

The Dam (or Cook) Mill is shown on Speed's map and stood near Dark Gate. Alwyn Evans^{1st} that the mill stood

"outside the town walls close to the Dark Gate on the site occupied by the corner house, formerly called the Nag's Head Inn, now forming part of the Half Moon Hotel. The lane to the west ward is still called Dame-street [now Mill St - T.J.] which name was given it from the mill-dam which once supplied the water"

It is shown to have been valued in 1275 at 13s 4d² and was taken down (along with the Dark Gate) in 1796 to make way for the building of Blue St.³
