To the north of Pentre'r Hydd Farmyard in a pasture field, some low, linear earthworks were observed - possibly formed by farming carried out from the medieval settlement. These are situated in the SW corner of the field and consist of two ^{low} banks, possibly field boundaries, both following a N-S line and 3, possibly 4, lines of ridge and furrow at right angles to these banks. The ridges had an average width of 1.4m and were 0.2m high. They were approx 3m long. The features were all very low, although the field has only been ploughed once within the past 19 years.
