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
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



Additional information (visit 17.8.16 seen from road): 1st edition OS of 1891 shows a large angular enclosure containing 2 small buildings in dispersed layout, one larger square building close to the road, and one smaller rectangular building to the NW on the W boundary. OS 1907 shows no development to this layout. The site occupies undulating ground at the western end of Carn Goch hillfort, lying on the 150M (AOD) contour. The angular enclosure survives as stone banks/ walls enclosing the site. The square building marked on historic OS maps (which must have been the dwelling) survives only as a low mound of rubble stone covered with grass, however the smaller rectangular building survives with an extant corrugated tin roof which has protected internal features. Additional information (visit 17.8.16): 1st edition OS of 1890 shows rectangular building with smaller ancillary building to N with square enclosure between the 2 buildings, 2nd edition shows no further development. The site lies on the 240M (AOD) contour and occupies sloping ground on the S side of a small stream valley, SE of Llwynbrain Farm and amongst hilly ground to the SW of Capel Gwynfe. The site's roadside location with 2 parallel sub-rectangular enclosures carved out of the larger field on the opposite (N) side of the road support the possibility that these were 2 small cottages with associated land allocated to each of the pair. 
Additional information (visit 14.10.16): The site occupies a flat area on the S bank of the Afon Ydw, NE of where this river joins the larger Afon Bran at the S boundary of Myddfai Parish. The name 'Cwm' reflects its valley position and 'Mawr' distinguishes it from 'Cwm Bach' a short distance to the N on the opposite bank of the Ydw. The site lies between the 60M and 70M (AOD) contour. 1st edition OS (1887) shows a building orientated NW – SE with adjoining smaller building in line at NW end, and a possible additional enclosure/lean-to at SE end. OS 1906 shows the same arrangement with no development. It is unclear whether the small separate group of buildings to the W are outbuildings associated with Cwm Mawr, or represent a distinct smaller farmstead (see description for visit 8 below). Cwm Mawr survives to eaves and gable height in places, but is now very overgrown with brambles, with trees and saplings growing in and amongst the structure. The house of 1 and a half stories, and is built of angular rubble-stone with lime rich mortar evident in joints, and evidence of lime wash externally and internally. The front elevation faces SW, with 2 windows to the ground floor, arranged symmetrically either side of a front door, all with stone reveals. This facade does not survive to eaves height so there is no evidence to clarify if there were windows above lighting a first floor. The whole front (SW) facade is offset to the left from the SE gableend, to accommodate internally a large mass of (now largely collapsed) structural masonry in the SE corner. This appears to be a main chimney ('simne fawr'), and retains a void indicating the presence of a bread oven, with a possible fireplace stair above. Both gable ends of the house survive (NW to almost full original height) with some surviving chimney detail. Internally the NW gable has evidence for a small fireplace at ground level with brick modification to reduce its size further and accommodate a metal grate (20th C?). Lan Farm comprises house and associated *beudy* (it appears to be of 'longhouse' type in origin), with threshing barn (opposing doors and evidence for water powered threshing machinery) situated slightly off parallel on the opposite side of the yard.

Cadw have recently listed the building as a 'small abandoned 18th-century farmstead'. Two modern agricultural buildings on the site are still used by the tenant farmer.

A public foot-path runs through the site, but there is currently no vehicle access. Earlier access to the farmstead seems to have been via a trackway running up-hill from the south.

With kind permission of the owner and tenant farmer, five local volunteers assisted DAT archaeologist and ABC archaeologist in producing measured drawings of the front elevations of the house, *beudy* and barn, as well as a Level 2 Photographic Record and a rapid topographical survey. Lan farm has been unoccupied for as long as the tenant famer can remember (at least the latter part of the 20th century) - the exceptional level of preservation of early features, are a result partly of this, but it should be noted that had it lost its roof, the building would have deteriorated rapidly, so its survival can be directly attributed to the efforts of the tenant farmer who lives 'drws nesa'. His care for the vernacular buildings at Lan is a shining example of 'benign' preservation.

