Confusion exists as to when the existing  
Abbey replaced the original structure.  
Dugdale's Monasticon Gallo-Britannicum states "the present  
structure was built . . . by the Abbot, in  
the reign of Edward I, . . . in 1294 . . . but  
the structure raised by Rhys ap Gruffydd  
(in 1164) stood two miles from this . . .  
(and is) called new monachorum." This  
is substantiated by Meyrick (1810) and  
Lewis (1833).

The O.S. Card states that the original  
site was founded in 1164 by Robert  
Fitz Stephen. In 1184 the house was  
refounded on the present site. The W.O.  
booklet (see D.R.F. 2043) agrees with this  
and suggests the present structure  
was completed in 1235. It also adds  
that severe damage was sustained  
by the church in 1295 and consequently  
repaired.

After the Dissolution the site was taken  
over by John Stedman Esq., and later  
became the property of the Powell  
family.
