A tapering stone 8 ft 3 ins high, with a girth at the bottom of 14 ft. It will be noted that the O.S. is marked "standing stones". There is but one left. When the writer visited this neighbourhood 30th August 1875, about 7 paces to the south west of the existing stone was another 5 ft 6 ins high. This has now been destroyed.

PAS, 1908
Laws & Owen.

Originally a pair of stones, one "7 paces" to the south-west of the other. The two stones were extant in 1875, Laws & Owen, 1908, but only the north-east one remained by the time of the RCAHM survey, RCAHM 1925. The remaining stone stands 2.2m high in a field used for hay.
