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## **THE ARCHAEOLOGY OF LLANFYNYDD**

Llanfynydd is located on the northern side of the Tywi valley. The small village of Llanfynydd is some 10km from the A40 Carmarthen-Llandeilo road. The name is also applied to the ecclesiastical parish and modern community of Llanfynydd.

The village stands in a sheltered position at 140m OD, on a bend in the narrow valley cut by the Afon Sannan.

### **Prehistory**

Llanfynydd has some evidence of early prehistoric activity. There are two sites of possible Neolithic date (dates), namely the burial chambers at Castell y Gwynt (PRN 743) and another at Pant Howell (PRN 682). Both of these monuments may actually be a type of Bronze Age burial mound, with a large capstone covering the burial cist, however.

There are numerous examples of attested Bronze Age (dates) burial sites known as round barrows around Llanfynydd, mostly on the high ground in the northern part of the community. They suggest that there was a settled population during the area, farming the land and burying their dead on prominent hills around their settlements. As with most other parts of Wales, we have yet to discover evidence of Bronze Age settlement sites at Llanfynydd, but assume that the community would have farmed the best agricultural land on lower hill slopes and in sheltered valleys and lived close to their farmland.

Archaeologists are faced with a very different problem when studying the Iron Age in Wales. A great number of Iron Age settlement sites are known, but very few burial sites. The known settlements occur mostly in the form of defended hillforts. There are two hillforts in Llanfynydd community, at Banc y Rhyfel (PRN 652) and Penybanc (PRN 12105).

There is at present no firm evidence of Roman activity in the Llanfynydd area. A gold armlet found at Cwm Gwaun Hendy in 1876, has been described as a "Roman bracelet," but it was sold to a jeweller after its discovery and has not been seen for over 100 years. Therefore it is not possible to be certain about its true origin. It was found by a farmer under a large stone, apparently in a earthenware urn. The circumstances of its discovery suggest that it may have been a Bronze Age burial site and not a Roman find. However, the presence of a Roman road along the Tywi valley to the south and known Roman forts at Carmarthen and Llandeilo, tells us that the Llanfynydd area would have undoubtedly felt the influence of the Roman presence.

### **Dark Age and Medieval**

The early historic period in Wales is often called the "Age of the Saints" rather than the Dark Ages. This is due to the fact that the centuries following the end of Roman rule was the period in which the Christian church developed considerable power and influence in Wales and the other Celtic countries.

Llanfynydd itself bears some witness to this Celtic Christian tradition. The parish church is dedicated to the Dark Age Celtic saint Egwad, and the medieval name of the parish was Llanegwad Fynydd - Llanfynydd is a shortened form of the name. Probably the finest monument to the activity of the church in the area during the Age of the Saints is the Llech Eiudon cross (PRN 705), which is a remarkable stone, intricately carved with Celtic knot-work patterns and inscribed with the name "Eiudon." Unfortunately the head of the cross has long been lost. The stone originally stood on a mound in a field at the southern tip of the parish, presumably marking a burial site. It was removed to Gelli Aur mansion in the 19th century, by the then Lord Cawdor, and was later donated to the National Museum of Wales in Cardiff. Llech Eiudon ranks amongst the finest early Christian stones in Wales and probably dated to the 10th century, slightly earlier or contemporary to more famous crosses such as the Carew and Nevern high-crosses in Pembrokeshire.

There are a number of other sites associated with the activity of the church around Llanfynydd, including two possible holy well sites, Ffynnon Dyssul (PRN 12270) and Pistyll Sawyl, which both appear to be dedicated to Celtic saints and may have been sites of worship and healing throughout the medieval period. The site of St John's parish church (PRN 678), which is said to have originally been dedicated to St Egwad, may also be an early ecclesiastical site, used as a place of worship and burial for many centuries. There are records within the parish of a Cae Capel (PRN 4738) and Cae'r Hen Fynwent (Field of the Old Cemetery - PRN 4745) which

may be the sites of early Christian places of worship and burial.

The medieval history of Llanfynydd is also closely associated with the activities of the church, as Llanegwad Fynydd was an estate owned by the Lord Bishop of St Davids. As such, there are references to Llanfynydd in the "Black Book of St Davids", which is an early 14th century description of the Bishop's lands. The Black Book makes reference to a corn mill (PRN 12720) and fulling mill (PRN 12721) within the Llanfynydd estate, showing that the area was already valued for its agricultural produce and its woollen industry, both of which remained important to the local economy until modern times. It also gives the names of the local landowners of the time and describes their duties to the Lord Bishop.

