Henry's Moat

Church 1295-1296

The Church of St. Brynach has a chancel, nave and transept. On the south side of the transept there is a large stone, which may have been a maenhir, and opposite to it is the base of a churchyard cross. The chalice is dated 1574 and inscribed: "POCULUM DE ECCLESIA HARRYSMOT". These various spellings of the name seem to show that Henry was a personal name.
