

MAEN HIR, One standing stone is all that remains of a possible burial chamber standing in the middle of a field on Maen-Hir Farm.

The stone is 1.7m high, and c.

0.76 in width, and is packed around the base by several smaller stones.

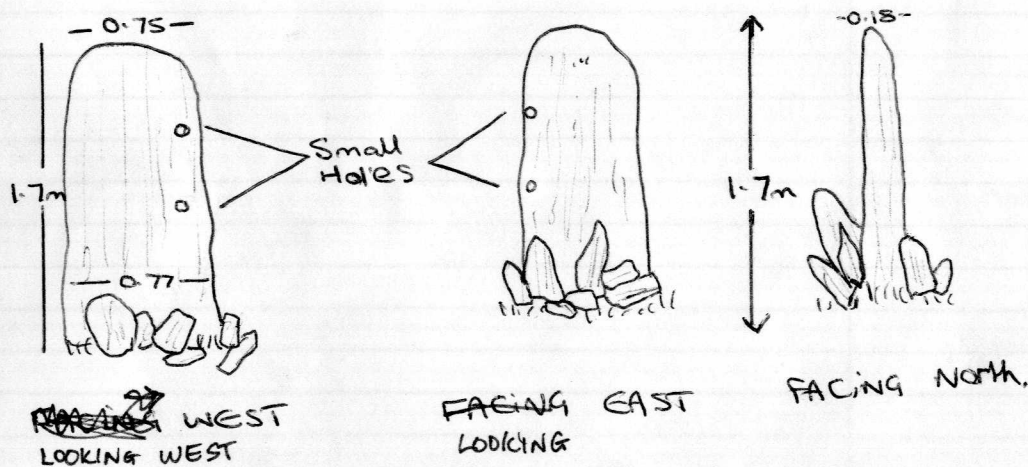
Slight lichen growth on the surface of the stone, otherwise in good condition. Two small holes have been drilled into the stone, of uncertain date.

Several large stones are to be found in the vicinity, utilised as gateposts, these could also be from the possible burial chamber. Cattle erosion hollow at base