The first edition Ordnance Survey of 1887 shows Llanerch-goch as a substantial farmstead, comprising two opposing linear ranges, which are slightly off parallel. The buildings are orientated roughly E – W, across the contour of a WNW facing slope, which runs down to Afon Llechach (a tributary of Afon Sawdde). Llanerch-goch's northern range is of linear 'house and byre' type, with the house at the eastern end of the range (now largely concealed beneath a collapsed corrugated iron roof). It does not appear to be part of the 'true' longhouse tradition, as there is a straight joint between the house element and the lower byre or 'beudy' (cow-house). From what can be seen underneath the sheet roofing (not accessed because of collapse), there appear to be the remains of cruck timbers, with some pockets of surviving thatch.

It seems that this domestic end of the building continued to be roofed with thatch, despite the ancillary buildings on site apparently having been roofed with stone tiles (evidenced by the large numbers which are now incorporated into boundaries around the site). These tiles were sourced from local quarries which exploited a prominent geological anomaly that runs across the area. Their current distribution (mostly stacked up and used for boundaries) suggests they must have been very commonly used in the locality, and would have been a distinctive vernacular feature of buildings in the local area. There is also evidence for their export further afield, but buildings still roofed with stone tiles are very rare indeed. Their main disadvantage was probably their weight, which would have demanded very strong roof timbers to support them. The increased import of mechanically sawn softwood and the availability of North Wales slate (after the arrival of the railway line through the Tywi Valley), would have prompted replacement, and as with other local buildings, at Llanerch-goch the stone tiles were removed, relegated to re-use to sure up existing boundaries around the farmstead, and replaced with slate.

Dating elements of Llanerch-goch is problematic without further investigation, but a likely sequence for roofing materials would be thatch, followed by stone-tile (a greater financial and constructional investment), followed by North Wales slate when it became available. However, throughout changes to roof material of the ancillary buildings, a thatched roof was retained on the dwelling end of the building (evidence for which has luckily been preserved by the addition of the corrugated iron roof). The retention of the thatch on the roof of the house despite the import of new, undoubtedly more expensive materials on the outbuildings is interesting. It seems unlikely this was a purely financial decision, as it is more usually the house element of a farmstead that is invested in and 'up-graded' or re-modelled when finances allowed. Could this decision reflect a contemporary recognition of the better insulating qualities of thatch over stone tile and later slate? At the western gable end of the house, still upstanding to nearly full height, is a 'simne fawr' (big chimney), built up in steps. Interestingly, the chimney is stepped internally to the dwelling (so that the steps are within the house), and the flat 'exterior' of the chimney forms the east wall of the beudy (byre) end of the building. This arrangement would have heated both the house and the attached beudy very effectively, but the stone mass of the very large chimney would have provided more heat to the house end where it was needed most.

Excellent ABC potential: good survival of walls to eaves and gable height, high levels of preservation of vernacular features and high archaeological potential: upstanding structural remains with phasing, buried structural remains, associated occupation debris, and potentially very long history of site use.

