

Another smaller house in Wogan ownership was Good Hook (19) two miles to the east of Haverfordwest and of especial interest as a round chimney house, only one of two known to survive in the centre of the county. This particular round chimney is cylindrical and whilst the house (recently saved from dereliction and extensively restored) had several puzzling aspects, it did appear to be basically a ground floor hall house with a lateral chimney and possibly a wooden screen passage between two doors. One of the pointed arch doorways survive. The house had been extensively remodelled on two earlier occasions, late in the 17th Century and again in the 19th when it had been transformed into a fairly ordinary Pembrokeshire farmhouse, distinquished only by its round chimney and a crude two storey porch. This importantly located chimney survival was only discovered in 1984, and lent substance to the long-held (but hitherto unproven) belief that round chimneys were a feature found throughout the county in earlier times and

that their rarity in the central heartlands of Pembrokeshire is accounted for by the fact that many must have been lost in these prosperous areas when houses underwent modernisation in previous centuries.
