This most interesting circle is in fair preservation but much overgrown. There are eleven large stones standing; some are of considerable breadth and three over 6 feet in height from the ground. The diameter of the circle is 65 feet; the mound in the middle was formed by some fallen stones. There are no stones in position on the west, but they can be traced.

A single remnant stone (F) lies outside the circle.

A stone circle of 12 stones enclosing a low mound 1m high a 20m diameter
