

P.Crew's (Authority ①) NGR was found to be incorrect - the site lies just  $\frac{1}{2} \text{ c. } 13 \text{ m N}$  of the N boundary of the enclosed land, with the E/W trackway veering round it to the N.

Authority ① describes it as a kerb cairn, disturbed at its S edge. I found a) no trace of any mound, b) that the gap on the S was probably original (it is partly occupied by a natural rock outcrop).

I therefore suggest an alternative classification as a U (3 boats) shaped setting of stones protruding only 10-20cm above the modern surface, and incorporating a natural outcrop. The long axis of the U appears roughly orientated towards the cairn/ ring cairn of Cam Brw (PRN 1461) on the ridge top to the NE.
