The church was restored in 1906, when the chancel and west wall were rebuilt. There is a tradition of a tower to the old church, which fell down many years ago. The font is very ancient, with a modern base. There is a hagioscope, and steps and doorway to the rood loft. The steps and doorway from the chancel to the pulpit have been built up. The old vicarage of clom and thatch was in the present vicarage garden. The chalice (of 1574) has an inscription_POCULUM ECCLISSYE DE LLAN-YE-KEVEN.