The original parish name of Llanegwad Fynydd suggests that the area we know as Llanfynydd parish or community was in former times part of a larger Llanegwad parish, which may itself have origins as a Dark Age administrative unit. The community and parish of Llanegwad borders Llanfynydd to the south, extending down to the Tywi valley floodplain. Llanegwad was a settlement of some importance in the Middle Ages, having its own motte castle and the status of a Borough town, although it never grew to the importance of Tywi valley towns such as Llandovery and Llandeilo. It may be that Llanegwad Fynydd represented the northern, upland half of this larger unit and that it only became a separate parish in relatively recent times.

### **Post Medieval**

The character of the Llanfynydd area during recent centuries has largely been one of an agricultural community. Most of the local population was found in the scattered farmsteads of the parish. As the local population grew, particularly in the 16<sup>th</sup>-17<sup>th</sup> centuries and the early 19<sup>th</sup> century, there was pressure on the historic parish common land on the high ground of the parish. More and more land was put under the plough and new farmsteads and dwellings appeared. The landscape was infilled by this development and by the mid-19<sup>th</sup> century the settlement pattern reached its maximum development and the local population reached its peak. Most local people were farmers and agricultural labourers.

Parish records indicate that the village of Llanfynydd was a small, but busy, local centre by the early 19<sup>th</sup> century. Typical of rural villages, it had its own shops, inn, smithy and post office by the 20<sup>th</sup> century. Local woollen factories provided work for weavers and card-markers and a wide range of trades and crafts were practiced – from cobblers and tailors to blacksmiths and masons.

The cultural and religious life of the community also flourished in the 19<sup>th</sup> century. Baptist, Calvinistic Methodist and Independent chapels and Sunday Schools were established. The village school (PRN 17029) is a Voluntary Christian School, which has a long association with the parish church.

Since the 1840s, depopulation has affected Llanfynydd as much as any other rural parish in the region, leaving many examples of empty and ruined cottages and farmhouses across the community.

One of the most impressive local homes that has been lost was the mansion of Pant Glas Hall, an Italianate mansion built on the site of an earlier house about 1850. The house was derelict by the 1970s and later demolished. Only the fine entrance-tower of the house remains on the site, although some buildings associated with the estate, such as lodges and outbuildings, survive. There is now a modern holiday chalet complex at Pant Glas.



A fine, although much damaged, round barrow. On the NNW of the mound on its perimeter are 7 hawthorn trees whilst to the S and SE are a number of gorse bushes. On the E side of the mound are some craters of disturbance with reeds growing out of them, suggesting that the monument has been dug into on various occasions. The mound is severely denuded on its E and SE sides, and spread on the W. The mound is turf consolidated with some stones visible through the surface and by the parched grass. The field in which the monument is located is used for grazing sheep and some damage to the monument is evident from animals. Standing stone 4739 lies 600m away to the W at 269 degrees, and may well have originally been visible from this site, but this stone is now engulfed by Penfarch Wood.

Described by the OS in 1968 as an indefinite area of disturbed ground which probably denotes the site of a cairn first recorded by the RCAHM in 1917. The owner of the land on which this site is located refused us access to the site and claimed there was no trace of any monument in this area which we were unable to verify.

A recumbent block of quartz (PRN 7737), which has been moved from its original position, is all that remains of a group of three standing stones. It is possible that the three were part of a portal dolmen type burial monument, from which the capstone had been removed. The three stones had been moved by the early 20th century and only the moved quartz block remains close to the original site.

A definite circular cairn, 16m in diameter and standing 0.6m high, with lots of stone visible on its surface including a small white quartz block at its centre. The monument is located on a local highpoint in a field now used for the cultivation of a swede crop and for grazing sheep. The sheep seem to like being on top of the mound, which is getting trampled. The mound itself is covered with reeds whilst the field surrounding the site is very muddy and waterlogged. Cultivation of the field for swedes is evident right up to the edges of the mound and some slippage of cairn material was noted on the NNE side of the monument. Stone group 682/7737 lies c.300m away downslope at 119 degrees.

When recorded by the OS in 1968 they noted that the capstone of this burial chamber or cist rested on numerous boulders in the centre of the remains of a circular cairn 8m in diameter. The area surrounding this monument is afforested, and there is no sign today of any remains of a circular cairn/barrow. The site now consists of the large 'capstone' slab, 4m long x 1.8m wide and up to 0.5m deep, located not far from a forestry track. Some small stones were noted on the NW side of the stone, with a small white quartz block also noted on the SW side. Lots of large stones are scattered in the surrounding area. The red and white tape which once delimited the scheduled area of the monument has fallen and is trampled. The stone itself is moss covered, especially at its NW end.