Additional overview information from site visit (14.7.17): 1st edition OS of 1891 shows in outline single linear range orientated NW - SE with associated squared enclosure at NW end. OS 1906 shows the same arrangement with no further *development*? The site occupies a lower valley position, immediately NE of the gorge carved by the Afon Sawdde and on the W bank of a smaller tributary 'Ffinnant' (literally 'boundary stream'), which provides the site with its name, and forms the boundary between Llangadog and Llanddeusant Parishes. The site lies just below the 100M (AOD) contour. The site is now extremely overgrown with volunteer saplings of various ages and more mature trees (present during occupation of site), evidence of more recent 'ornamental' garden planting to the front (SW) side - macro-carpa/ leylandius conifer. Upstanding remains of this site survive to gable height, stone-built (some ORS), no brick in evidence, mortar – some lime rich, other more earth based with inclusions of lump lime. On OS 1887 it is marked as a single linear building, with no associated ancillary buildings marked. On the OS 1906 the range is shown as subdivided. This is supported by physical evidence which suggests the building may have been a house and byre homestead in a single linear range (but with straight joint between the 2 elements), and then later sub-divided to form two habitable 'semidetached' houses, with an upper storey added later to the SE end (formerly a single storey byre(?)). This is evidenced by a change in stonework at 1st storey level at the SE end. However, the remains of what appear to be a cart platform, revetted and roughly metalled (to prevent carts becoming bogged down whilst loading hay into a hay loft) at this end suggests the addition of the second storey pre-dates the use of the SE end as a dwelling. Beyond the cart platform at the SE end is a small (detached) timber framed building roofed and walled in corrugated tin with low door - pig-sty/ poultry coop (?) The walls of the main building are in an extremely precipitous state with lintels collapsed, door and window heads collapsing, ivy growth within walls, some subsidence and structural cracks between the front elevation and NW gable end. This prevented close examination of the interior of the building. Dense sapling growth made photography and overall assessment of layout and relationships between features difficult. Additional overview information from site visit (14.7.17): 1st edition OS of 1891 shows 2 almost parallel linear ranges orientated NW - SE, with a slightly 'wedge' shaped yard between the two. To the rear (S) of the southern range a further building is shown attached and projecting at right angles to the range. To the N of the northern range is a detached square building within a square enclosure. OS 1906 shows the same arrangement with development of a further small square ancillary building to the N.

SN 6888 2283

The site is now surrounded by commercial conifer plantation on the SW and SE sides - historic OS maps show that some of this plantation was in existence at the end of the 19th Century. The site occupies an elevated position, above Carn Goch with views to the N over the Garn. The site lies just below the 290M (AOD) contour, below a ridge rising to 353M (AOD) to the south. The site is clear of scrub, and appears to be grazed regularly, some mature trees dot the area. The buildings are now largely reduced to heaps of stone rubble, but these appear to be roughly in the location of the buildings marked on historic maps. Occasional upstanding remains survive, with some external wall faces evident. The SE building of the S linear range has enough structural evidence to indicate that it had a chimney at each gable end, suggesting this part was used for human habitation, with attached byre/ barn forming the NE portion of this range. The opposing (NE) range may therefore have been ancillary. The whole is stone-built, with no brick in evidence. Little mortar was evident amongst the rubble, but slight evidence of lime washing on surviving wall faces. Building collapse and rubble spread made assessment of layout and features difficult. The whole farmstead occupies a slightly elevated 'platform', some of which is edged on the downslope (NW) side with stone revetting – long occupation history on this site? Structural remains in (well-built) stone survive with mature tree growth above, immediately to the SW of the main farmstead – these do not appear on historic OS map sources despite apparent association with Gareg-lwyd farmstead. Date of surviving fabric unclear, but site and some buildings within it potentially quite early (pre 19th C). **No ABC potential – poor survival of structural elements or intact walls. Remote.** Good archaeological potential in the form of some upstanding structural remains, buried structural remains, with associated occupation debris.

Historic Landscape Mapping: Can you help?

Part of ABC's **Grass Roots Heritage** Project is the Historic Landscape Mapping Programme, whose aim is to identify and record all derelict and abandoned traditional buildings within Myddfai Community, and the wider Western (Carmarthenshire) part of Brecon Beacons National Park.

Why is this information important? These buildings are often the best and sometimes only record we have of the everyday lives and endeavours of the ordinary people and communities of rural Wales. At present, only a small number have any sort of record at all. By recording these buildings now, we can ensure that if they don't survive, information contained in their fabric, and held by the communities to which they belong which would otherwise be lost, will be preserved for the future.

To find these abandoned buildings, a comparison is made between historic 1st and 2nd edition Ordnance Survey (OS) maps (dated c. 1886-9 and 1906-7 for this area), and current OS mapping.

For each new site identified a record is created, and its location plotted on a base map. This process has resulted in over 200 previously un-recorded sites being mapped.

