

Bletherston is in Welsh, TREF ELEN, and the church was formerly dedicated to St. Helena. It is a double church with slightly pointed arches between. At the west end of the north aisle there is a bell-tower supported by three corbels and containing one bell; under it a door, now built up, with a round arch. The churchyard is triangular with a deep foss cut in the rock all round it; on the north and partly on the west there is an outside mound of equal height; on the other sides the ground shelves.
