Tumulus 27 No. 2 Llanfyrnach This is a fine specimen of a moated mound, with a crater-like depression, the banks of which protected a shelter of some sort. The mound is 95 paces in circumference on the top and 24 ft high. This fortalice seems to have been only part of the fortifications of Llanfyrnach. Outside the churchyard on the north and east, a scarped bank will be noticed: this probably joined the tump to the west of the church, and even now extends some distance beyond the · yard to the south east. The farm is Llandrew, and Mr. Morris the owner and occupier attributes that name to the entrenchments, not to the church.
