively few sites were found on steep slopes.

There is a clear tendency to locate sites towards the middle of slope (60%), indicated by Table 12. This puts settlements above watercourses but also below the more exposed higher slopes. Even on flat river terraces, the middle of the terrace seems to have been favoured, rather than the water's edge, although changes in river and stream courses can give a false impression and make firm conclusions impossible on the original relationship between site position and an adjacent watercourse.

Table 13 provides surprising results, confirming a trend established by the 2002-3 project. Previous work by Cambria had suggested that deserted settlement sites favoured sheltered locations, but the evidence collated during 2002-3, and now also in 2003-4, shows that almost an equivalent number of sites are found in exposed situations as those found in sheltered positions.

It may be that the rapid nature of the project field visits to these sites makes it very difficult to arrive at an accurate assessment of a site's degree of exposure, as weather conditions on the day of a visit can influence the assessment. Even subtle hollows or rises can afford a degree of shelter from the prevailing wind that will only become apparent under certain conditions.

5. Deserted Settlements in Southwest Wales: A concluding statement

Since 1996, Cambria Archaeology has produced annual Deserted Rural Settlement Project reports (see Bibliography). These reports have outlined many ideas and working hypotheses relating to deserted settlements in southwest Wales, as well as annual updates on project progress and results.

The experience gained over the years of the project's life have also informed two publications: the popular-style booklet *Caring for Lost Farmsteads* (Cadw, 2001) and a contribution to the forthcoming monograph on deserted settlements in Wales that is under preparation by Cadw.

These unpublished and published reports include summaries of Cambria's work during the 8 years of the project and it is not necessary to include a full project summary here. It is however appropriate to conclude this report with a series of maps showing the distribution of deserted rural settlement sites in southwest Wales.

The following maps, 7-11, show the location of all deserted settlement sites recorded in the regional SMR as of January 31st, 2004.


As the SMR is a dynamic and ever-changing record, the present total of 984 sites is 101 less than that defined in 2001-2, which can be broken down thus;

It is certain that the number of deserted rural settlements recorded in the SMR will not remain static in the future as other projects record new sites and reassess old records. However, it is to be hoped that the lessons learned during the 8 years of the Deserted Rural Settlements Project in the region will ensure that there will be a greater consistency in the recording methodology when dealing with such sites. It is also hoped that there will a continuing increase in the understanding of what is one of the most important monument types in the region.

5.1 Map 7: All Sites


Map 7 shows the location of all Deserted Rural Settlement, Long Hut, Longhouse and Platform sites recorded in the regional SMR. It confirms that these site types are at present overwhelmingly concentrated in upland and marginal landscapes



5.2 Map 8: Deserted Rural Settlements


Map 8 shows sites recorded as Deserted Rural Settlements across southwest Wales. It shows that the use of the term Deserted Rural Settlement across the region is predominantly applied to sites in upland and marginal contexts.

It is likely that some similar sites in the lowlands may be recorded as farmsteads, but the combination of longhouses, long huts, platforms, shelters and folds that characterise many Deserted Rural Settlement sites are themselves predominantly encountered in upland or marginal contexts.




5.3 Map 9: Long Huts

Map 9 shows that the distribution pattern of long huts, numerically the most important site type encountered by the project, is also clearly concentrated into upland areas. It may be that this reflects the tendency to use long hut as a term to describe ruined sites that would usually be described as cottages in a lowland context. Surface evidence alone suggests that this may be the case, but archaeological excavation could help differentiate between upland and lowland sites that appear, superficially at least, to share many similar characteristics. Questions still remain unanswered regarding the dating and function of these structures. It is not certain that all long huts served as dwellings, some may well have been ancillary buildings within settlement complexes.



5.4 Map 10: Longhouses


Map 10 shows a similar pattern for the distribution for long houses to that of long huts. However, it is noticeable that the occurrence of longhouses is markedly less frequent. The apparent absence of longhouses from western Carmarthenshire, western Ceredigion and Pembrokeshire is somewhat misleading as it is evident that traditional longhouses in the lowland areas of the region remain occupied or in use as farm buildings and therefore do not fall under the classification of "Deserted Rural Settlements."



5.5 Map 11: Platforms

Map 11 shows a rather more general distribution of platform sites than other deserted settlement site types, although these too are predominantly found in upland contexts. Again, this is felt to reflect the influence of previous work having been concentrated in upland areas.

Some platforms may have been the sites of timber houses, others of timber buildings that had non-settlement purposes. Other platforms in upland and marginal contexts may well have been the sites of peat stacks or hayricks, or even ancillary timber huts and pens. The archaeological excavation of a number of platforms in varying contexts and of varying dimensions is needed to throw light on such issues.



