

The barrow is perhaps more damaged than seems to be implied by Boshes' notes. It is a low swelling, reasonably defined to the West & South but ill defined to the North & East. The line of the hedge bank which has recently been removed appears to cross the even of the barrow on the North. Although it is described as only being 2 ft high in 1913 (RCAHM 1917), a former tenant of the land, the owner of Ebyrondygalog Farm SW 299 284, remembers the field having been ploughed relatively recently, & the present owner removed "4 or 5 inches" off the top of it with a bulldozer during the removal of the adjacent hedge.
