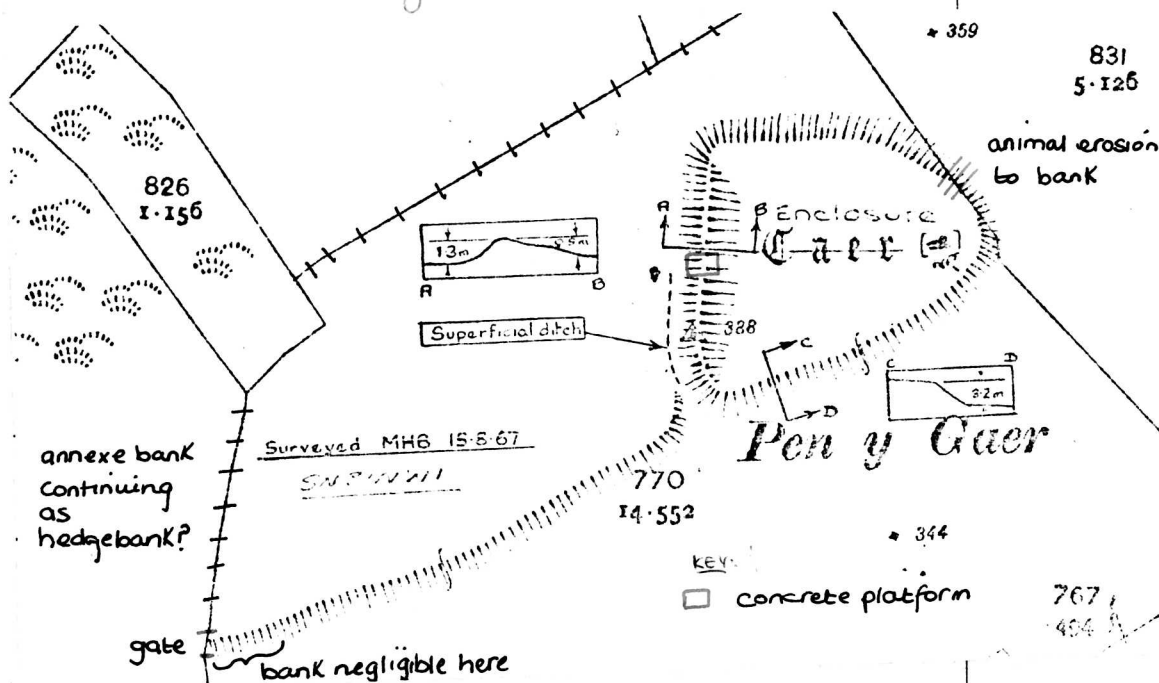


Pen-y-gaer is an iron age hilltop enclosure with steep natural slopes to the north, south and east. It is univallate with a bank up to 3.3m high and the remains of a ditch still visible at the south end of the western side. A concrete platform stands about midway along the west bank.

There is some animal erosion to the east bank.

The south bank continues to the west to form an annexe the height getting smaller further away from the enclosure. The bank seems to continue north and northeast as the hedgebank.
