

4 No. 5 Caerau, Moylgrove Camp 1052

- The remains of a somewhat large circular camp. It had a diameter of 150 paces, and had 3 lines of vallum. Their banks, however, have been levelled excepting to the westward, but may all be traced on the surface of the field. The curve of the road shows that the eastern outside bank stood where the roadside fence now is. The ditches are all filled in. The spaces between the banks average 25 paces. The entrance was apparently on the western side where the interval between the outside banks measures 32 paces. Here too is a sort of enclosure between the banks, which may have protected the entrance or may peradventure be the remains of a recent quarry. There are stones in the banks of the enclosure. We did not find any flint chips, but the camp is well turfed.
