

DITCHES; DEFENSIVE.

?IRON AGE/UNKNOWN.

A gas-pipe line cut two very large ditches August 1986.
Only the upper levels of the silted-up ditches were
observed. The ditches appeared to be running parallel, north
to south, some 10m apart. The ditches were similar,
some 3.5-4m wide and at least 1.5m deep. (projected the
sides angle of slope of the sides would indicate ditches c 3-4m deep).
Evidence of re-cuts was visible in the fills of the ditches.
To the east of the eastern most ditch a buried soil
indicates the former presence of a bank.
These ditches may be associated with the hillfort
Caer Lletty - 112yd 100m to the S.E.
