

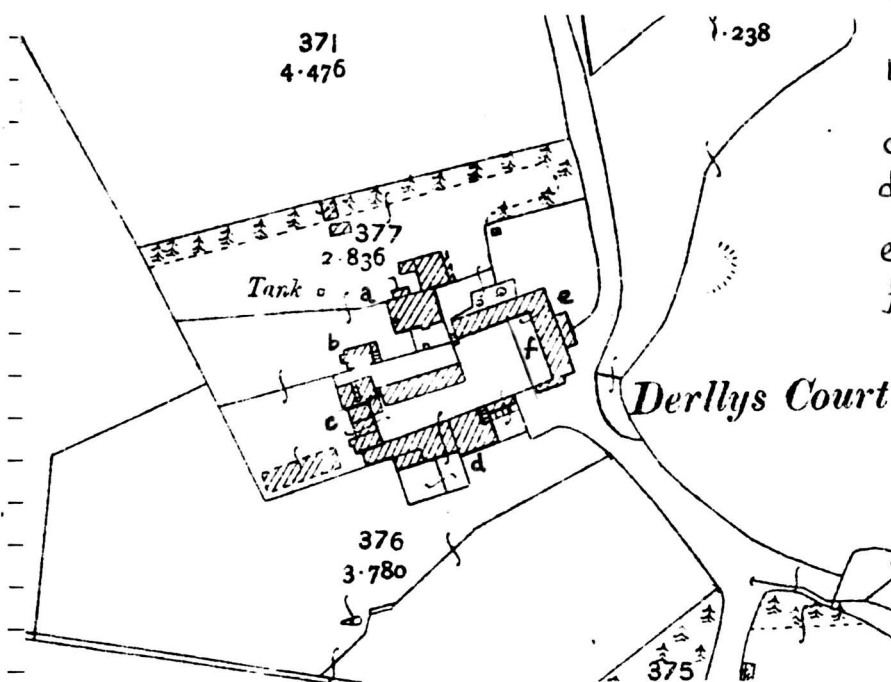
COMMENT

Curt Derllys farmstead consists of a large 3 storey, stone built house plus various outbuildings. These include a barn, dairy, cowsheds, stables plus other recent farm buildings. The barn is dated 1660 (PRN 22261).

AUTHORITY

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a: House, with extensions to the back.

b: outbuilding converted into dwelling.

c: barn

d: stable, coach house complex

e: dairy, 2 cowsheds

f: cobbled yard.

The barn (c) is stone built with a datestone above the doorway "JV 1660", JV being a member of the Vaughan family of Golden Grove. It is the oldest building in the complex. A two storey building with a polished wooden floor (originally). It is now partially destroyed by fire so that only the shell remains. Later buildings have been added on to either end. The west side has two long narrow slits either side of the large central doorway, the east side has one to the south of the doorway, + 3 square windows in the second storey.
