

COMMENT	AUTHORITY
<p>Ordnance Survey aerial photographs (O.S. 73 384, frames 196-197) show the grass-mark of an enclosure on level ground atop a small hill c. 1.7 km SW of the Roman fort at Llandovery (SN 7696 3517). The mark is complete and delineates a square with rounded corners, some 45-50 m across. A single entrance is apparent on the east. There are also faint crop-marks on the photographs suggesting a road down-slope towards the River Tywi, intersecting the existing river bank at SN 7586 3419. The grass-marks are interpreted as either those of a fortlet guarding the river crossing, or possibly a practice camp.</p>	
<p>The site was visited in late November when slightly raised banks, less than 0.25 m in height were noted in the position indicated by the aerial photographs. No trace of the supposed road could be seen.</p>
