

The cottage came to our attention when a planning application was made to renovate the building. A visit was then made on 1.7.85.

The cottage had already been partly renovated, around the 1960's, and two small extensions had been added.

The cottage was rectangular in shape, of rough stone construction with a grey slate roof. Red & grey tiles had been laid on the floor & 60's type windows & fireplace.

The renovation this year was to repair beams, plastering, roof etc and to some slight alteration of interior shape.

To the rear of the cottage is a derelict rectangular building constructed from dressed grey stone with 1 large entrance, 2 windows and a door. The building had the appearance of a house converted to a barn.

Mr Land has been told by a local retired schoolmistress that the dressed-stone building was formerly used as a chapel.