The next stage is to visit some of the buildings identified, with the land-owner's permission, to find out more about them, and create detailed records. **Do you own one of these buildings? Would you be happy for the building to be visited for us to make a photographic record? Do you know anything about the building? Eg. who lived there? Why it was abandoned?**

ABC is working in partnership with Dyfed Archaeological Trust (DAT) who are mapping traditional buildings which are still occupied and in use in this area. Information gathered will become part of the local Historic Environment Record (HER) held by Dyfed Archaeological Trust (DAT). This will ensure it is available in perpetuity to the community and public for information and further study.

Adfer Ban a Chwm (ABC) is grant aided by the Heritage Lottery Fund, The Brecon Beacons Trust, The Quaker Housing Trust, and Community Foundation in Wales.

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









Appendix 6 Description Llanerch-goch

Atodiad 6 Digrifiad Llanerch-goch

<u>Site description –Llanerch-goch</u> SN 7816 2499 (detail of most significant points) Helen Whitear, ABC, executive director

Landscape context and place-name evidence

Llanerch-goch lies on the 300M AOD contour, within a large and irregular V-shaped enclosure, formed by what appears to be the convergence of two route-ways from the W, which narrow to a single route to the E of the site. These converging routes form a particularly large (by comparison to the surrounding fields) v-shaped enclosure immediately to the west of the site. To the east of the site the narrower single route rises eastwards towards the unenclosed common land of Mynydd y Llan, just before which it meets with another route-way (at right angles to the one from Llanerchgoch) which runs along the contour, almost on the junction between enclosed and unenclosed land (it may have historically formed the boundary between the two). Both routes have substantial embankments on either side, and in most places are considerably 'sunken' below the surrounding fields, suggesting long/ heavy use coupled with water erosion. Llanerch-goch appears to belong to an important but currently under documented 'category' of farmsteads (identified quite frequently during ABC's Historic Landscape Mapping Programme) which occupy an 'interface' position between enclosed and unenclosed land. These sites are often associated with a v-shaped enclosure or boundary formation which may represent a 'stock funnel' for managing the movement of animals between upland and lowland pasture.

Several farmsteads in the vicinity (Gelli-ddu, Llanerch-goch and Crincae), have 'spouts' marked close by on both historic and modern mapping ('spout' usually denotes a spring modified to make water collection easier). The one at Llanerch-goch lies just within the northern boundary of the enclosure, and may be one of the factors determining its siting.

The name 'Llanerch' means 'a clear space, a glade', but with the connotation of a place where one might pause with stock (WJ Watson: 'The Celtic Place-names of Scotland'). 'Goch' (coch) means 'red' and may simply describe the colour of the soil and stone of the location revealed when animals had trampled through, or be a reference to the colour of bracken in a certain light (although currently there is little evidence of bracken on the site).

These landscape factors may support an early date for the origin of the site.

Buildings

The first edition Ordnance Survey of 1887 shows Llanerch-goch as a substantial farmstead, comprising two opposing linear ranges, which are slightly off parallel. The buildings are orientated roughly E – W, across the contour of a WNW facing slope, which runs down to Afon Llechach (a tributary of Afon Sawdde). Llanerch-goch's northern range is of linear 'house and byre' type, with the house at the eastern end of the range (now largely concealed beneath a collapsed corrugated iron roof). It does not appear to be part of the 'true' longhouse tradition, as there is a straight joint between the house element and the lower byre or 'beudy' (cow-house). From what can be seen underneath the sheet roofing (not accessed because of collapse), there appear to be the remains of cruck timbers, with some pockets of surviving thatch.

It seems that this domestic end of the building continued to be roofed with thatch, despite the ancillary buildings on site apparently having been roofed with stone tiles (evidenced by the large numbers which are now incorporated into boundaries around the site). These tiles were sourced

from local quarries which exploited a prominent geological anomaly that runs across the area. Their current distribution (mostly stacked up and used for boundaries) suggests they must have been very commonly used in the locality, and would have been a distinctive vernacular feature of buildings in the local area. There is also evidence for their export further afield, but buildings still roofed with stone tiles are very rare indeed. Their main disadvantage was probably their weight, which would have demanded very strong roof timbers to support them. The increased import of mechanically sawn softwood and the availability of North Wales slate (after the arrival of the railway line through the Tywi Valley), would have prompted replacement, and as with other local buildings, at Llanerch-goch the stone tiles were removed, relegated to re-use to sure up existing boundaries around the farmstead, and replaced with slate.

