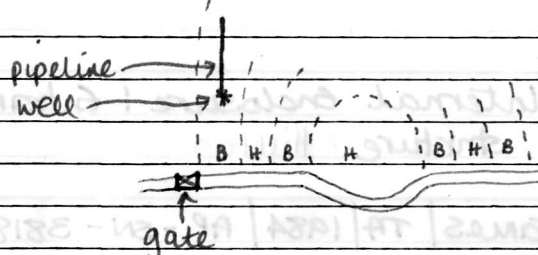


The very slight earthworks of a circular enclosure 50m in diameter, truncated on the south by a lane, has been noted. The cropmark of its ditch is visible on aerial photographs. A magnetometer survey was unsuccessful in detecting ditches or any other features.

The site lies at 100m above OD and occupies a hilltop position with good views out to north, south and east. The field is under pasture for grazing and has not been ploughed since 1950's. (The grass 'burns off' very quickly due to the thinness of the soil and they have decided not to try ploughing.) There is a rock-cut well in the field and the soil at that point is no more than 20cm in depth. This well and the pipeline running from it in a northerly direction may account for some of the features in the aerial photographs. The kink in the hedgeline is very pronounced and the inner enclosure referred to by TAT + KM corresponds to a circular hollow in the field. Slight traces of earthworks can be seen but not enough to survey.
