The foundations of the little church of St. Teilo are enclosed in a graveyard, and consist of a nave and chancel. The former was about 40 feet by 16 feet, the latter about 18 feet by 15 feet; they are connected by a ruined chancel arch. There is no tradition as to when it became ruinous. Burials have taken place in the churchyard comparatively lately. Mr. Melchior, the present owner of the farm, buried his grandfather there. The church was anciently called LLENDEILO LLWYDARTH. See Owen's Pembrokeshire, I, 97, 289, 310. For a description of the church see Arch. Camb. V, vi, 176. In the yard is one inscribed stone; another forms a stile. Mr. Melchior promised us to remove this into the churchyard and re-erect the one that now lies prone; which has since been done. For the inscriptions see Arch. Camb. V, vi, 177; and iii, 291 and xv, 276.
