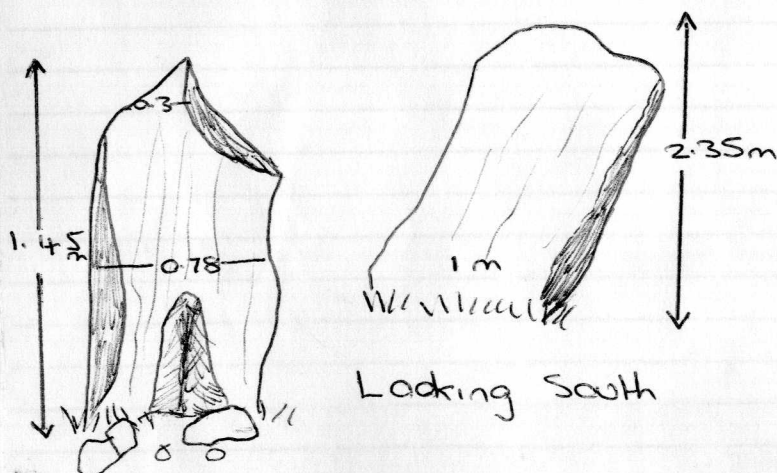
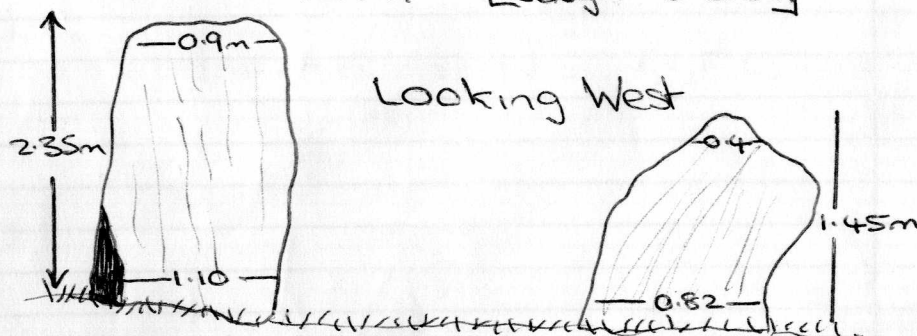


Two standing stones, one 2.35m high, the other 1.45m high. Standing in a Field called Parc-y-maen on Pantyrodyn Farm. These two stones seem to be all that remains of a cromlech. Both of them are in good condition apart from small lichen growth. The tallest of the stones is leaning at an angle of about 35° degrees, but seems to be in no danger of falling. Another stone stands in a hedge in the extreme NW of the field, which might be from the same cromlech.
