Cerrig Llwydion burial chamber

Situated in the corner and in
the hedge of a Flat Pasture Field
on Nant clawdd uchaf Farm.

Consisting of a stone constructed
central enlarged chamber, with
two upright stones which are still
in situ. The chamber is surrounded
by the remnants of the Cairn mound
c. 0.2 m - 0.4 m high.

Several stones show up on the
surface of the mound.

The chamber is 23 metres long and
approx 15.5 metres wide.

The cairn covering has been
extensively mutilated with some
of the depressions being 0.5-0.6 m
deep.
