The Church of St. Nicholas was restored in 1755, and again in 1886. It is in the form of a double parallelogram with a north aisle and a good Pembrokeshire tower. The chancel, which was once highly embellished, has many monuments to the family of Moat. A fine altar tomb, now much neglected, to William Scourfield, was put up by his wife Jane, daughter of George Owen, the historian. Between the arches in the name there is a niche for an image. The shaft of the churchyard cross remains.
