

Site discovered whilst checking "planting" application,
April 1986. Mound lies 70m ENE (~~62~~ 62° mag)
of Carew Samson. OS card for the latter (PRN 5153)
derived from Sansbury's 1934 thesis, mentions the
"remains of a large cairn, 30 yds to the north-west of
the stone". This may be a wrong ~~too~~ description
of this site, as there is no indication of any
earthwork at all, 30m NW of the stone.

The mound is situated ~~on a crest~~ just above a break of slope, and is approxi-
mately circular, with an ovoid extension down-slope.

This may, however, only be soil-creep.

The site is unlikely to be a natural feature
as there are several large stones protruding
from the top, though without any apparent pattern.
The remainder is turf &
reed-covered - the absence of other such mounds
also suggests an artificial origin.

The whole mound, with the reeds has a
close resemblance to a giant sleeping hedgehog!
