

## COMMENT

## AUTHORITY

"The third stone, which is of sandstone, is a small circular stone, 1'1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " in diameter. The hole in its centre is 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " in diameter. One face has markings from hole to circumference dividing the stone into eight equal parts. The obverse has nine similar, but irregularly placed, markings. Along the centre of the edge of the stone, which is 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " deep is a shallow groove running the whole of the length of its periphery."
