There seems to be some confusion between PRN's 3403 and 2269. The original 1" map ① marks only one tumulus on this hilltop at roughly the position marked on our map for PRN 2269 ②. The ~~comparison arises~~ RCAHM ③ refers to only one mound identifiable at that time as only a scatter of stones. The two sets of record maps of the CASFC held in CM are confusing. The bound set refers to the site of the crug as being where PRN 3403 is marked on our record map ② and makes no mention of any other site. The loose set held in the lab. marks the crug in the position of our PRN 2269 ② and marks the site of PRN 3403 ③ as a ? . It seems therefore that PRN 2269 is actually the site of a now destroyed cairn and that PRN 3403 as an extant earthwork has been mistaken for PRN 2269.
