AUTHORITY

The church is at the bottom of the yard, which slopes down rapidly and has a deep declivity on the south and east. The church has a plain double belfrey on the north end; only one bell is in position; the other is in the church. It has an inscription, "James Phillips, LL.D. 1652". In a recess built out on the west side, there is an old octagonal font with four carved supports at the base. Above the churchyard are the remains of a Tumulus and there are traces of earthworks round the village.
