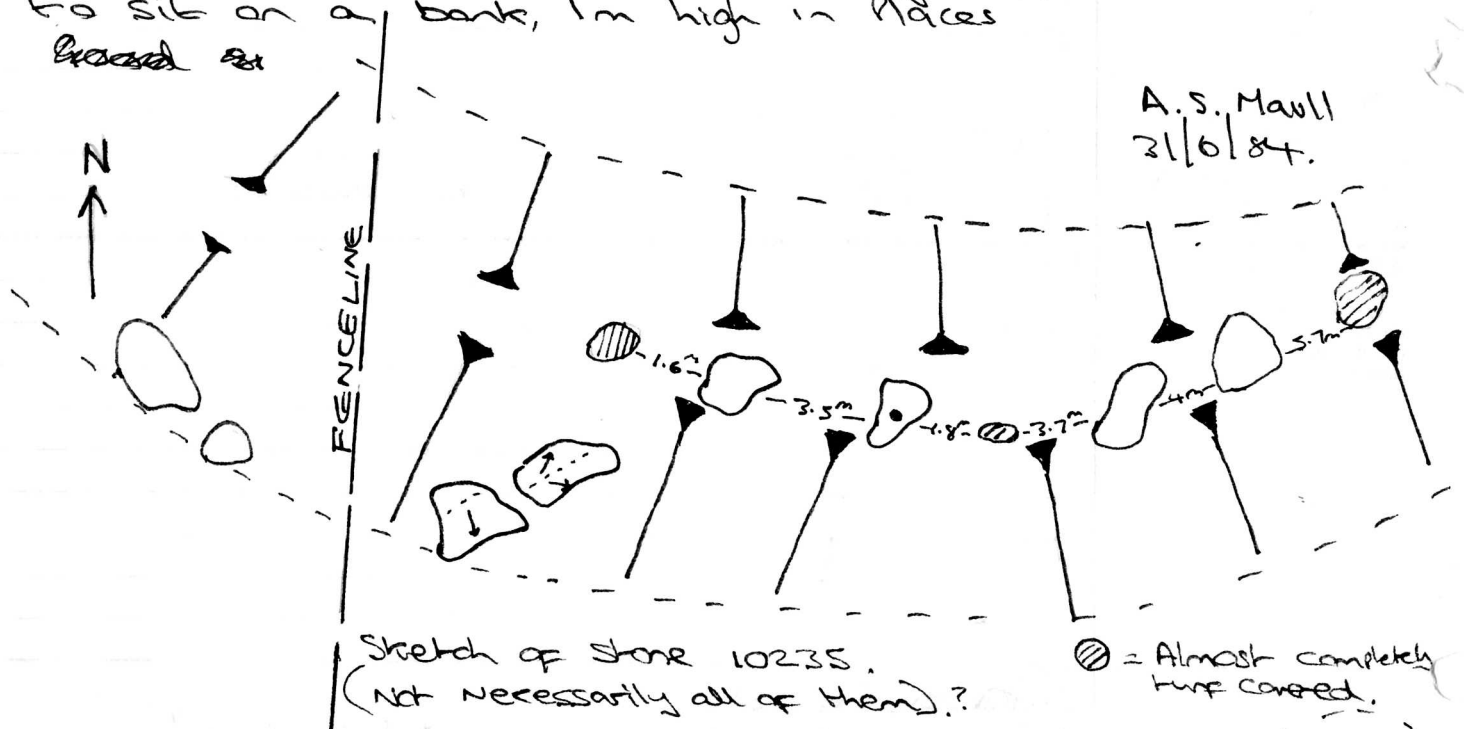


Local knowledge of stone circle?

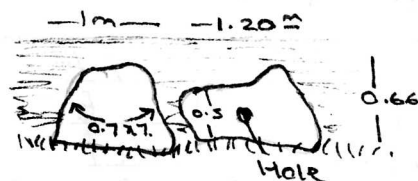

The rectory, Remains of a stone circle? lies c.30 metres South of Manor Gwyn, in a Pasture Field, next to a small stream called Ait Wenallt, at the bottom of a steep ~~steep~~ valley. 91 metres above OD. The site consists of nine or more prostrate stones, with seven? of these forming a perfect arc, two of the stones have had small holes bored into them suggesting that they might have been used as gateposts in the past. Sizes of the stones are difficult to gauge as most of them are covered by turf. Stones seem to sit on a bank, 1m high in places

Apart from the 1m high bank the feature is as described. However, our interpretation differs slightly in that it seemed to be no more than a garden feature