5.6 Statistical Analysis

The following tables present the statistical information regarding site condition, threats, topographic context, for the 984 Deserted Rural Settlement sites recorded in the regional SMR as of January 31st, 2004.

Table 14: Site Type v. Condition

This table shows that the vast majority of sites have a "C" condition status, that is to say that they are in a state of advanced ruination, although their main characteristics are still discernable. Relatively few sites were found to be in a "B" condition (substantially intact). Only a handful were found to have been completely destroyed (E), although a larger group were classed as condition "D", which includes sites that for which there is now little or no surface evidence. Some Deserted Rural Settlements include component structures in varying (V) stages of decay. Unassessed sites include a significant number of sites that could not be located in the field and those where access was not gained.

Three major threat types are evident in Table 15. Sites on farmed land were generally assessed as being threatened by current or possible future management regimes. Erosion was a commonly identified problem for sites that occupy sheltered, streamside positions, where water erosion has sometimes already occurred, is active or likely to happen in future. Happily, the most significant threat assessment is that of "No specific threat", which signifies that a large number of sites have no imminent or perceptible threat to their continued existence.

This table shows that a high level of threat exists in relatively few sites, most of these being sites threatened by stream erosion as referred to in Table 15. For the majority of sites, there is a very low level of threat.

This table emphasises the tendency for deserted settlement sites to be located on slopes (425 sites if the figures for hill and valley slopes are combined) and in sheltered valley floor positions (192 sites when River terrace, Streamside and Valley Base sites are combined). The number of sites found in hilltop or ridge-top positions is so low (12) that a marked preference to avoid greatly exposed positions is evident.

This table shows that deserted settlement sites tend to be positioned on sloping ground, but usually away from the steepest slopes. Drainage may have been an important factor in choosing a location, but the shelter afforded by hill and valley slopes must also have played a part in site choice. It is suspected that slopes that also afforded a good view over adjacent land, especially mountain pasture could have been favoured.

The tendency to locate deserted settlements towards the middle of slope shows a possible awareness of the need to avoid the exposure of higher slopes and the potential flooding problems that can occur on valley floors.

There is a clear preference shown in this table for sites to be located in sheltered positions. It is thought that there may be some significance to be attached to the decision to position a site in an exposed location, especially in upland areas. Where deserted settlements seem to have been purposely positioned on high ground, exposed to the prevailing winds, it is possible that they represent sites that were only seasonally occupied and therefore did not require shelter from the worst of the winter storms, or that they date to a period when the climate was somewhat more favourable, in earlier medieval times, and shelter possibly offered by now long vanished woodland. The tendency for early-post mediaeval *lluestau* type deserted settlements in the uplands to be found in sheltered valleys, may mark a trend away from exposed higher positions throughout medieval times.

APPENDIX 1: SCHEDULED DESERTED RURAL SETTLEMENTS IN SOUTH WEST WALES


In 1995-6, Cambria's Deserted Rural Settlements Pilot Project reported that fewer than a dozen deserted rural settlement sites could be identified as having Scheduled Ancient Monument status in southwest Wales. Several of these had only obtained statutory protection due to their position within the scheduled area of another monument, such as the structures close to Garn Goch hillfort, Llangadog, Carmarthenshire (SAM-CM037).

It was felt at the time that there was an under-representation of an important monument type in the scheduling lists for Wales and an objective of increasing the number of scheduled deserted settlements was set by project staff.

The following list is only a snapshot of those deserted settlement sites recorded as Scheduled Ancient Monuments in the regional SMR on January 31st, 2004. It shows that there were 32 identifiable examples of scheduled deserted rural settlements at that time. However, many of these scheduled areas cover more than one settlement-related feature. At least 59 dwellings and ancillary features can be identified from the appended list, but there are other ancillary structures included within the scheduled areas that do not appear here due to the fact that site types such as Shelter, Sunken Shelter, Sheep Fold and Enclosure are not included.

A further 12 sites were recommended for scheduling by the 2002-3 Deserted Rural Settlements Project, and 15 more by the 2003-4 project. It is therefore hoped that there will be a future increase in the number of scheduled deserted settlements as a direct result of this project.

It can be observed from the appended list that there appears to be an under-representation of earthwork platform type settlements. Those at Neint (SAM-CD180) and Hafod Ithel (SAM-CD193) are probably ancillary structures to nearby long huts and are not in the category of classic earthwork platforms, of which only Llethr Bryn y Gorlan (SAM-CD196) is a scheduled monument at present.

