BSAH I

There is a great deal of confusion regarding this building.

The Welsh Office, in BSAHI, state that 33 High Street was Vicar Pritchard's house and describe it as an altered mid 16 building, grade II listed.

BSAH I

Soulsby & Jones's 'Historic Towns' call the building Nenadd Newydd and place it also on the S. side of High Street, adjoining the old Drill Hall. They state that the whole structure was pulled down c.1910.

Comments in Arch Camb 1893 also suggest impending demolition.

The note at the foot of p. 96 Carm. Inventory further confuses the matters.
