

"Holed axe-hammer of greenstone, with convex sides, flat faces, rounded butt with almost central hour-glam perforation, askew to minor axis of the implement. Two broad, shallow grooves, to receive hafting thongs, are visible on one side.

Axe-hammer with central perforation from Teifside, Cards. L. 190, W. 88, T. 80. Made of gnt.

Cutting edge and butt considerably damaged.

Sides slightly rounded + worn smooth. Perforation narrows to centre

Large hammer - stone from Teifside, Cards.

L. 8" (203) W. 3 1/2" (88) T. 3 1/4" (82) Made of ordinary gnt.

Shaped to a point, slightly rounded sides, worn smooth, some damage to cutting edge and butt.

Perforation narrows to middle.

Traces of scoring due to method of securing handle.
