The Barlows moved here from Cresswell at the close of the 17th century. It was rebuilt by their descendant on the spindle side, George Lort Phillips.

Lawrenny Hall was pulled down after the death of the last resident, Hugh Barlow, Esq., MP, who d. in 1809.

The present handsome castellated building was erected on the ruins of the old house in 1852, by George Lort Phillips, Esq., MP., who's to the estates collaterally on the death of Sir William Owen, Bart.

Replacing the early 18th "tall cube" of the long established Barlows, (~~1798~~) This truly Victorian fortress was completed in 1856 for G. Lort - Phillips, M.P.

The architect was Henry Ashton. Demolished 1950.
