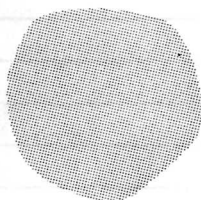


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4. Blaen Brefi 1 (fig. 5; surveyed 1981) SN 75 NW
Situating on level ground on a sheltered top of a knoll near the head of the Brefi Valley at 415 m OD. The ground falls away gently to the E but rises to the W before falling away steeply into the valley. The site consists of an arc of stone comprising a semi-circle of at least 10 upright and leaning slabs barely projecting through the turf. Had the arrangement been circular its diameter would have been c. 12 m. Although no cairn material is associated with individual uprights, a spread of stone lies 10 m to the W. The site is most likely a severely robbed structured cairn though the possibility that it is the remnants of a free-standing stone circle cannot be ruled out.



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
