Another pair of splendid stones. One standing embedded in a road-side bank measures 6 ft 11 ins high with a circumference at the centre of 10 ft 3 ins. The base is partially buried in the bank and so cannot be measured. The second stone is 8 ft high with a circumference at the base of 15 ft. There is a tradition that these stones mark the graves of two great chieftains slain in battle here.

PAS.

A standing stone, 3m tall, in a hedge. The RCAHM, 1925, describe two stones being present, one 8ft high & the other 11ft high, as do Laws & Owen, 1908, with one stone at 6'11" & the other at 8'. Only one now remains.
