

The Dam (or Cork) Mill is shown on Speed's map and stood near Darkgate. Alwyn Evans<sup>(1)</sup> said that the mill stood "outside the town walls close to the Darkgate on the site occupied by the corner house, formerly called the Nag's Head Inn, now forming part of the Half Moon Hotel. The lane to the westward is still called Dame-street [now Mill St-TT] which name was given it from the mill-dam which once supplied the water." It is shown to have been valued in 1275 at 13s 4d<sup>(2)</sup> and was taken down along with the Darkgate in 1796 to make way for the building of Blue St.<sup>(3)</sup>
