

"Holed stone axe-hammer with convex sides, thin, flattened butt, polished blade, and hour-glass perforation slightly nearer the butt than the blade. L. 81 W. 45 T. 22. From Teifside"

Axe-hammer with central perforation from Teifside Cards. L. 80, W. 42, T. 17. Made of grit, in Aberystwyth College Museum. Chip out of butt end, definite chiselling of cutting edge, surface smooth, hour-glass perforation

No. 2, p. 314 BBCS
1927

Holed stone from Teifside, Cards. L. 3 1/4" (82 mm) W. + T. not given, in museum of UCU Aberystwyth. Made of grit.

Shaped to a sharp point with a rounded base, perforation narrower at the centre, sides worn smooth, rest seems to be naturally shaped except the base which is worn flat (axe to right of centre in illustration?)
