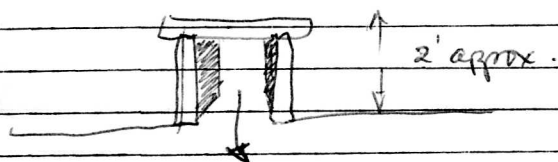


LEAT

The Black Book of St. David's records a mill in the Manor of Wolfscastle - this leat appears to be the original. It passes through small arches in each hedge on its path (3 in all).



It is over 600 yds long and the ditch is filled in for over $\frac{3}{4}$ of its length. The leat divides the stream or a ford at SM955 272 - this is possibly the "Strayford" of the BB. It supplied water this century to the fountain on the village green, being piped underground through the yard of Wolfscastle Farm.

COMMENT POND

Estate map of 1806 records site of the pond now built over. A mound on its S. edge may represent the former bank.

Could this be a fish-pond? BB mentions a fishery.

OWNERSHIP AND TENANCY DETAILS LEAT

At least part of its length passes through fields owned by Mr. Brian Matthews, Wolfscastle.

POND

Part of site is on Village Green, part on land of Mr. Brian Morgan, Ivy House, Wolfscastle.
