St. Clydai's Church 1065

Though this church has been restored, several interesting bits have been spared. The tower is old, and the old entrance was through it by a western door and then by a flight of steps into the church. The font too is a very interesting specimen, with the sort of candlestick ornament we noticed on one of the stones at St. Dogmael's. On the east side of the door is a highly decorated stoup adorned with 2 heads, one of them wearing a mitre. Lying in the church is a slate slab on which is the following inscription: "This church and chancel were new roofed and repaired in the year 1827, the former at the expense of the parish, and the latter at the joint expense of Mrs. Colby and the Rev. James Griffiths, Vicar. Daniel Bowen, Dugoed; Benjamin A. Bowen, Nantrefel, Churchwardens.
