

St Lucia's Church has a west porch and entrance, nave and chancel, with a Vestry north of the chancel. There is a double bell cote. The church walls are battered.

A squint cuts obliquely through the right hand wall between nave and chancel. There is a piscina, & a tomb stone dated 1783 in the south chancel wall. a priest's door leads from the chancel to the vestry.

The font is a plain square basin with a modern shaft & cement base.

A carved wooden head was discovered in the vestry.

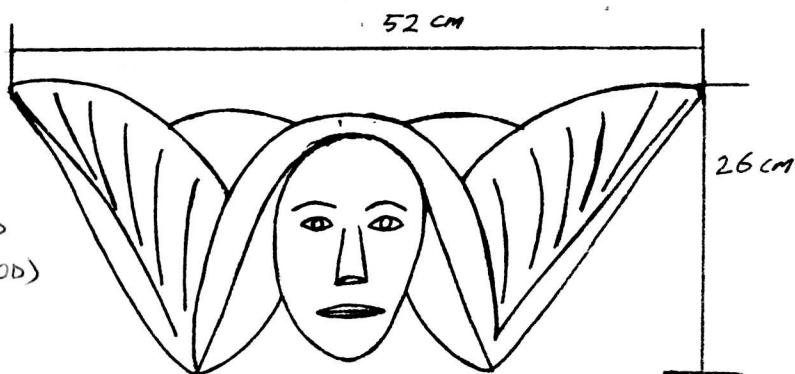
Given to St John the Evangelist by the Bishop of St Davids c. 1776