APPENDIX 2: DRS TERMINOLOGY

The following draft definitions of site types were included in Cambria's 1998-99 Deserted Rural Settlement Report and they are included here in order to aid understanding of the site descriptions in the following Site Gazetteer.

- **1. Deserted Rural Settlement:** Used as an overall description of a group of settlement related features i.e. a dwelling or dwellings with ancillary structures or features.
- 2. Platform: Refers to any bare platform, regardless of relationship to slope (cross-contour or parallel to contour) and also to size. There is an unresolved debate as to whether a platform on which a structure stands, such as a long hut, warrants two PRNs, one for the platform and another for the structure. In practice, the 1998-99 survey did not give two PRNs for such sites, but would record the long hut and note in the site description that it stood on a platform.
- 3. Longhouse: It seems appropriate to retain Iorwerth Peate's description of the Welsh longhouse¹ and apply the term as a generic type only when a site bears the main characteristics he describes;

"the long house is a single, long, low, oblong building which houses both the family and its cattle. The dwelling is always at one end, generally called the upper end (pen uchaf) though this depends on the situation of the house - in some cases the dwelling is at the lower end (pen isaf). The other end (generally pen isaf, occasionally pen uchaf) is the cow-house. Between the two is the door. In most cases this opens into a passage called penllawr (literally, the head of the floor) or bing, with another door at its further end. This passage dividing the house into its two parts, dwelling house and cow house, generally serves as a feeding walk. There are however many instances (a) where the feeding walk does not exist and (b) where it has been modified by the insertion, between cow-house and dwelling, of a dairy, store room or calf-box... The upper end, without exception, was always paved, the paving terminating in the passage, the cow house floor being of earth."

The differentiation between a longhouse and a long hut is not always an easy one to make, especially based on the observation of surface evidence alone. It certainly should not be made merely according to the length: width ratio of a structure or by the number of compartments present. Peate examined standing structures in the main, and therefore had a relatively easy task in identifying the component features described above. When dealing with the surface remains of very ruinous, archaeological sites this will necessarily be an imperfect science. However, the two-fold division of many DRS dwellings, with a characteristic step down from an upper room to a lower room and evidence for a dividing passage or storage compartment between the two main compartments, suggests that it is possible to identify structures which are firmly in the Welsh longhouse tradition.

4. Long Hut: A long hut is defined as a rectilinear structure (stone built or earthwork) which may have one or more compartments.

It is not necessarily the case that a long hut means the same thing as a dwelling. Complexes where two or more rectilinear structures are present may well represent a dwelling and ancillary buildings, but all would be recorded as long huts - we can rarely be sure in such instances which of a group of long huts were in fact dwelling and which were put to some other function.

5. Shelter: Refers to a minor structure, either rectilinear or sub-circular in form, which occurs either as a solitary feature or in association with other structures. They can survive as drystone ruins or earthwork sites. There is no implication of function beyond that of the simple RCAHME Thesaurus definition of a shelter as "A structure which protects an area of ground from the weather".

There is a presumption that such a structure would have been roofed. The term would of course include structures with different functions, from minor human shelters to animal/fowl pens and storage shelters. But the examination of surface evidence or even excavation is unlikely to allow for a proper interpretation of the use of individual minor structures of this kind.

6. Sunken Shelter: This is a new term applied to a type of ancillary structure encountered in many locations. The typical sunken shelter is an elongated and narrow cut into a slope, often with drystone revetment along the sides of the cut. Internally, these structures may be as little as 1m wide and as much as 8m long, or more. They tend to occur singly or in pairs and in close proximity to deserted settlements. One interpretation which may be put upon them is that they were intended as storage places for perishable foodstuffs such as milk, butter and cheese (an important consideration in any pastoral settlement and one which should be expected to be represented in the archaeological resource).

These structures are sufficiently different to other minor structures to warrant identification as a separate monument class. They are not to be confused with root vegetable storage clamps, which are usually similar elongated earthwork cuts into the ground. Clamps rarely have a drystone component and do not have entrances, as the goods stored in a clamp are buried for a period of time before being dug up for retrieval. A sunken shelter will often be open at its downslope end or have an entrance in either side, indicating that the ability to place materials within - and remove materials from - the shelter was an essential part of their function.

7. Fold: Unlike a shelter, a fold is an unroofed structure. Folds can vary in size and complexity from small single cell structures to large multi-cell arrangements associated with sorting animals returning from mountain pasture.

Folds have long been used for the penning of animals for specific reasons - most commonly in the uplands of mid-west Wales for the shearing, washing and milking of sheep. It is not always possible to distinguish a fold from an abandoned shepherd's hut; indeed there are many examples of old dwellings being rebuilt and reused as folds.
