

## COMMENT

The stone was ploughed up by his owner Miss sprung ('92). A local historian Mr. Robert Thomas, Croesgoch, told the land-owner that his field "Le Hoke" was where medieval processions were held. It would be an attractive idea that a prisoner scratched the design on the only piece of stone available to him - hence the very rough stone but quite precise design.

The same field has on its northern border, a boiling mound (or mounds) similar to those at Carneddau and in walking the area I've found several waste flint flakes - all nearly patinated. [Anne has I believe, seen the boiling mounds.]

Inscribed stone: "Nine Man's Morris": inscribed on a very rough stone approx 12" x 8"