Dating elements of Llanerch-goch is problematic without further investigation, but a likely sequence for roofing materials would be thatch, followed by stone-tile (a greater financial and constructional investment), followed by North Wales slate when it became available. However, throughout changes to roof material of the ancillary buildings, a thatched roof was retained on the dwelling end of the building (evidence for which has luckily been preserved by the addition of the corrugated iron roof). The retention of the thatch on the roof of the house despite the import of new, undoubtedly more expensive materials on the outbuildings is interesting. It seems unlikely this was a purely financial decision, as it is more usually the house element of a farmstead that is invested in and 'up-graded' or re-modelled when finances allowed. Could this decision reflect a contemporary recognition of the better insulating qualities of thatch over stone tile and later slate?

At the western gable end of the house, still upstanding to nearly full height, is a 'simne fawr' (literally 'big chimney'), built up in steps. Interestingly, the chimney is stepped internally to the dwelling (so that the steps are within the house), and the flat 'exterior' of the chimney forms the east wall of the beudy (byre) end of the building. This arrangement would have heated both the house and the attached beudy very effectively, but the stone mass of the very large chimney would have provided more heat to the house end where it was needed most.

One very important reason that Llanerch-goch provides such an important opportunity for recording and preservation is that it allows for discussion and recognition of many of the innate environmental qualities of traditional methods of building.

At the west end of the northern range, immediately below an opening in the gable at first storey level, are the remains of a revetted and roughly metalled area. This appears to be a 'cart platform' and other examples have been noted on abandoned farmsteads visited by ABC within the study area. These platforms would have allowed for regular unloading of carts to the hayloft above the beudy, ensuring the stability of carts, preventing them from becoming bogged down in mud and ensuring a consistent height for loading from. This type of feature, so crucial to the day-to-day functioning of a farm, has usually been lost in farmsteads that have continued to be occupied, with the later use of tar-mac and concrete for areas of heavy traffic.

The southern range comprises a threshing barn with two opposing doors, not only demonstrating the former prominence of arable (even at this altitude), but also amazingly, it retains the mechanisms of a horse-engine (horse 'gin), which would have driven threshing machinery. The former presence of a horse 'gin is denoted on historic OS maps by a dot surrounded by a dashed

circle, but the survival of the physical remains of this type of machinery is extremely rare. At Llanerch-goch it is marked on the southern side of the south range on OS 1887. By the time of the 2nd edition (1906), the horse 'gin is no longer marked, but slightly to the west of its location a small additional building is marked, which is probably housing for a generator which replaced the horse 'gin . Aside from this development the OS 1906 map shows the same general arrangement of the farmstead.

The buildings of Llanerch-goch are shown in outline only on current OS mapping, but are still named, suggesting its continued prominence in the local landscape and local consciousness despite it having been abandoned.

Llanerch-goch has good survival of walls to eaves and gable height, high levels of preservation of vernacular features and high archaeological potential: upstanding structural remains with phasing, buried structural remains, associated occupation debris, and potentially very long history of site use.

The farmstead is possibly unique in the survival of some of its vernacular features. It undoubtedly has many more secrets to give up if carefully investigated, and there is a pressing need for a full and detailed survey. However, Llanerch-goch faces numerous and fairly immediate threats, not only from vegetation growing on and around the site (problematic for the fabric), but also in the rapidity of decline of internal features following the collapse of the corrugated iron roof. Many walls are in a precipitous state with lintels collapsed, door and window heads collapsing. Action is needed to enable people to fully understand a building whose survival is of both local and wider cultural significance.
