Crugiau, Cemmaes

Tumuli and Pottery 1143-4,

Fenton (page 534) declares that this cluster of tumuli, with the exception of that at Orielton, was then the largest in the county. Owing to the demolition of many tumps at Orielton, Crugiau Cemmaes is now facile princeps. Its position is most commanding (see Owen, Pembrokeshire I, 108). Six may be easily traced, others are not so clear. A Bronze Age urn was taken from one of these and is now in the Ashmolean Museum.
