The ruined church of St. Teilo was rebuilt in 1863. It consists of a nave and chancel, and contains no object of archaeological interest. There are two bells.* In the porch are two inscribed small stones built into the walls, the one on the east being in Hebrew, and the one on the west in Greek. On the south side of the church is a rough upstanding stone on which was formerly a small sun-dial. The dial has disappeared, but the remains of the nails which attached it are still visible in the stone. On the same side of the church are two yew trees, under which tradition says people who died from the plague were buried.
